Suruchi wins women's 10m air pistol gold at Argentina Shooting World Cup
BUENOS AIRES: Indian teen shooter Suruchi Inder Singh produced a sensational performance to clinch her maiden ISSF World Cup medal -- a gold in the women's 10m air pistol event here on Tuesday. The 18-year-old shot 244.6 in the eight-shooter final to finish on top of the podium and fetch India's third gold of the ongoing World Cup. The Chinese duo of Qian Wei, who shot 241.9, and double Olympic medallist Jiang Ranxin (221.0) finished second and third respectively. Qian shot a 10.9 in her very first shot of the 24-shot final to sound the bugle early as Suruchi began with a 10.1. A couple of 9s and an 8.9 for her 10th meant despite some high 10s, the Indian was a touch outside podium places after 10 shots.

Kapila-Crasto keep India's hopes alive in mixed doubles of Badminton Asia Championships
NINGBO (China): The Indian mixed doubles pair of Dhruv Kapila and Tanisha Crasto battled hard to beat Hoo Pang Ron and Su Yin Cheng of Malaysia to enter the pre-quarterfinals of the Badminton Asia Championships, here, on Tuesday. The Indian pair fought for 51 minutes to get the better of their Malaysian counterparts 15-21, 21-12, 21-11 in the first round match. Crasto and Kapila will next play Chinese Taipei's Hong Wei Ye and Nicole Gonzales Chan. Elsewhere, it was disappointment as three other Indian mixed doubles pairs lost their opening matches.

New Zealand cricket head coach Gary steps down from limited-overs formats
WELLINGTON: Gary Stead confirmed on Tuesday he will no longer coach New Zealand in the Twenty20 and one-day international formats and is considering his future in test cricket. Stead said he expects to take a month to reach a final decision. The 53-year-old Stead has coached New Zealand in all formats since taking over from Mike Hesson in 2018. New Zealand Cricket said it would advertise from next week and is yet to decide whether it will appoint different coaches to different formats. Stead guided New Zealand to the finals of the 2019 ICC World Cup, the 2022 T20 World Cup and this year's Champions Trophy. He also led New Zealand to victory in the inaugural World Test Championship.

Iyer among nominated cricketers for ICC Player of the Month
DUBAI: India's middle-order mainstay Shreyas Iyer was on Tuesday nominated alongside New Zealand's Rachin Ravindra and Jacob Duffy for the ICC Player of the Month award for March following his impact show in last month's Champions Trophy. With 243 runs in five matches at 48.60 including two half-centuries, Iyer played a vital role in India's title win in the eight-team competition. "The right-handed batter compiled 172 runs in three ODIs in March, averaging 57.33 with a strike rate of 77.47, finishing the top-scorer for India during the tournament," the ICC said on its website. Duffy, the world No 1 T20I bowler, found his way into the list following a dominant show in New Zealand's 4-1 hammering of Pakistan in the T20I series. He took 13 wickets with an economy rate of 6.17 and average of 8.38.

Royal Challengers Bengaluru skipper Patidar fined Rs 12 lakh for team's slow over-rate
MUMBAI: Royal Challengers Bengaluru captain Rajat Patidar was fined Rs 12 lakh after his team maintained a slow over-rate during their IPL match against Mumbai Indians here. RCB beat MI by 12 runs and Patidar contributed a stylish 32-ball 64 to his side's eventual total of 221 for five. MI were then restricted to 209 for nine. "As this was his team's first offence of the season under Article 2.2 of the IPL's Code of Conduct, which pertains to minimum over-rate offences, Patidar was fined Rs 12 lakh," stated an IPL media release.

Maiden call-up for Bangladesh's Sakib for Zimbabwe Test
DHAKA: Bangladesh's white-ball pace sensation Tanzim Hasan Sakib earned his maiden Test call with selectors announcing on Tuesday the 15-member squad for first of two home Tests against Zimbabwe. Sakib, 22, replaces veteran Taskin Ahmed, 30, whose return to active cricket remains uncertain after an injury to his left Achilles tendon. Bangladesh, a formidable opponent on slow and spin-friendly home pitches, will take on the visitors in Sylhet and Chattogram, with the first match starting on April 20.

Neeraj to begin season with Doha Diamond League on May 16
NEW DELHI: Double Olympic medallist Indian javelin thrower Neeraj Chopra on Tuesday confirmed that he will kick off his season at the Doha Diamond League scheduled for May 16 in the Qatari capital. Chopra said he is looking forward to competing in front of one of athletics' most passionate crowds when he returns to the Wanda Diamond League meeting in Doha for the third year in a row. After Doha meet, Chopra will compete in 'Neeraj Chopra Classic' javelin event on May 24 in Panchkula.

Harmanpreet returns to lead India women's team for ODI tri-series in Sri Lanka
NEW DELHI: Star batter Harmanpreet Kaur returned as India women's team captain for the ODI tri-series in Sri Lanka starting later this month after she was rested for the home series against Ireland in January. The BCCI women's selection committee picked a 15-member squad with Smriti Mandhana as Harmanpreet's deputy for the April 27 to May 11 tournament, which will also involve South Africa besides hosts Sri Lanka. India will face Sri Lanka in the tournament opener on April 27. The teams will play four matches each in the double round-robin league event. The top two teams will qualify for the final which will be played on May 11. All the matches will be played at the R Premadasa Stadium in Colombo.
