Sift wins India's first gold at Argentina Shooting World Cup, Esha bags silver NEW DELHI: Indian shooter Sift Kaur Samra produced a

sensational come-from-behind performance to win her first individual ISSF World Cup gold in the women's 50m rifle 3-positions final, while Esha Singh bagged a second individual World Cup silver in Buenos Aires, Argentina. The 23-year-old Sift from Faridkot thus earned India its first gold of the season-opening World Cup stage event at the Tiro Federal Argentino de Buenos Aires shooting range late on Friday. Sift finished with 458.6 points at the end of the 45-shot final, while Mangold ended 3.3 points behind on 455.3. Junior World Championship medallist Arina Altukhova of Kazakhstan was third, bowing out after the 44th shot with a tally of 445.9. Air Pistol Mixed Team world champion Esha tallied 35 in the women's 25m pistol final to finish behind China's Sun Yujie, who won gold with 38 hits after the 10th and final five-shot series. Sun's compatriot Feng Sixuan won bronze. Double Olympic medallist Manu Bhaker, who also made the final, finished sixth eventually.

NEW DELHI: Abhinash Jamwal delivered a near perfect performance against Italy's Gianluigi Malanga to storm into the 65kg final of the World Boxing Cup in Brazil's Foz Do Iguacu city. The 22-year-old Indian used his tall frame and athleticism to stay clear of Malanga's reach, but was quick enough to pounce when his rival's guard was down to earn a 5:0 unanimous verdict on Friday. Four of the five judges awarded Jamwal a perfect 30, with all them awarding the first and third rounds to the Indian unanimously. On Thursday, Hitesh became the first Indian to reach the World Boxing Cup final after defeating French Olympian Makan Traore in 70kg weight category. While Hitesh will take on England's Odel Kamara, Jamwal will face off local favourite Yuri Reis in the final.

### Pant fined Rs 12L for slow over-rate, Digvesh docked half match fees once again

**LUCKNOW:** Lucknow Super Giants skipper Rishabh Pant copped a fine of Rs 12 lakh for maintaining slow over-rate during their 12-run victory over Mumbai Indians in an IPL match, here, on Saturday. The stipulated time for a bowling team to finish 20 overs is 90 minutes and Pant's LSG were running short after the 19th over due to which, they were forced to keep one fielder less outside the 30-yard circle. "As this was his team's first offence of the season under Article 2.22 of the IPL Code of Conduct, which pertains to minimum over-rate offences, Rishabh Pant was fined INR 12 Lakh," BCCI press release stated. Meanwhile, LSG's trump card Digvesh Rathi has now been fined 50 percent of his match fees for the second successive time after breaching Level-1 code of conduct of IPL. Rathi was also docked half of his match fees for his over the top wicket-taking celebration against Punjab Kings.

## Dhoni is still going strong: Fleming quashes Dhoni's retirement speculation

CHENNAI: Chennai Super Kings head coach Stephen Fleming said MS Dhoni is "still going strong" and putting an end to the former skipper's run in the IPL is not a role assigned to him. The presence of Dhoni's parents -- Pan Singh and Devaki Devi -- at the Chepauk for CSK's match against Delhi Capitals on Saturday had fuelled speculation about an imminent his retirement. "No, that's not my role to put an end to it. I have no idea. I'm just enjoying working with him. He's still going strong. I don't even ask these days. You guys are the ones that ask (about retirement)," said Fleming in the post-match press conference.

## Thomas Muller to leave Bayern Munich after this season

MUNICH: Thomas Muller will leave Bayern Munich this summer after a 25-year career at the German club. The 35-year-old Muller said Saturday, in a joint announcement with Bayern, that his "incredible journey" with his boyhood club will end in July. The midfielder's contract is set to expire after the season and he's seen limited game time. "It's clea that today is not like any other day for me," Muller said. "My 25 years as an FC Bayern Munich player will come to an end in the summer. It's been an incredible journey, shaped by unique experiences, great encounters and unforgettable triumphs. "I feel immense gratitude and joy that I got to make this career with my beloved club. The special connection to the club and our fantastic fans will always remain. What I want as a farewell should be clear: titles we can celebrate together, and moments we'll remember fondly for a long time." Muller has helped Bayern win 33 trophies after joining the club's academy at age 10 in the summer of 2000. He's made a club-record number of appearances with 743 matches.
