100m national record

**BENGALURU:** Gurindervir Singh stormed into the record books, smashing the men's 100m national record with a blistering 10.20-second run in a top-class field at the Indian Grand Prix 1, here, on Friday. The 24-year-old Punjab sprinter, representing Reliance, eclipsed the previous national mark of 10.23 seconds set by Manikanta Hoblidhar in October 2023. Singh's previous personal best stood at 10.27 seconds -- clocked in 2021. "I'm extremely happy to have posted a good time in the IGP ahead of the Federation Cup in April," Singh said after the race. He said his main goal this season is to do his best at the Asian Athletics Championships to be held in Gumi, South Korea, in May.

#### Diokovic beats Korda, advances to semis in push for 7th Miami Open title

MIAMI GARDENS (Florida): Novak Djokovic gunning for his seventh Miami Open title, dispatched American Sebastian Korda 6-3, 7-6 (7-4) in one hour, 24 minutes in a quarterfinal match that was postponed because the women's quarterfinal between Jessica Pegula and Emma Raducanu ran past 11 pm. Djokovic advanced to Friday's semi-finals and will face Bulgaria's Grigor Dimitrov. In the first women's semi-final, No. 1 seed Aryna Sabalenka routed sixth-seeded Jasmine Paolini 6-2, 6-2 in 71 minutes to advance to her first Miami Open final. Sabalenka will face the winner of semi-final between Jessica Pegula and Alexandra Eala of the Philippines. In the day's first men's quarter-final, unseeded teenager Jakub Mensik beat 17th-seeded Arthur Fils 7-6 (7-5), 6-1.

#### Manisha wins first Asian Championship gold, bronze for Antim

AMMAN (Jordan): Manisha Bhanwala clinched India's first gold medal at the Asian Championships with a close 8-7 win over Korea's Ok J Kim while Antim Panghal settled for a bronze, here, on Friday. Manisha (62kg) began with an easy win over Kazakhstan's Tynys Dubek and pinned Korea's Hanbit Lee for another dominating win. In the semi-final, as she conceded only one point to eventually win 5-1 against Kalmira Bilimbek Kyzy. In the title clash, Manisha looked down and out, trailing 2-7 but logged six points in a row to grab her first gold medal. She had three podium finishes at the tournament before but they were all bronze medal efforts. In the bronze play-off, Panghal was dominant against Taipei's Meng H Hsieh, winning by technical superiority without conceding a point. The men's freestyle competition will begin on Saturday.
