

FC Goa set for semi-final clash against Bengaluru FC today

AGENCIES, BENGALURU: FC Goa will take on Bengaluru FC in the first leg of the Indian Super League (ISL) 2024-25 Cup semi-finals at the Sree Kanteerava Stadium, on Wednesday at 7.30 pm. With a place in the grand finale at stake, an intense battle awaits, before the action shifts to Nehru stadium, Fatorda on April 6 for the return leg.

For FC Goa, this is more than just another knockout fixture. The Men in Orange are one of the most dominant sides in ISL history, holding records for most points won, most goals scored and most semi-final appearances. This will be their eighth semi-final in

ond with a club-record 48 points from 24 matches. With 14 wins, six draws, and just four defeats, they remained in contention for the League Winners' Shield until the final matchweeks. Though the Shield eluded them, their focus is now firmly on the ISL Cup.

However, standing in their way is a resurgent Bengaluru FC, who stormed into the semi-finals with a commanding 5-0 win over Mumbai City FC in the play-offs. With five different goal scorers and a clean sheet in that match, Gerard Zaragoza's side came into this clash full of confidence.

There are past demons to overcome as well. The last time these two teams met in a knockout match, the 2018-19 ISL final, it was Bengaluru FC who triumphed, with Rahul Bheke's extra-time header sealing heartbreak for Goa. Six years later, FC Goa have the perfect chance to rewrite history.

With the second leg at Fatorda looming, the Gaurs will be determined to seize the advantage in Bengaluru. A thrilling battle of grit, skill, and determination awaits.

FC Goa back in contention with Jamshedpur FC win

AGENCIES, MUMBAI: FC Goa thrashed Group A table-toppers Jamshedpur FC 4-0 in their Reliance Foundation Development League (RFDL) 2024-25 National Group Stage clash at the Reliance Corporate Park in Mumbai on Tuesday. Earlier in the day, Diamond Harbour FC and NorthEast United FC played out the first goalless draw of the RFDL National Group Stage.

NorthEast United FC came agonisingly close to securing all three points against Diamond Harbour, with Huidrom Thoi Singh hitting the woodwork on two occasions. The Reliance Foundation Young Champs (RFYC) graduate was a livewire in the Highlanders' attack throughout the game. His closest chance came in the 64th minute when he rattled the crossbar with a flying header following an aerial delivery from the right flank by Aditya Kalloli. However, the scoreline remained unchanged until the final whistle, with both sides settling for a point each.

Lalthangliana cut in from the left flank and, spotting an opportunity, lashed a shot towards the near post. The Jamshedpur FC goalkeeper failed to gather it cleanly, and the ball found its way into the back of the net.

To make matters worse for the Red Miners, FC Goa tripled their lead in the 42nd minute. Skipper Prachit Gaonkar orchestrated the attack from the middle of the park and set up Likson Rebelo, who made no mistake in beating the goalkeeper one-on-one to complete his brace. Already in complete control, FC Goa added the finishing touch in the second half to seal an emphatic 4-0 win. Wellington Fernandes dribbled past three Jamshedpur FC players before striking with precision from outside the box, beating the goalkeeper and rounding off a dominant performance in a must-win game.

FC Goa Reserves Team Head Coach Israil Gurung was full of praise for his players following the victory. He said, "It was a must-win game for us, and the entire team, including the players and the staff, gave their everything to achieve this result. Whatever we had planned before the game, the players executed to perfection. The boys' tactical understanding is great, and I think they have a bright future."
