Chahal spins magic as Punjab defend IPL's lowest total

Leg-spinner bags four as KKR fall from 71/3 to 95 all out

PTI, MULLANPUR: Punjab Kings scripted history on Tuesday by defending the lowest-ever total in IPL history, pulling off a thrilling 16-run victory over Kolkata Knight Riders after being bowled out for just 111.

Chasing 112, KKR were cruising at 71 for 3 in 9.1 overs before collapsing spectacularly to 95 all out in 15.1 overs. Leg-spinner Yuzvendra Chahal was the architect of the upset, returning match-winning figures of 4 for 28. His scalps included Ajinkya Rahane (17), Angkrish Raghuvanshi (37), Rinku Singh (2) and Ramandeep Singh (0)—the latter two in successive deliveries.

Pacer Marco Jansen also played a pivotal role, picking up 3 for 17, while Xavier Bartlett, Glenn Maxwell and Arshdeep Singh took one apiece. The previous lowest total defended was 116 by CSK in 2009.

Early on, Sunil Narine (5) and Quinton de Kock (2) fell cheaply to Jansen and Bartlett respectively. Rahane and Raghuvanshi steadied the innings, guiding KKR to 55 for 2 at the end of the powerplay. However, Chahal's introduction in the eighth over turned the tide—Rahane was trapped LBW, and Raghuvanshi was caught at backward point

Maxwell removed Venkatesh Iyer, while Chahal cleaned up Rinku and Ramandeep to leave KKR tottering at 76 for 7. Jansen struck again to remove Harshit Rana, and although Andre Russell briefly threatened with

Boxing turf war deepens as interim panel, State units clash

war in India's boxing administration intensified on Tuesday with members of various state units calling for immediate elections while the newly-formed Interim Committee announced its own set of key decisions, including the conduct of national championships and appointment of coaches.

The tenure of the BFI office-bearers ended on February 2. However, the elections have been delayed by legal disputes.

In its latest order, the Himachal Pradesh High Court directed the Sports Ministry observer and the Returning Officer to issue a fresh election schedule before April 28, when the case is set to be heard again.

India to play 6 matches on Bangladesh tour

PTI, DHAKA: India will 26. They will return to Dhaplay four games at the Sher-e-Bangla Stadium in Mirpur and the remaining two in Chattogram during their white-ball away series against Bangladesh in August, the BCB announced on Tuesday.

India will play three ODIs and as many T20s in Bangladesh. This will also be India's first T20 bilateral series in Bangladesh and first exclusive white-ball tour since 2014.

The first two ODIs and the last two T20s will be played in Mirpur while the third ODI and first T20 will be held in Chattogram.

India are set to arrive in Dhaka on August 13. They will play the first two ODIs on August 17 and 20, before heading to Chattogram to play the third ODI and first T20 on August 23 and

ka to play the last two T20s on August 29 and 31.

The tour will also help in preparation for the Asia Cup T20. While India are the hosts of the tournament, it is still not clear if the event will be entirely held in Sri Lanka, Bangladesh or UAE as Pakistan will not travel to India as per the understanding between the two countries.

"This series promises to be one of the most exciting and most anticipated events in our home calendar," BCB's chief executive Nizam Uddin Chowdhury was quoted as saying by ESPNcricinfo.
