India ends World Boxing Cup campaign on a high with six-medal haul

NEW DELHI: The Indian boxing contingent ended their campaign at the World Boxing Cup with an impressive haul of six medals, including a gold won by Hitesh, at Foz Do Iquacu in Brazil. It's India's first-ever outing in an elitelevel international meet organised by World Boxing. Hitesh became the first Indian boxer to clinch a gold medal in the World Boxing Cup. His opponent Odel Kamara of England was injured and couldn't take to the ring in the 70kg final on Saturday. Abhinash Jamwal, the other Indian boxer to reach the final in the 65kg category, gave his best against local favourite Yuri Reis but could not do enough to get a favourable verdict and bagged a silver medal. Four Indians -- Jadumani Singh Mandengbam (50kg), Manish Rathore (55kg), Sachin (60kg) and Vishal (90kg) -- bagged bronze medals. Hitesh credited the 10-day preparatory camp in Brazil ahead of the tournament as something that helped him and the team a lot.

CHANDIGARH: Jofra Archer is one of the toughest bowlers to face in world cricket and he regaining form after proving expensive early in the IPL was on expected lines, his Rajasthan Royals teammate Sandeep Sharma said. Archer had leaked as many as 76 runs in his four overs in the opening game against Sunrisers Hyderabad before conceding 33 runs in 2.3 overs against Kolkata Knight Riders. He also failed to pick up a wicket besides proving expensive. However, the England pacer upped his ante in his previous two outings, most recently against Punjab Kings on Saturday night when he struck twice in the opening over. "When you start any tournament, something like the IPL, it's high pressure. You have so many quality batters and opponent sides. First two matches, your nerves are high. I think that is what happened." "We always knew Jofra is a world class bowler. The skill he brings to the table or into the game, it's totally different. Very few can bring that," said Sandeep after the win over Punjab Kings.

Real Madrid beat Leyendas FC Barcelona Legends by 2-0 in 'Legends Face-off'

NAVI MUMBAI: Real Madrid Leyendas defeated FC Barcelona Legends 2-0 as the two iconic football giants reignited their rivalry here on Sunday, as part of the much-anticipated 'Legends Face-off'. Morientes opened the scoring for Real Madrid Leyendas in the 14th minute, capitalising on a well-worked move orchestrated by Luis Figo and Michael Owen. The second half saw the intensity rise as FC Barcelona Legends pushed hard to break through the Real Madrid defence. With the crowd roaring them on, they turned up the heat, launching wave after wave of attacks. Just as Barcelona looked close to scoring, Real Madrid Legends doubled their lead in the 69th minute. A moment of brilliance from David Barral saw him skip past two legendary defenders -- Carles Puyol and Frank de Boer -- before calmly slotting the ball past the goalkeeper. The strike further energised the Madrid camp and left the crowd at DY Patil Stadium in awe.

PSG win 13th French title

PARIS: Paris Saint-Germain clinched the Ligue 1 title on Saturday with a 1-0 win at home against Angers as they prepare for a Champions League quarter-final showdown with Aston Villa. PSG needed just a draw in front of their own fans to be confirmed as champions again, having started the day a huge 21 points clear of nearest challengers Monaco with seven matches left. Desire Doue's strike early in the second half decided the game in PSG's favour, allowing Luis Enrique's team to take the title with six matches still to play. It is a fourth consecutive Ligue 1 title for the club from the French capital and their 11th in the last 13 seasons.

Though the Blues lost the second leg 2-1, at the Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium, here, their 2-0 win from the first game of this fixture earlier this week ensured that they entered the summit clash, with Sunil Chhetri starring courtesy of a decisive goal in the added time of the second half.
