Whatever experience I had, it had to come in right: RCB hero Krunal Pandya

MUMBAI: Royal Challengers Bengaluru all-rounder Krunal Pandya acknowledged that he had to dig deep into his decade-long experience of playing the game to help his side beat Mumbai Indians by 12 runs in an edge-of-the-seat thriller, here, on Monday. Just when it seemed Mumbai Indians would chase down a steep target of 222 with Hardik Pandya (42) and Tilak Varma (56) batting with ferocity, Krunal kept his composure and grabbed three wickets in the last over to take the wind out of the home team's sails, managing to tie them down to 209 for nine. "The amount of games I have played in the last 10 years, whatever experience I had, it had to come in right. Sometimes, you want to commit but you know it is important to commit 100 per cent," said Krunal, who returned excellent figures of 4 for 45, after the match. "So the execution becomes much on your side. I was clear in a way where I wanted to commit fully to whatever ball I wanted to bowl," Krunal added as RCB clinched their first victory at the Wankhede Stadium in 10 years.

Ishant fined 25 per cent of his match for code of conduct breach

HYDERABAD: Gujarat Titans pacer Ishant Sharma has been fined 25 per cent of his match fees besides accumulating a demerit point for breaching the IPL Code of Conduct during the game against Sunrisers Hyderabad on Sunday night. "Ishant Sharma admitted to the Level 1 offence under Article 2.2 and accepted the Match Referee's sanction," said the IPL in a statement. "For Level 1 breaches of the Code of Conduct, the Match Referee's decision is final and binding," the statement added. Article 2.2 of IPL's Code of Conduct relates to "abuse of cricket equipment or clothing, ground equipment or fixtures and fittings during a match".

I've 10 months to decide whether I want to play one more year: Dhoni on IPL future

NEW DELHI: The legendary MS Dhoni stayed immune to the growing clamour around his future in the IPL, saying the decision to bring curtains on his career depends on how his body reacts to the demands of top-flight cricket and he has "10 months" to take a call. In this IPL, Dhoni has not been able to make the kind of impact that he usually does while batting in the lower middle-order. His lack of timing and ineffectiveness, evidenced in the 76 runs that he made from four matches, have prompted several experts to urge the multiple World Cup-winning skipper to move on. "I am still playing the IPL and it is one year at a time for me. I am 43 now and by the end of this IPL season, I will be 44," Dhoni said on entrepreneur Raj Shamani's podcast recently. "So, I have 10 months to decide whether I want to play one more year and it's not me to decide as it is my body that decides whether I can play or not," he added. However, the former Chennai Super Kings skipper, who led CSK to five IPL titles, said he is quite content with his achievements on the field. "It is not about whether I am happy or unhappy. Whatever has happened has happened. It cannot be changed. It's about accepting all of it. You know, whatever happens I will not be able to add one more run to my international runs, and no one will be able to reduce them," he said.

Harry Brook appointed as England's white ball captain

LONDON: Harry Brook was on Monday appointed England white-ball captain following Jos Buttler's exit from the role after a poor ICC Champions Trophy campaign last month. Brook, who was signed up by Delhi Capitals during last year's auction, had withdrawn from the IPL 2025 to focus on his England career, and was subsequently slapped with a two-year ban from playing in the league. The 26-year-old has been a key part of England's white-ball set-up since making his debut in January 2022, and has spent the past year as the vice-captain in both ODIs and T20Is. He also led England in the ODI series against Australia last September in Buttler's absence. "It's a real honour to be named England's white-ball captain. Ever since I was a kid playing cricket at Burley in Wharfedale, I dreamed of representing Yorkshire, playing for England, and maybe one day leading the team. To now be given that chance means a great deal to me," said Brook in a statement issued by the ECB.

Top Indian shuttlers for Badminton Asia Championships

NINGBO (China): India's top shuttlers, including Lakshya Sen, HS Prannoy and two-time Olympic medallist PV Sindhu, will try to overcome their string of below-par performances this season when the opening-round matches in the Badminton Asia Championships commence, here, on Tuesday. Besides the two top-ranked Indian men's singles players in the world, Prannoy (17th) and Sen (18th), Kiran George (34th) and Priyanshu Rajawat (35th) will aim to put up a good show, while in women's singles, Sindhu, whose world ranking has dropped to 17th, will hope to recover her form in the continental event. The other Indians in the fray, young Malvika Bansod (23rd), Anupama Upadhyaya (43rd) and Aakshshi Kashyap (48th), will be keen to make an impact in an extremely tough field. The mixed doubles event will feature Rohan Kapoor/Ruthvika Shivani Gadge, Sathish Karunakaran/Aadaya Variyath, Dhruv Kapila/Tanisha Crasto, and Ashith Surya/Amrutha Pramuthesh. The event will conclude on April 13.

AIFF forms task force to look into MRA negotiations with FSDL, Bhutia opposes move

NEW DELHI: The All India Football Federation (AIFF) on Monday decided to form an eight-member task force to look into the Master Rights Agreement (MRA) negotiations with its commercial partner Football Sports Development Ltd (FSDL), a move that was opposed by the legendary Bhauichung Bhutia. This was decided during the apex body's executive committee meeting at the Football House, where they met to discuss the MRA proposal given to the federation by FSDL. Former India captain Bhutia, who is part of the executive committee and attended the meeting, however, opposed the formation of the task force for MRA negotiations and asked the federation to wait for the Supreme Court judgement on new Constitution of the AIFF. "The draft constitution of the AIFF prepared by former SC judge L Nageswara Rao says the ISL should be organised and controlled by the AIFF and in partnership with private bodies. The SC verdict is expected to come in a month's time and the negotiations can wait for a while.

PTI, NEW DELHI: The Kalinga Super Cup 2025 will begin with a double header on April 20 with Kerala Blasters FC taking on East Bengal FC followed by Mohun Bagan SG's match against an I-League Club in the day's second match.
