Goa Board announces fresh framework, drops grace marks; SCERT to set questions for Classes VI to VIII

PANJIM: With the senior school academic year set to roll out on April 7, Goa Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education Chairman Bhagirath Shetye clarified on Saturday that Class IX students won't be detained even if they fail the exams once the results are declared on April 29.

Under the National Education Policy-2020 (NEP), these students will be Allowed To Keep Terms (ATKT) and will get the chance to clear the exams within two years.

Among the other major changes that Shetye announced was the decision to give the task of setting question papers for Classes VI to VIII to the State Council of Educational Research and Training (SCERT). However, the job of checking the answer scripts will still rest with the schools.

Director of Education Shailesh R Sinai Zingde addressed the concerns surrounding the recently announced start of schools in April. The department revealed that it had received 4,047 objections and suggestions regarding the draft notification about schools starting the academic year in April.

Zingde said many of these objections were similar, with individual concerns being raised by numerous stakeholders.

One of the main concerns raised was the temperature in April. The State-appointed steering committee highlighted that academic years for CBSE and ICSE schools in the State traditionally begin in April, with remedial classes also taking place during this time.

Zingde emphasised that classes would be held from 8 am to 11.30 am to take into account the hot weather in April.

Cabinet rejig after discussing with high command: CM

PANJIM: Stating that a cabinet reshuffle will take place in consultation with party's high command. Chief Minister Pramod Sawant claimed that his cabinet ministers are performing well but emphasised that if at all, anyone is dropped, it should be seen as political compulsion.

"We may have to accommodate one or two persons. It is a political strategy and a political compulsion from the point of view of winning the elections," Sawant said in an interview to a local TV channel.

He said that any decision regarding cabinet reshuffle would be made in consultation with the party high command, emphasising that if anyone is dropped, it should not be seen as a reflection of their performance, but rather a political necessity.

Furthermore, Sawant announced the formation of a steering committee, headed by him, to oversee decisions regarding the approval or rejection of mega projects in the State.

Favouring the formulation of a new Regional Plan for Goa from planning perspective, the chief minister said he would discuss it with his cabinet before taking a final decision.

Myanmar's earthquake death toll crosses 1,600

More bodies recovered, over 3k injured; 139 missing

AP, BANGKOK: Myanmar's ruling military said Saturday on State television that the confirmed death toll from a devastating 7.7 magnitude earthquake rose to 1,644, as more bodies were pulled from the rubble of the scores of buildings that collapsed when it struck near the country's second-largest city.

The new total is a sharp rise compared to the 1,002 total announced just hours earlier, underlining the difficulty of confirming casualties over a widespread region and the likelihood that the numbers will continue to grow from Friday's quake.

The number of injured increased to 3,408, while the missing figure rose to 139.

The earthquake struck midday Friday with an epicentre not far from Mandalay, followed by several aftershocks, including one measuring 6.4. It sent buildings in many areas toppling to the ground, buckled roads, caused bridges to collapse and burst a dam.
