PANJIM: In a highly competitive and visually stunning final, MES Vasant Joshi College of Arts & Commerce, Zuarinagar, defeated Dnyanprassarak Mandal's College and Research Centre, Assagao, by 8 wickets to clinch the Goa University Inter-Collegiate Women Cricket Championship, played at the Goa University ground, Taleigao Plateau, recently.

DM's College won the toss and elected to bat. In the opening inning, DM's College successfully accumulated a total of 140 runs while losing 4 wickets for 20 overs.

The top performers with the bat were Tanaya Naik, who scored 98 runs off 76 balls, and Pallavi, who contributed 17 runs from 20 balls. On the bowling side for MES College, Pooja Yadav claimed 2 wickets for 19 runs. In the second inning, MES College successfully achieved a total of 141 runs for the loss of 2 wickets in 19.2 overs, claiming the victory.

Harshada Kadam was the top scorer with 56 runs off 59 balls, while Aradhana Saroj contributed significantly with 47 runs from 43 balls. On the bowling side, for DM's College, Tanaya Naik took one wicket for 15 runs. Additionally, Sanika Dhuri claimed one wicket, giving away 30 runs.
