Mephedrone worth Rs 8.15 cr seized from cement godown in Mumbai; two held

MUMBAI: Mumbai police have seized mephedrone worth Rs 8.15 crore from a cement godown and arrested two persons, an official said on Monday. The police have arrested the accused, Sadik Salim Sheikh (28), a resident of Bandra, and Mira Road resident Siraj Panjwani (57) under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, the official said. He said Sheikh was caught in the Kajupada locality in Sakinaka last week, and mephedrone worth Rs 10 lakh was recovered from him. During interrogation, Sheikh said he had procured the contraband from Panjwani, who was subsequently nabbed from Mira Road, the official said. He said the accused informed the police that the drugs were made by one Kaluram Chowdhary at his cement godown, following which they raided the premises and recovered 4.5 kg of the contraband.

MP: 4-year-old girl raped in Jabalpur; case registered against unidentified person

JABALPUR: A four-year-old girl was raped by an unidentified person in Jabalpur in Madhya Pradesh, a police official said on Monday. The incident took place on the night of April 26 in a village under Majhgawa police station limits, he said. "The girl got ready to go for a wedding function and went out of the house. However, she soon went missing and her kin mounted a search. She was spotted just 200 metres away from the house at around 10pm. There were injuries on her private parts. She has been hospitalised in Jabalpur," Majhgawa police station in charge Dhannu Singh said.

WILL NOT CITE TERROR ATTACK TO PUSH FOR STATEHOOD RESTORATION: OMAR

PTI, JAMMU: Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah on Monday said he will not take advantage of the Pahalgam terror attack to press for restoration of the Union Territory's statehood. "The security in Jammu and Kashmir is not the responsibility of the UT's elected government. But I will not use this occasion to seek statehood. How can I push for statehood now? I do not believe in cheap politics. Should I have no value for the 26 lives lost and go to the Centre demanding statehood now?" Abdullah said, winding up the discussion on a resolution passed on the Pahalgam terror attack in the legislative assembly. He was referring to some members in the House who demanded statehood restoration to defeat terrorism in Jammu and Kashmir.

India bans 16 Pakistani YouTube channels over anti-India content

NEW DELHI: The government has blocked 16 Pakistani YouTube channels for allegedly disseminating "false. provocative and communally sensitive content" about India and has also strongly objected to the BBC's reportage on the Pahalgam attack, officials said on Monday. The government's move follows recommendations from the Ministry of Home Affairs in the wake of the April 22 terror attack in the upper reaches of the Kashmir resort town in which 26 people, mostly tourists, were killed. Besides, the Ministry of External Affairs will be monitoring reporting of the BBC, which termed terrorists as militants, officials said.

In a missive to BBC India head Jackie Martin, the MEA conveyed the country's strong sentiments over the reporting on the Pahalgam terror attack. It objected to the description of terrorists as "militants" in its reporting on the Pahalgam tragedy.

In one news flash, the BBC said, "Pakistan suspends visas for Indians after deadly Kashmir attack on tourists". This was flagged by the government as objectionable. "A formal letter has been sent to the BBC on terming terrorists as militants. The External Publicity Division of the MEA will be monitoring the reporting of the BBC," an official added.

The government has also blocked a message doing the rounds on WhatsApp terming it as "misleading". The message talked about the contribution of one rupee every day for "modernisation of the Indian Army and for soldiers who are injured or martyred in the war zone".

Maoist woman member surrenders before police in Jharkhand's Bokaro

BOKARO (JHARKHAND): A woman member of the banned CPI (Maoist) surrendered before police in Jharkhand's Bokaro district on Monday, officials said. Sunita Murmu, alias Leelmuni Murmu (22), had managed to escape during an encounter between Maoists and security personnel in Bokaro district on April 21, in which eight Naxals were killed. She surrendered in the presence of Bokaro SP Manoj Swargiary, CRPF commandant and other senior officials. "Sunita was with the Maoists during the encounter but managed to escape. After wandering in the forests for a few days, she decided to lay down arms under the state's surrender policy," Swargiary said. She will get all the benefits as per the provisions of the surrender policy, he said.

Two held with arms in outer Delhi: Police

NEW DELHI: Two men were arrested while on their way to extort money in outer Delhi's Narela Industrial Area, an official said on Monday. The accused were identified as Deepak alias Lala (28) and Lekhraj alias Lekhu (32), the official said, adding that two bullets were recovered from Deepak, while a pistol loaded with one bullet was recovered from Lekhraj. The police said the duo were arrested last Saturday when they were heading towards Bhorgarh in northwest Delhi on a motorcycle, with an intent to extort money, Deputy Commissioner of Police (Outernorth) Nidhin Valsan said. The DCP said they were intercepted near Ganda Nala, behind the Samshan Ghat at Shahpur Garhi in Narela, when they tried to flee upon seeing a police team patrolling the area.

Gambling den busted in Latur, 10 arrested

LATUR: Ten persons were arrested after a gambling den was busted in Latur, a police official said on Monday. The raid took place in Mitra Nagar on April 25, during which cash, mobile phones and gambling items cumulatively worth Rs 5.89 lakh were seized, he said. The 10 persons have been charged under Maharashtra Prevention of Gambling Act, the official added.

Delhi max temp 40.4 deg C, air quality remains poor

NEW DELHI: Delhi recorded a maximum temperature of 40.4 degrees Celsius on Monday, 1.4 degrees above the season's average, according to the India Meteorological Department (IMD). The minimum temperature settled at 23.2 degrees Celsius, slightly below the normal by 0.6 degrees. The relative humidity ranged between 43 per cent and 32 per cent during the day. Meanwhile, the city's air quality continued to remain in the 'poor' category for the seventh consecutive day. The average Air Quality Index (AQI) was recorded at 266 at 4 pm, according to the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB).
