India vows not to allow 'single drop of water' into Pakistan

Home Minister directs CMs to ensure no Pakistani stays in India beyond deadline

PTI, NEW DELHI: The government on Friday said it is working on a strategy to ensure not a single drop of water flows from India into Pakistan and asked chief ministers to ensure no Pakistani stays in the country beyond the stipulated deadline as security forces intensified anti-terror operations in the hunt for the

Pahalgam killers.

Amid increasing Indo-Pak tensions over the carnage in Pahalgam on Tuesday that left 26 civilians, mostly tourists dead, Indian military sources said there were incidents of small arm firing at some places on the LoC initiated by Pakistan on Thursday night.

3 PAKISTANIS ORDERED OUT OF GOA AS STATE RAMPS UP SURVEILLANCE

PANJIM: Three Pakistani nationals on short-term visas have been asked to leave Goa immediately while 17 Pakistani residents on long-

term have been put PAHALGAM under close surveillance by the State

security agencies. Chief Minister Pramod Sawant revealed this to the media after convening a high-level meeting at Mantralaya on Thursday with senior officials from the Home Department, Goa Police, Indian Navy, CISF and Coast Guard to review the presence and monitoring of Pakistani nationals in the State.

Beginning Saturday, the government will launch combing operations in areas with high migrant populations. Security checks will be intensified, particularly at transport hubs

such as railway stations, bus terminals and airports. All individuals living in informal settlements will be required to produce valid identification such as an Aadhaar card or voter ID. Those failing to do so will be detained for further verification.

"Foreign nationals overstaying their visas are being identified and action will be taken in accordance with the law," Sawant said. "Our priority is the safety and security of the state, especially in light of recent national developments."

In line with directives issued by the Union government following the Pahalgam terror attack, Goa Police will increase intelligence gathering, monitor social media activity, and conduct surprise security checks, or nakabandis, across the State, including tourist hotspots.

ED busts Rs 1,600 crore land grab seam in Goa

PANJIM: The Enforcement Directorate (ED) conducted searches in Goa on April 24 and 25 in connection with a major land scam being investigated under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA). As per an official statement, the scam — allegedly orchestrated by Rohan Harmalkar involved large-scale fraudulent land and tampered land records. transactions using forged documents



"The searches uncovered incrimi-

nating property documents, the current market value of which exceeds Rs 1,000 crore, including forged title deeds, indicating manipulation of land records and fraudulent transfers of high-value land parcels spanning several lakhs of square metres in prime tourist hotspots like Anjuna, Arpora, and Assagao in Bardez Taluka.

Govt under fire for handing over public properties to casinos

Residents, activists decry loss of public spaces, oppose 300% FAR in recreational zone

PANJIM: The State government is facing strong backlash for leasing out prime public properties in Panjim to casino operators.

Residents of the city are raising their voices against a proposal allowing a multi-storey structure with a Floor Area Ratio (FAR) of 300% in the area formerly known as Quarterdeck, which is officially designated as a recreational zone under Panjim's Outline Development Plan (ODP). The government had reclaimed the land after the previous lessee defaulted on rent, and has now leased it out again on a long-term basis to a private party. An adjacent plot has also been handed over to a casino operator.

Vasco Dias, a local resident, criticised the government's increasing reliance on casino revenues. "Earlier it was mining; now it's casinos. Public spaces are being taken over, parking is chaotic, and the Mandovi riverfront is choked. The government is completely under the influence of the casino lobby. Soon, Panjim residents will be pushed out and the city will be handed over to casino operators, turning it into a Las Vegas," he said. He also alleged that enhanced public parking spaces, developed at great expense, are now under private control, and voiced concerns that the Panjim-Betim ferry service might be curtailed to favour casino interests
