Rajya Sabha confirms imposition of President's rule in Manipur

PTI, NEW DELHI: The Rajya Sabha early Friday adopted a Statutory Resolution confirming the imposition of President's Rule in strife-torn Manipur with members across party lines supporting the decision.

Even though opposition members slammed the Centre for its failure to restore law and order in the state and control violence, the government said it was making all efforts to bring normalcy in the state, asserting that its policy was not to impose President's Rule in states.

Speaking at the end of the discussion on the resolution, Union Home Minister Amit Shah said a meeting between the two communities from Manipur is likely to take place in the national capital soon.

Shah informed the House

that two meetings between the communities had already taken place in Manipur while the House was in session.

"...We are investing our efforts to bring peace back in Manipur. Thirteen meetings have happened. We brought up the subject late as meet-

ings were going on. The next meeting is in the offing and the issue will see its resolution soon," the minister said.

"The path to communication is open... We don't use this for political mileage," Shah added.

OPPN URGES PM MODI TO VISIT MANIPUR, RESTORE ORDER AMID ONGOING UNREST

PTI, NEW DELHI: Opposition parties on Friday attacked the government over its failure in controlling violence in BJP-ruled Manipur and demanded Prime Minister Narendra Modi visit the strife-torn state at the earliest and help restore the law and order situation there. They also demanded a thorough inquiry into the violence and a white paper tabled in Parliament. The opposition also blamed former state chief minister N Biren Singh for the collapse of law and order in Manipur. It demanded that the election process in the state be restored, saying President's rule is not a remedy. Initiating the discussion on a statutory resolution on imposition of President's Rule in Manipur, Leader of Opposition Mallikarjun Kharge asked Prime Minister Narendra Modi to visit strife-torn Manipur at the earliest to restore order.

Women protesters target residence of NPP Manipur chief over remark

PTI, IMPHAL: Tensions flared in Manipur's Imphal West on Friday as dozens of women protesters attempted to storm the residence of National People's Party (NPP) Manipur unit president Yumnam Joykumar Singh, demanding an apology over his recent remarks on Meitei organisation Arambai Tenggol.

The protesters, under the banner of Apunba Manipur Emasing (United Manipur Mothers), tried to force their way into Joykumar's home in Naoremthong, but were stopped by police deployed in the area.

However, a few representatives were allowed to meet Joykumar.

The protests were triggered by a post on X, in which Joykumar had written, "Biren Ji misjudged the Kuki-Meitei conflict's roots... Why did his govt allow massive

rallies, withdraw commands from Churachandpur, and let groups like Arambai Tenggol attack Kukis?"

Following the meeting with the women's group, Joykumar told reporters that

the issue stemmed from a "slight misunderstanding" and confirmed that Arambai Tenggol's name had been removed from the original post. However, he refused to tender a public apology.

Virgin Atlantic flight carrying over 250 passengers stranded in Turkey takes off for Mumbai

PTI, MUMBAI: After being stranded for more than 40 hours at a Turkey airport, over 250 Virgin Atlantic passengers, including Indians, are now airborne and their flight is expected to land in Mumbai late in the evening on Friday.

The passengers were stuck at the Diyarbakir Airport in Turkey after their Mumbai-bound aircraft from London was diverted to the airport on Wednesday.

In a statement on Friday,

A passenger, who was among those stranded at the airport, told PTI on Thursday that all passengers were sitting on the floor, and there were no blankets available

a Virgin Atlantic spokesperson said the passengers were provided with overnight hotel accommodation on Thursday evening.

"With all necessary technical approvals now se-

cured, the plane departed Diyarbakir Airport at 13:00 local time on Friday 4th April, operating as flight VS1358. Customers are now en route to Mumbai, with an expected arrival at approximately 20:49 local time," the spokesperson said.

A passenger, who was among those stranded at the airport, told PTI on Thursday that all passengers were sitting on the floor, and there were no blankets available.

Also, there was no vegetarian food available, the passenger said on condition of anonymity. Over 250 passengers are stuck at the airport. An A350-1000 aircraft was operating the flight that has over 300 seats, according to sources.

"We're sorry that Virgin Atlantic flight VS358 from London Heathrow to Mumbai on 2nd April was disrupted following an urgent medical diversion to Diyarbakir Airport in Turkey.

7 women farm workers die as tractor-trolley falls into well in Nanded

PTI, CHHATRAPATI SAMBHAJINAGAR: Seven women farm labourers, two of them aged 18, died and three others were rescued after a tractor-trolley ferrying them to an agriculture field plunged into a well in Nanded district of Maharashtra on Friday morning, an official said.

The accident occurred at around 7.30 am in Asegaon village which lies under jurisdiction of Limbgaon police station when the vehicle veered off the road and fell into the well filled to the brim with water, said District Information Officer (DIO) Pravin Take said.

Police and local administration officials immediately launched a rescue operation and pumped out a large amount of water from the well, he said.

At the end of the operation, bodies of seven women were fished out of the well, while three others were rescued, said the DIO. "The woman were on their way to harvest turmeric at a farm. All those who died hailed from Gunj village

under Vasmat tehsil in Hingoli district," the official said.

The deceased were identified as Tarabai Satwaji Jadhav (35), Dhurpata Satwaji Jadhav (18), Saraswati Lakhani Burad (25), Simran Santosh Kamble (18), Chaitrabai Madhav Pardhe (45), Jyoti Irabaji Saraode (35), Sapna Tukaram Raut (25), he said.

Three other women farm labourers - Parvatibai Burad (35), Purbhabin Kamble (40), Satwaji Jadhav (55) - were rescued from the water body.

The injured will be given Rs 50,000 each, he said.

"Saddened by the loss of lives in an accident in Nanded, Maharashtra. Condolences to those who have lost their loved ones. May the injured recover soon. The local administration is assisting those affected," the Prime Minister said.

Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis expressed grief over the death of farm labourers and separately announced a financial assistance of Rs 5 lakh to the family of each deceased.

IMD issues thunderstorm warning for Mumbai

PTI, MUMBAI: The Met department on Friday evening issued a warning about the possibility of a thunderstorm in Mumbai in the next few hours.

The warning by the India Meteorological Department (IMD) came around 4.30 in the evening.

"Thunderstorm accompanied with lightning and light spells of rain with gusty winds reaching 30-40 kmph very likely to occur at isolated places in the districts of Mumbai during next 3-4 hours," it said in the 'Nowcast' warning.

It also asked people to take precautions while stepping out. The financial capital of the country has been experiencing scorching heat and high humidity since morning. Earlier this week, some areas of Mumbai had received drizzles.

Meanwhile, the mainline services of the Central Railway were affected around 3.15 pm on Friday as a corrugated sheet roof was blown off.
