Shop owner arrested for sexually harassing 9-year-old girl

THANE: A shop owner was arrested for allegedly sexually harassing a 9-year-old girl in Shilphata area of Thane, a police official said on Saturday. Shil Daghar police station senior inspector Sandeepan Shinde identified the accused as Jafar Ali Sohab Siddigui (48), a resident of Achargalli. "On April 3 and 17, he called the victim to his shop when she was returning home from school. He touched her inappropriately. Siddiqui has been booked for sexual harassment and other offences under Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita and Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act," he said.

Two history-sheeters arrested in Thane; several chain-snatching cases solved

THANE: Two persons have been arrested for alleged involvement in several chain-snatching cases in Mumbai Metropolitan Region, a senior Thane police official said on Saturday. Ambivali residents Jaffar Yusuf Jaffri alias Chavan (26) and Sandeep Girishchandra Prasad (20), who are part of the infamous 'Irani' gang, have cases against their names in Thane, Navi Mumbai and Mumbai, Zone V Deputy Commissioner of Police Prashant Kadam told reporters. "They were nabbed by a team of Vartak Nagar police station. On March 12, they had snatched the chain of a 56-year-old woman in Yashodhan Nagar and fled on a motorcycle. Teams were formed at the time to arrest the duo. We recovered gold ornaments worth Rs 3.90 lakh, two motorcycles worth Rs 1.20 lakh as well as mobile phones worth Rs 15000," he said.

Drunk man bites off wife's finger in Noida, arrested

NOIDA: A man from Sector 12 in Noida has been arrested for biting off his wife's finger in an inebriated state, police said on Saturday. The arrested man identified as Anoop Manchanda has been sent to jail, they said. Sector 24 station in-charge Shyam Babu Shukla told PTI that the incident happened on April 16. "Anoop Manchanda went home drunk at around 10 pm on Wednesday and began beating his wife after picking a fight. He bit off a finger from her left hand, which got separated from her palm." Shukla said a case was registered after the woman, Shashi Manchanda, lodged a complaint on April 17. Manchanda was subsequently arrested and sent to jail, the officer said.

Two dead, two injured as excavator skids into gorge in Shimla

SHIMLA: Two persons were killed while two others sustained injuries after a JCB excavator plunged into a gorge near Shimla, police said on Saturday. The deceased have been identified as Sukhdev Singh Rana (31), a resident of Rupnagar district in Punjab, and Hari Nam Singh (30) from Kinnaur district. The injured -- Charanjeet Singh (26) from Punjab and Neeraj Kumar (20) from Bihar - are undergoing treatment at the Indira Gandhi Medical College (IGMC) in Shimla, police said. The accident took place on Friday near the Jwala Mata temple when Sukhdey lost control of the excavator, which skidded into a gorge. All four occupants of the excavator were rushed to the IGMC where doctors declared Sukhdev and Hari Nam brought dead, police said.

Five killed in two separate accidents in Bihar

JAMUI/NAWADA: At least five persons were killed and one injured in two separate accidents in Bihar's Jamui and Nawada districts on Saturday morning, officials said. In the first incident, three persons were killed and one injured when the vehicle they were traveling in rammed into a roadside tree in Mahana locality, under the jurisdiction of Lachuar police station in Jamui. "Three persons - Ankit Kumar Sinha, Buau Gupta and Vikram Yaday - died on the spot. The injured, Rohit Kumar, was taken to the nearest hospital. His condition is stable. Further investigation is underway," a statement issued by Jamui Police said. According to villagers, the victims were returning from a marriage party.

Will not allow imposition of Hindi in Maharashtra: Uddhav

MUMBAI: Shiv Sena (UBT) chief Uddhav Thackeray on Saturday asserted that his party will not allow making Hindi compulsory in Maharashtra after the state government decided to make Hindi a mandatory third language for students of classes 1 to 5. Addressing an event of the Bharatiya Kamgar Sena, the workers' wing of the Shiv Sena (UBT), Thackeray said his party has no aversion to the Hindi language but asked why it is being forced. His remarks come amid the opposition's outcry over the Maharashtra government's decision to make Hindi a mandatory third language for students of Classes 1 to 5 in Marathi and English-medium schools across the state, in a departure from the practice of studying two languages.

Punjab busts two major terror modules; RPGs, IEDs, RDX seized

India condemns killing of Hindu minority leader in Bangladesh

PTI, NEW DELHI: India on Saturday condemned the alleged abduction and killing of a Hindu minority leader in Bangladesh and called on the interim government in Dhaka to live up to its responsibility of protecting the minorities.

In a social media post, External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said the "brutal killing" of Bhabesh Chandra Roy follows a "pattern of systematic persecution" of Hindu minorities in Bangladesh. "We have noted with

distress the abduction and brutal killing of Shri Bhabesh Chandra Roy, a Hindu minority leader in Bangladesh," he said.

"This killing follows a pattern of systematic persecution of Hindu minorities under the interim government even as

the perpetrators of previous such events roam with impunity," Jaiswal said.

"We condemn this incident and once again remind the interim government to live up to its responsibility of protecting all minorities, including Hindus, without inventing excuses or making distinctions," he added.

There has been a sharp downturn in India-Bangladesh relations after deposed prime minister Sheikh Hasina fled Dhaka in August last year in the face of a massive anti-government protest.

The relations nosedived dramatically after the interim government headed by Muhammad Yunus failed to contain attacks on minorities, especially Hindus, in that country.

A CCTV camera installed at a nearby building captured the moment the building came down crashing, showing a thick cloud of dust filling the narrow alley.

Teams from the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF), Delhi Fire Services, police along with locals carried out the rescue operation for more than 12 hours at the site of the 20-yearold building in the Mustafabad area that collapsed around 3 am on Saturday.

Officials said the area being highly congested made the rescue efforts all the more challenging.

According to police, there were 22 people inside the building at the time of the incident, most

of them families. The owner of the building, Tehseen (60), and six members of his family were among the 11 deceased, officials said. They have been identified as Tehseen's son Nazeem (30), two daugh-

ters-in-law Shahina (28) and Chandni (23), and three grandchildren, Anas (6), Afreen (2) and Afan (2).

The others who lost their lives in the tragic incident were Danish (23) and Naved (17), who were brothers, Reshma (38) and Ishaq (75), officials said.

"We have lost an entire generation of our family in just one moment," said a grieving Bhulan, brother of Tehseen whose family lived on the first floor. One of Tehseen's sons - Aas Mo-

hammad - was killed in the 2020 north-east Delhi riots There were four shops on

the ground floor while the rest of the building was being used by tenants.

Anxious about the whereabouts of their loved ones. the inconsolable relatives of the victims kept looking in the debris even as the rescue operation lasted for hours.

A police source said that construction work in "twothree shops" on the ground floor could have led to the collapse. The locals also said that construction work was going on at a new shop. which could have triggered the collapse.

They also expressed concern about the fragile state of four to five buildings in the area. Waste sewer water has been seeping into the walls of many buildings in the area for years, and over time, the moisture has weakened the structures, causing the walls to develop cracks, Salim Ali, a

local resident, said. The Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) said in a statement that the building was around 20 years old and was not structurally stable.

The civic body said that a survey of the area will be carried out, adding that several buildings in the locality, including the one that collapsed, were not structurally stable.

These frauds are being perpetrated through fake websites, deceptive social media pages, Facebook posts, and paid advertisements on search engines such as Google, the home

ministry said in a statement. The scams involve the creation of profession-

al-looking but fake websites and social media profiles and WhatsApp accounts offering various services.

These include helicopter bookings for Kedarnath, guest house and hotel bookings for Char Dham pilgrims, online cab or taxi reservation, holiday pack-

ages and religious tours, according to the statement. Unsuspecting individu-

als, upon making payments through these portals, often realise they have been duped when no confirmation or service is received and the contact numbers become unreachable.

Kharge: 'Will win Waqf battle'; ED action won't scare us

PTI. NEW DELHI: Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge on Saturday said the party will not be daunted by the Enforcement Directorate's action against its leaders and also asserted that it will win the battle against the BJP-led central government on the Wagf (Amendment) Act.

Addressing a meeting of party general secretaries and in-charges here, Kharge said the Supreme Court has given importance to the points raised by the Congress and other opposition parties on the Act and alleged that the government had raked the 'Wagf by user' issue deliberately to create a dispute over such properties.

He said the Congress party brought together the entire opposition against the government's Waqf (Amendment) Bill.

"The Supreme Court is hearing this case right now, we are confident that we will win this battle too," he said, adding, "I am happy that the Supreme Court has given importance to the points raised by the Congress and other opposition parties."

He accused the BJP and the central government of misleading people on the issue of Waqf. "Especially the issue of 'Waqf by user' has been deliberately brought up by the government to put Waqf properties into dispute," he alleged.
