### MISSING 17-YEAR-OLD GIRL RESCUED BY POLICE IN CURCHOREM

MARGAO: A 17-year-old girl reported missing from Curchorem was traced and rescued by Maina Curtorim police. The victim's mother filed a complaint on March 28, stating that her daughter was kidnapped by an unknown person from Vodlemol-Kakoda, Curchorem, on the previous day. A search operation was launched using technical surveillance and local intelligence. The girl was located on March 28 and reunited with her family.

### MAN FOUND HANGING NEAR QUEPEM HOTEL IN SUSPECTED SUICIDE

MARGAO: A man was found dead by suicide near a hotel in Quepem, with police confirming he hanged himself from a tree. The deceased, identified as Sudhakar Gaonkar of Balli-Quepem, was discovered near a hotel at Bendurdem. His brother informed police that Gaonkar was a chronic alcoholic. Quepem police conducted an inquest and sent the body to South Goa District Hospital (SGDH), Margao, for a post-mortem. A police surgeon confirmed the cause of death as asphyxia due to hanging.

### PEDESTRIAN KILLED AFTER BEING KNOCKED DOWN BY SCOOTER IN FATORDA

MARGAO: A pedestrian was fatally injured after being hit by a scooter in Fatorda. The victim, Ulhas Wadker of Borda succumbed to his injuries at South Goa District Hospital (SGDH), Margao. The accident occurred on March 29, at around 12.05 am near Jackson Restaurant, Borda. A complaint stated that the accused, Bryan Franco Borges of Borda, was riding an electric scooter rashly while travelling from Bholshe Circle towards Holy Spirit Church, Fatorda. He allegedly struck Wadker, who was crossing the road. A post-mortem confirmed the cause of death as 'craniocerebral damage due to blunt force impact'.

### MAN'S BODY FOUND NEAR PETROL PUMP AT VERNA

MARGAO: The body of Dharma Singh, a native of Madhya Pradesh residing in Birla, was found near an Indian petrol pump at Zuarinagar. Verna police were alerted by an ambulance service and dispatched a team to the scene. Enquiries revealed that Singh was earlier seen lying in a gutter opposite his room. His roommates lifted him out and alerted emergency services. He was taken to PHC Cansaulim, where the doctor declared him dead. An inquest and scene panchanama were conducted, and the body was sent for post-mortem at SGDH Margao. A police surgeon confirmed the cause of death as asphyxia due to drowning.

### MAN FALLS FROM MANGO TREE IN BORDA, DIES FROM INJURIES

MARGAO: An unidentified man, aged around 40-45, died after falling from a mango tree in Borda. Fatorda police were informed by SGDH Margao's casualty unit that the man was brought in dead. Enquiries revealed that he was seen climbing a mango tree before falling and sustaining severe injuries. He was taken to SGDH Margao, where he was declared dead. His body has been sent for post-mortem.

### THREE ARRESTED FOR ILLEGAL LATERITE MINING AT CANACONA

MARGAO: A raid by the Directorate of Mines and Geology in Canacona uncovered an illegal laterite stone mining operation, leading to the arrest of three individuals. Jeetendra Viluskar, a geologist at the Directorate of Mines and Geology in Panjim, lodged a police complaint regarding the incident, which occurred on March 27, at Paryemol-Cola. The accused—Kumar Chalwadi of Canacona (originally from Bagalkot, Karnataka), and Santosh Surin and Narayan Parvemol, both from Canacona and originally from Jharkhand—were caught illegally extracting laterite stone using a power tiller without the required licence. The operation caused an estimated loss of Rs 10 lakh to the State.

### TWO ARRESTED, MINOR DETAINED FOR MOTORCYCLE THEFT AT CURTORIM

MARGAO: Maina-Curtorim Police have arrested two individuals and detained a minor in connection with the theft of a motorcycle worth Rs 50,000. The arrests followed a complaint by Lesly Lourenca Carvalho of Rumbordem, Curtorim, stating that his motorcycle was stolen from an open parking area near his residence on March 24, at around 1.30 am. Using technical surveillance and intelligence inputs, police tracked down the accused—Sujal Naik of Kirbhat, Nuvem, Salcete, and Kunal Naik of Ambaji, Margao. Both are currently in custody, while the minor has been sent to Apna Ghar, Merces. During interrogation, they confessed to the crime. Meanwhile, Colva police are investigating another motorcycle theft reported by Ogdalino Fernandes of Mando, Benaulim. His bike, worth Rs 15,000, was stolen from outside his house.

### **GOVERNMENT ENHANCES** FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR ARTISANS

PANJIM: The Department of Handicrafts, Textile and Coir has revised its support scheme for artisans. increasing financial assistance for purchasing tools to Rs 5,000. Under the new scheme, artisans will receive free raw materials for up to 180 days, with a possible extension of 90 days. Additionally, full stall rentals of up to Rs 15,000 will be covered for state exhibitions and Rs 20,000 for events outside Goa. Daily allowances for travel and participation will range from Rs 600 to Rs 1,000, while financial aid of up to Rs 3 lakh per artisan will be available for international exhibitions. During the handholding support period, artisans will receive a stipend of Rs 250 per day, whereas power loom artisans can earn up to Rs 500 per day, depending on production. The government has also introduced an assessment system to determine incentives for artisans, ensuring a structured approach to financial assistance.

### Quepem loan fraud: Police seize seals, fake paperwork used by govt staffer

MARGAO: Quepem police have seized seals and other forged documents used by Viresh Gaonkar, a Multi-Tasking Staff (MTS) at the Deputy Collector's Office in Quepem, who was arrested for fraudulently obtaining loans using fabricated salary certificates. Gaonkar was produced before the Judicial Magistrate First Class (JMFC) Quepem on Thursday and remanded to five days in police custody, police said. The fraud came to light when the Branch Manager of Deendayal Multipurpose Co-operative Society Limited, Quepem, approached Deputy Collector Manohar Karekar regarding unpaid EMIs on a loan acquired under false pretenses.

## Rashtriya OBC Mahasangh expresses disappointment over budget neglect



Members of OBC Mahasangh disappointed over the injustice meted to them

**PONDA**: The Rashtriya OBC Mahasangh, Goa State, representing 19 communities, has expressed deep disappointment over the government's failure to address any of their 24 demands in the recently passed Rs

27,999 crore budget. Following a meeting to discuss the budget, Madu Naik, President of the Rashtriya OBC Mahasangh, Goa State, voiced concern, stating, "Despite a pre-budget meeting with the government in February, no allocation has been made for the OBC community."

He lamented that the OBC population, comprising over 60% of the state's population, has been entirely ignored. "Even basic financial aid, such as Rs 20,000 for the final rites of poor OBC families, has not been considered, while

such schemes exist for the ST and SC communities," he added. Naik pointed out that

the ST community receives Rs 3 lakh for coaching, a scheme welcomed by the Mahasangh. However, they have also demanded a similar Rs 3 lakh provision for OBC students pursuing postgraduate and higher education, which has been ignored. Additionally, EDC loan facilities available to STs were requested for OBCs but were overlooked, along with their demand for an

He highlighted that a meeting regarding these demands was held in February 2025, facilitated by Mayem MLA Premendra Shet, with Chief Minister Pramod Sawant, Assembly Speaker Ramesh Tayadkar, WRD Minister Subash Shirodkar, and MLA Viresh

OBC Welfare Ministry.

Borkar in attendance. "We informed the CM about the miserable conditions of the 19 OBC communities, and we were asked to submit our demands, which we did. Yet, none were addressed," he stated.

Criticising OBC leaders, Naik alleged that the government lacks sympathy for the OBC community because its leaders are compromised, working for personal gain rather than the welfare of their people. He further urged Bhandari Samaj leaders, representing the state's largest OBC community, to lead an agitation so that all OBC communities can benefit.

Naik reaffirmed that the OBC Welfare Ministry, an OBC census, and all 24 demands have been completely neglected, calling for urgent action to address the concerns of the OBC population.
