# **Arsenal stun Real Madrid as Rice** delivers free-kick masterclass

# Inter Milan stun Bayern Munich with late winner

AFP, LONDON/MUNICH: Arsenal delivered a sensational 3-0 victory over Champions League holders Real Madrid, with Declan Rice scoring two sublime free-kicks in a quarter-final first leg that left the Gunners on the brink of a historic semi-final berth.

Rice, who had never scored a free-kick in his career, struck twice from set-pieces in the second half at the Emirates Stadium. Mikel Merino added a third before Real's Eduardo Camavinga was sent off late for kicking the ball away, capping a humiliating night for the 15-time European champions.

Rice's first goal curled around the wall into the far corner in the 58th minute, before he rifled another into the top corner from 20 yards out in the 70th. Even Real keeper Thibaut Courtois had no answers for the England star's thun-

Merino's goal five minutes later sealed a dream result, sending the Emirates into wild celebration. Arsenal, who haven't reached a

Champions League semi-final since 2009, are firm favourites for the second leg in Madrid on April 16, with a potential tie against PSG or Aston Villa looming. Arsenal manager Mikel

Arteta had dubbed it the "biggest night" of his career, and his players rose to the challenge. Despite trailing Premier League leaders Liverpool by 11 points, the Gunners now have a clear

shot at European glory. Meanwhile in Munich, Inter Milan secured a thrilling 2-1 win over Bayern thanks to an 88th-minute strike from Davide Frattesi. Marcus Thuram's clever back-heel set up Lautaro

Martinez to open the scoring in the 38th minute. before Bayern's Thomas Mueller equalised five minutes

from time. But Inter responded quickly, breaking on the counter with Carlos Augusto feeding Frattesi for the winner. It was Bayern's first home loss in the Champions League since 2021, ending a 22-match unbeaten run.

Inter, last season's finalists, showed resilience and composure. "We showed character, personality," said Martinez. Injury-hit Bayern, missing key defenders, were unable to capitalise on early dominance, with Harry Kane hitting the post and Michael Olise testing the Inter defence.

Despite Mueller's late goal, Bayern coach Vincent Kompany faces a tough task in the return leg in Milan.


