UNIDENTIFIED CAR HITS SCOOTER, **INJURES WOMAN AT FATORDA**

MARGAO: A woman identified as Saira Banu Rehman Shaikh of Motidongor-Margao, sustained injuries following a collision between her scooter and an unidentified car on April 19, at approximately 2.35 pm. According to Fatorda Police, the incident occurred when the driver of an unknown black-coloured car was travelling from Margao via Pajifond, Fatorda, towards the Old Hospicio Hospital. The driver allegedly drove in a rash and negligent manner, endangering human life and without exercising due care or caution. Upon reaching Pajifond, the car reportedly struck her scooter from behind. The scooter, ridden by Shaikh, was travelling in the same direction. Due to the impact, she sustained a injury to her right wrist. The driver of the car fled the scene without offering medical assistance or notifying the authorities. Assistant Sub-Inspector Ashish Velip of Fatorda Police Station has registered the offence under Section 281 and 125(B) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) 2023 and Sections 134(a) and (b) of the Motor Vehicles Act. Further investigation is in progress.

PEDESTRIAN INJURED IN HIT-AND-RUN AT AMDAI-SANGUEM

MARGAO: A pedestrian, Ganaraj Gaonkar of Amdai, Sanguem, sustained injuries after being struck by an unidentified scooter rider on April 18, at around 1 pm. According to a complaint lodged by Anand Gaonkar at the Sanguem Police Station, the incident occurred as the unknown rider of a blue-coloured scooter was proceeding in a rash and negligent manner from Amdaimol towards Sanguem. Upon reaching Amdai-Sanguem, the rider reportedly knocked down the pedestrian, causing grievous injuries to his left leg along with other bodily injuries. The accused scooter rider fled the scene without rendering any medical assistance or informing the police. Sanguem Police have registered the offence against the unknown scooter rider under Section 281 and 125(B) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) 2023 and Sections 134(a) and (b) of the Motor Vehicles Act. Further investigation is underway.

TWO INJURED IN CAR-SCOOTER COLLISION AT CURCHOREM

MARGAO: Two individuals sustained injuries following a collision between a car and a scooter near Shivaji Chowk, Four Road Junction, Curchorem. Chandreshwar Mopidive of Curchorem lodged a complaint with the Curchorem Police, stating that the driver of a car, identified as Subhas Bandari from Vaddem-Sanguem, was driving in a rash and negligent manner, endangering human life. According to the complaint, Bandari was proceeding from Curchorem market towards Sanguem and while attempting to overtake another vehicle, collided with Mopidive's scooter from the rear. The impact caused both Mopidive and pillion rider Laxmi to fall onto the road, resulting in injuries to both individuals.

SCOOTER RIDER INJURED IN ORLIM COLLISION

MARGAO: Colva Police have registered a case after a scooter rider sustained serious injuries in a road accident near a resort, Orlim. The incident occurred on 14 April at 1.15 pm when Joseph Jesus Gabriel Pimenta of Sambatty, Orlim, allegedly rode his bike in a rash and negligent manner, colliding head-on with an oncoming scooter. Mavrus S Fernandes of Madeva Mordi-Quepem, suffered grievous injuries to his right foot. The case has been registered under Sections 281 and 125(b) of the BNS. Head Constable Sidharth Kumbhar is investigating.

Fishing union condemns harassment of traditional canoe fishers at Campal

Demands Forest Department, tourism officials and Corporation to stop targeting small-scale fishermen

MARGAO: The National Federation of Small-Scale Fishworkers (NFSF) has strongly condemned what it described as a 'sustained aggression' against traditional fishers in Campal-Panjim, following complaints of harassment by government authorities.

In a letter addressed to five senior officials — including the Director of Fisheries, the Captain of Ports, the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, the Director of Tourism, and

poration of the City of Panaji (CCP) — the NFSF stated that local fishers from its affiliate, the All Goa Small Scale Responsible Fisheries Union (AGSSRFU), are being prevented from docking their canoes at Campal.

According to the complaint, officials from the Forest Department, Tourism Department, and the CCP have, since April 6, allegedly told fishers that their canoes appear 'dirty' and should not be stationed in the area. "What is dirty and beautiful

the beholder," wrote NFSF General Secretary, Dr Sebastiao Rodrigues, in the letter, firmly objecting to what he called the derogatory labelling of traditional fishing gear. He added that describing traditional canoes as 'dirty' was an insult to the age-old occupation of fishing in Goa.

Rodrigues further alleged that the space traditionally used for parking fishing canoes at Campal beach has steadily been reduced due to afforestation efforts by the Forest Department,

the Commissioner of the Cor- is based on subjective bias of which has planted casuarina and mangrove species in the area. He claimed this amounted to encroachment on the livelihood space of riverine fishers operating along the Mandovi.

Calling for immediate intervention, the NFSF urged all departments involved to remove the impediments and allow local fishers to continue their work without interference.

The Federation described the current situation as a violation of the rights of small-scale fishers and an attack on their traditional means of livelihood.

CALANGUTE: Calangute Police have arrested three men from Madhya Pradesh after busting an illegal online and mobile betting racket related to the ongoing T-20 Indian Premier League (IPL) cricket tournament. The arrests were made in the early hours of Tuesday during a raid at a flat in Baga.

The accused have been identified as Ankit Rathore, 34, of Bhopal and Badal, 32, and Ajay, 32, both from Sagar, Madhya Pradesh. According to police, a tip-off was received indicating that the trio were accepting bets on the IPL match between Kolkata Knight Riders and Gujarat Titans from Flat No 203, Arsh's Nest, Saldana Kayle Garden, Baga.

Following the information, a raid was conducted between 12.35 am and 2.45 am on Tuesday, during which the three were allegedly caught red-handed while placing and accepting bets on the match. Police seized one laptop and seven mobile phones, all together valued at approximately Rs 1.10 lakh.

WAIVER ON ADDITIONAL FEE FOR DELAYED FITNESS CERTIFICATE RENEWALS UNTIL MAY

PANJIM: The Goa Government has issued a notification stating that the additional fee for the delayed renewal of vehicle fitness certificates will not exceed Rs 1,000 until May 31. The relief measure applies to all categories of vehicles, including motorcycles, three-wheelers or quadricycles, light motor vehicles, medium goods or passenger vehicles, and heavy goods or passenger vehicles. The initiative aims to provide respite to vehicle owners experiencing delays in renewing their fitness certificates.

GOVT DISCONTINUES POULTRY FEED TRANSPORTATION SUBSIDY SCHEME

PANJIM: The Goa government has officially discontinued the "Transportation of Ready Poultry Feed from Outside the State of Goa" scheme, effective from April 1. This scheme had previously provided financial assistance to poultry farmers for the transport of ready-to-use poultry feed from other states into Goa.

'SAHAYATA' SCHEME FOR NGOS OFFICIALLY DENOTIFIED

PANJIM: The Government of Goa has officially denotified the 'Sahayata' scheme, also known as the Mukhyamantri Sahayata Nidhi Yojana. The scheme was designed to offer financial assistance to registered non-governmental organisations in the State. According to the notification issued, all pending applications under the scheme will be disposed of with immediate effect.

Goa's first veterinary college to start operations soon: CM

PANJIM: Chief Minister Pramod Sawant on Tuesday said that Goa College of Veterinary Sciences will commence operations in the upcoming academic year without fail.

During chairing a review meeting at Mantralaya at Porvorim, the Chief Minister directed officials to adhere to strict timelines and ensure timely coordination with the government of India.

The meeting also finalised plans for land transfer, infrastructure upgrades, staff recruitment, laboratories, and livestock farms. The college, proposed at Curti-Ponda, is set to offer a 60-seat BVSc and AH programme, pending approvals from the Veterinary Council of India and Goa University.
