Kothari crowned IBSF World Billiards champion after beating Pankaj Advani

NEW DELHI: Ace Indian cueist Sourav Kothari clinched the 2025 IBSF World Billiards title after an emphatic victory over multiple-time winner Pankaj Advani in the final in Carlow, Ireland. The cue sports world witnessed an unforgettable clash between two of India's finest -- Kothari and Advani -- for the coveted title at the Snooker and Billiards Ireland (SBI) Academy on Wednesday. The 40-year-old Kothari emerged champion, scoring 725 points to Advani's 480. Kothari is now only the third Indian to have won both the IBSF and the WBL World Billiards titles.

Indians add two bronze medals on third day of Asian U-18 Athletics C'ship

NEW DELHI: India picked up a bronze medal each through discus thrower Lakshita Mahlawat and 100m hurdler Shourya Ambure on the third day of the Asian Under-18 Athletics Championship in Dammam, Saudi Arabia on Thursday. Lakshita produced an effort of 41.30m to win the bronze in U-18 girls' discus throw event. China's Ma Chenyi (53.81m) and Zhao Anqi (47.89m) took the gold and silver respectively. Shourya added another bronze in U18 girls' 100m hurdles, clocking 13.80 seconds. China's Bao Yinyin (13.71) and He Yihui (13.76) won the gold and silver respectively. On Wednesday, Nitin Gupta (boys 5000m race walk), Tannu (girls 400m) won a silver medal each, while Nishchay (boys discus throw) and Aarti (girls 100m) clinched bronze apiece.

Newcastle thrash Crystal Palace to go third in Premier League

NEWCASTLE: Newcastle soared up to third in the Premier League with a 5-0 thrashing of Crystal Palace on Wednesday to close in on a return to the Champions League next season. Jacob Murphy, Harvey Barnes, Fabian Schar and Alexander Isak were on target for the Magpies, with Marc Guehi also scoring an own goal, as Newcastle made light of the absence of manager Eddie Howe due to pneumonia. A sixth consecutive victory in all competitions opens up a fivepoint lead for Newcastle over sixth-placed Chelsea, with a place in the top five good enough for Champions League qualification. DC bowling coach Munaf fined 25% of match fee for IPL Code of Conduct breach

NEW DELHI: Delhi Capitals bowling coach Munaf Patel has been fined 25 percent of his match fee and accumulated one demerit point for breaching the IPL Code of Conduct during the high-octane game against Rajasthan Royals here. The match went down to the wire on Wednesday night with DC winning the edge-of-the-seat thriller in a Super Over after both teams were tied at 188 runs. The former India pacer "admitted to the Level 1 offence under Article 2.20 of the IPL Code of Conduct, which pertains to the conduct that is contrary to the spirit of the game," said an IPL statement.

BCCI removes assistant coach Nayar; support staff set for overhaul

NEW DELHI: The Indian cricket team's assistant coach Abhishek Nayar has been sacked just eight months into the assignment amid speculation of a rift with a high-profile member of the support staff even though Test debacles against New Zealand and Australia are being cited as the reason for his ouster. If board sources are to be believed, Nayar has already been intimated of the BCCI's decision to part ways with him. "While India's recent Test debacles (against New Zealand and Australia) has led to the churning but there is also a feeling in the BCCI that Nayar became a scapegoat in the turf war between an important member of the support staff and a senior star player," a BCCI source told PTI.

Neeraj begins season with 84.52m throw in South Africa

NEW DELHI: Two-time Olympic medal-winning javelin thrower Neerai Chopra started his season on a high by winning the Potch Invitational Track event in Potchefstroom, South Africa. Chopra topped the six-man field, hurl-ing the spear to a distance of 84.52m at the World Athletics Continental Tour Challenger event on Wednesday. The Indian star finished ahead of 25-year-old South African Douw Smit, whose best throw was 82.44m. But Chopra's effort was below his personal best of 89.94m, while Douw came close to his personal best of 83.29m. Chopra and Smit were the only two athletes to cross the 80m mark in the competition. Chopra is scheduled to begin his elitelevel campaign at the Doha Diamond League on May 16.

The Goa Football Association (GFA) President Caitano Fernandes, GOA Treasurer Jayesh Naik, Goa Hockey As-

The delegation strongly recommended that equipment procured for the National Games be handed over to the respective State associations for optimal use, preventing wastage and deterioration.

The GOA also acknowledged and appreciated recent positive steps initiated by the SAG under Dr Nagvenkar's leadership, including surprise inspections, improved monitoring mechanisms and the enforcement of codes of conduct, all of which signal a renewed commitment to transparency and professionalism in Goan sport.

The meeting concluded on a positive note, with Dr Nagvenkar assuring the delegation of SAG's continued support in strengthening the sports ecosystem in the State. Both parties expressed confidence in working collaboratively towards enhancing infrastructure, governance and opportunities for Goan ath-

Nadal to be honoured at the French Open

PARIS: Retired 14-time champion Rafael Nadal will receive a tribute at the French Open on Court Philippe-Chatrier on May 25, the tournament's opening day. "Rafa has left his mark on the history of the French Open in so many ways, that's why a tribute ceremony will be held in his honor," French Open director Amélie Mauresmo said on Thursday. "We want the tribute to be special, exceptional. We want it to be a surprise for everyone." Nadal, a 22-time Grand Slam champion who retired in November, already has a statue rising in the alleys of the clay court Grand Slam. He will also feature in an exhibition in the tournament museum and lend his voice to the official French Open trailer. "We wanted to do the tribute last year, to be transparent, but he refused at the time," Mauresmo said. "He wasn't sure that it was his last Roland Garros. Now that he is retired, he is happy to receive it."

MADRID: Carlo Ancelotti accepted Real Madrid may look to replace him as coach after Arsenal knocked out the Champions League holders in the quarter-finals on Wednesday. PANJIM: Mohun Bagan Super Giant clinched the Reliance Foundation Development League (RFDL) 2024-25 title after sailing past Classic Football Academy 3-0 in the final, held at the Reliance Corporate Park in Mumbai, recently.

Pasang Dorjee Tamang scored a magnificent hat-trick to hand the Mariners the triumph in the ultimate fixture. The Mariners asserted dominance right from the get-go as they overpowered Classic FA to keep hold of the ball possession in the opening minutes of the game.

In the 8th minute, Tamang drew first blood when he smashed in one from the edge of the box to find the top right corner with a spectacular fashion. The opening goal gave Mohun Bagan Super Giant more confidence to take the driver's seat in the game and in no time, Tamang scored his second, capitalising on a mistake from the Classic FA defence to make it 2-0. Classic FA did have a chance to pull one back but were left heads-inhands with lack of finishing touch in the final third.
