
A DAY LATER, CRACKDOWN ON 'ILLEGAL' HILL CUTTING

Deputy Collector and SDO seeks reports from Deputy Town Planner 'at the earliest' after O Heraldo exposed how rule of law was flouted

PANJIM: A day after **O** Heraldo exposed the 'unauthorised' hill cutting at Sirvoi in Quepem, **Ouepem Deputy Collector** and Sub-Divisional Officer (SDO) Manohar Karekar directed the Deputy Town Planner of the Town and Country Planning (TCP) Department to investigate if development permissions or approvals were issued by the department for the work.

In his letter, Karekar also directed a probe into whether the 'activities' fall within any planned development zones and violate any provisions of the Regional Plan or Outline Development Plan.



Govt hikes LPG price by Rs 50, CNG by Re 1

PTI, NEW DELHI: The domestic cooking gas LPG price on Monday was hiked by a steep Rs 50 per cylinder across India and CNG by Re 1 per kg, while the government raised taxes on petrol and diesel to shore up its revenues.

The increase in cooking gas price will be for the Ujjawala - poor beneficiaries who got LPG connection free of cost - and general users, and will be effective from April 8 and has been necessitated due to the rise in input cost, Oil Minister Hardeep Singh Puri said.

Cooking gas for Újjawala users will cost Rs 553 per 14.2-kg cylinder from the current Rs 503 in the national capital. The same for general users will now cost Rs 853.

The rates, which vary from state to state depending on local incidence of taxes, were last revised in March last year when they were cut by Rs 100.

Locals say funds should be allocated for a bypass so that village, temples can be saved

PONDA: Union Minister for Road Transport and Highways Nitin Gadkari on Monday announced the four-laning of the National Highway from Bhoma to Old Goa, sending ripples of anger and anxiety through the local villagers, who were upset that a bypass for Bhoma was not considered. Bhomkars gathered at the Mahadev Temple in the evening, vowing to fight back and defend their village and temple. The primary concern among the locals is the potential loss of not only their homes but also their temple culture, along with several religious structures that have been central to their worship for centuries. Sanjay Naik, a leader of the protesting Bhomkars, stated that the proposed elevated road and seven metre service roads on both sides would be devastating, leading to the destruction of their village. Naik asserted the grav-

per kg in the national capital and adjoining cities after the government last week raised input natural gas prices by almost 4%. CNG in the national capital will cost Rs 75.09 per kg, Indraprastha Gas Ltd - the city gas retailer - said in a post on X. This follows the price of input natural gas being hiked from \$6.50 per million British thermal units to \$6.75 from April 1.

Alongside, the government hiked excise duty on petrol and diesel by Rs 2 per litre each to raise about Rs 32,000 crore additional tax revenue. However, there will be no change in retail prices as the increase will be adjusted against the price cut that was warranted because of falling international oil prices.

Puri said prices of crude oil - which is turned into petrol and diesel in refineries - have fallen to about \$60 per barrel from \$70-75, and a reduction in the retail selling price of petrol and diesel is possible if the international oil prices stay at those levels.

Sensex tanks 2,227 points, wipes out Rs 14 lakh crore of investor wealth

PTI, MUMBAI: Stock markets crumbled on Monday with Sensex sinking by 2.226.79 points - its steepest single-day decline in 10 months – as a global mar-ket carnage following US President Trump's tariff hikes and retaliation from China fanned fears of economic slowdown. Dalal Street investors were a poorer lot on Monday as their wealth eroded sharply by Rs 14 lakh crore.
