They fell in love with music from a very young age and now both are accomplished musicians who often join their father in a trio, Trio de Assuncao. They recently performed their fourth major concert in February as a trio with their father on violin, Maria Gisela on piano and Maria

Sancha on violin, after initially forming the trio in 2011. "I am elder than Maria Gisela and we practise together and we are also part of the choir, Harmonizers Chorus and we perform for weddings and other occasions. As sisters, it makes it easier for us to practise and perform together," says Maria Sancha from Curtorim. They have also performed at various events organised by Fundacao Oriente, the Portuguese Consulate, Galeria de Belas Artes, Child's Play Foundation etc.

Frank also plays the guitar in a youth band but his sister joins him in his choir and mando performances. "I love writing songs and composing toast songs and poems. Lerissa joined me in the choir after the passing of our sister. Now, we both sing for choirs, litanies, roce. Lerissa and I have a four year difference but we truly enjoy each other's company," says Frank, who has his choir, Echoes of Grace.

The filmmaker and his team had done multiple rounds of recce globally and designed path-breaking action sequences with stunt directors of international repute. Sanguem, and took inspiration from his life to write this beautiful story. "The story



revolves around a husband and wife and their three sons. The father is a catechist, and his wife starts doubting him when he dedicates his time to God's work. Their three sons get married, and the story follows how these three daughters-in-law are welcomed into the family," explains Victor.

An employee of a private firm, Victor had to find time to complete the shoot. The story was written in 2023, and working with a big cast required time to bring all the actors together. "With just

the main family, I had eight members of the cast. There are almost 25 actors in the film, and all are new actors except for comedians Nato and Agnel," he adds.

The film was shot last year but delayed its release as it was awaiting Central Board of Film Certification. "As I am new to the industry, I was not aware of how long it takes for the certification. The film is two hours long and was shot across South Goa," says Victor. He is a father to triplets—Valanka, Sarah, and Erika—and the three are also part of the film.

The film received a warm and enthusiastic reception and was praised for providing opportunities to young local talent, with many of its actors making their debut on the big screen. "This is the first time I've acted in a film, but I am very happy with the support I received from all the actors," says Nerissa Fernandes, actor and producer.

Victor expressed gratitude for the overwhelming support from Goan audiences and voiced hopes that the

government would provide more backing for independent filmmakers. He stressed the importance of encouraging local talent and nurturing future filmmakers in the region.

Many of the film's cast members are first-time actors, and according to one of the stars, the entire team was incredibly supportive in helping each other grow throughout the process. "This movie is something young people should definitely watch," shared one of the actors, emphasizing the film's relatable themes and fresh energy.

With its local flavor and heartfelt themes, 'Mogacho Korar' has already captured the hearts of many, showcasing the untapped talent of Goan youth and presenting a compelling story to a larger audience.
