

CONGRESS, AIMIM LEADERS MOVE SC AGAINST WAQF BILL

The Bill was passed in the Rajya Sabha with 128 members voting in favour and 95 opposing it, early Friday

PTI, NEW DELHI: Congress MP Mohammad Jawed and AIMIM president Asaduddin Owaisi on Friday challenged the validity of the Waqf (Amendment) Bill, 2025 in the Supreme Court, saying it violated constitutional provisions.

Parliament early Friday approved the Waqf (Amendment) Bill, 2025, after the Rajya Sabha gave its nod to the contentious legislation following an over 13-hour debate. The Bill was passed in the Rajya Sabha with 128 members voting in favour and 95 opposing it. It was passed in the Lok Sabha early Thursday, with 288 members supporting it and 232 against it.

Jawed's plea alleged the bill imposed 'arbitrary restrictions' on Waqf proper-

ties and their management, undermining the religious autonomy of the Muslim community. The petition, filed

through advocate Anas-Tanwir, said the proposed law discriminated against the Muslim community by "imposing restrictions that

are not present in the governance of other religious endowments".

LEGAL CHALLENGES

■ The petitioners argue the bill violates Articles 14 (equality), 15 (non-discrimination), 25 (religious freedom), 26 (management of religious affairs) and 300A (property rights) of the Indian Constitution

■ The bill allegedly imposes restrictions on Waqf properties (eg, based on duration of religious practice) not applied to Hindu, Jain or Sikh endowments, undermining Muslim religious autonomy

■ Appointing non-Muslims to the Central Waqf Council and State Waqf Boards is seen as interference in Muslim religious governance, unlike other religious institutions managed exclusively by their communities

Goan diaspora will have its moment in the House of Commons

Many Goans will converge at the Westminster Palace in London to celebrate 'Recognition of the UK Goan Diaspora' on April 8

PANJIM: Come April 8, the Goan Diaspora in the UK will be officially recognised at the House of Commons in the UK, an occasion that will shine a light on the contributions of the community in the country over the past decades.

Will Stone MP and Heidi Alexander MP will host the 'Recognition of the UK Goan Diaspora' co-hosted by Councillors Imtiyaz and Adorable Shaikh. The exclusive event will be attended by 60 members of the Goan Diaspora at the Westminster Hall, London.

The event marks a significant milestone for the Goan-Indian community in the UK. Imtiyaz Shaikh, originally from Vasco, made history by becoming the first Goan of Indian origin to be appointed as Deputy Mayor of Swindon for 2023-24 and will later serve as Mayor in 2024. His wife, Adorable Amaral Shaikh, also made history as the first Goan-Indian origin Borough Councillor and Cabinet Member for Education in Swindon.

In an exclusive chat with O Herald, Adorable Shaikh explained the long journey behind the event. "The aspiration to host an event like this didn't form overnight. It has been a journey that started in 2018. The primary goal has been to work alongside our Swindon Labour

Stop 'dukaandari', start innovating: Goyal to start-ups

AGENCY, NEW DELHI: Indian start-ups came under sharp scrutiny as Union Minister Piyush Goyal questioned whether the country was settling for low-paying gig jobs while China raced ahead in deep-tech innovation.

"Should we aspire to be, or are we going to be happy being delivery boys and girls?" Goyal asked at Start-up Mahakumbh 2025 in New Delhi, comparing India's start-up ecosystem with China's.

Goyal highlighted the stark contrast between the two countries, arguing that India's start-up space was too focused on food delivery and gig work.

"What are India start-ups of today — we are focused on food delivery apps, turning unemployed youth into cheap labour so the rich can get their meals without moving out of their house," he said.

"Against that, what do Chinese start-ups do — work on developing electric mobility, battery technology, and with that they are today dominating the electric mobility ecosystem."

Mancurad madness: ₹5,000 for a dozen mangoes!

PANJIM: The only thing hotter than the April sun in Goa this year is the price of the prized Mancurad mango, the best of which is selling at an eye-watering Rs 4,000-5,000 for a dozen at Panjim market, far outstripping the Rs 1,000-1,500 price tag of the Hapus, or Alphonso, which carries the tag of 'King of Mangoes'.

However, the smaller specimens of the Mancurad are priced at around Rs 2,000 for a dozen. A customer at the Mapusa market shared, "Last year, I bought good-quality Mancurads at Rs 1,500 at the start of the season, and

“I mostly buy Hapus now. It's tasty and more affordable. I'll probably buy Mancurad in May or June when there will be more available at lower prices

now I'm paying Rs 2,000", reflecting an increase of 30-35% compared to last year.

However, mango vendors are confident that prices will drop in May and June. Ahmed Raza, a vendor in Panjim, explained, "At the start of the season, the rates are high, but by mid-May, they should drop."

Nonetheless, Mancurad prices have reached record highs, with the cheapest variety priced at Rs 2,000 per dozen.

One factor driving the steep prices is the mango shortage. Vendors anticipate that the supply will increase in May, June and July.

Four space tourists return to Earth after private flight over poles

AP, CAPE CANAVERAL:

Four space tourists who orbited the north and south poles returned to Earth on Friday, splashing down in the Pacific to end their privately funded polar tour.

Bitcoin investor Chun Wang chartered a SpaceX flight for himself and three others in a Dragon capsule that was outfitted with a domed window that provided 360-degree views of the polar caps and everything in between. Wang declined to say how much he paid for the 3 1/2-day trip.

The quartet, who rocketed from NASA's Kennedy Space Center on Monday night, returned off



the Southern California coast. It was the first human spaceflight to circle the globe above the poles and the first Pacific splashdown for a space crew in 50 years.

Govt bodies under HC scrutiny over pollution in Salpem lake

MARGAO: The worsening state of the Salpem lake in Navelim has become symbolic of deep-rooted governance failures, as multiple government bodies face mounting pressure to explain their inaction.

The High Court's scrutiny of the ongoing Public Interest Litigation (PIL) filed by environmentalist Prof Antonio Alvares has exposed lapses across agencies tasked with managing Margao's infrastructure.

During the last hearing on March 24, the HC expressed dismay at the widespread non-compliance with previous directives, calling out the systematic discharge of waste into the lake as a collective failure of Margao's regulatory system and had called for accountability from all stakeholders.

Caught in the spotlight are the Sewerage Infrastructure Development Corporation (SIDCGL), the South Goa Planning and Development Authority (SGPDA) and the Margao Municipal Council (MMC) — each now promising corrective measures under judicial pressure.

The SGPDA had promised temporary soak pits within ten days, while the SIDCGL committed to installing a complete sewerage network for the SGPDA market area within four months.
