

# Dempo SC edge past CD Salgaocar

**PANJIM:** Dempo Sports Club clinched a narrow 2-1 win over Clube de Salgaocar in the Goa Professional League Super League match played at Nagoa panchayat ground, on Tuesday.

Dempo SC broke the deadlock midway through the first half after Laxmanrao Rane was brought down just outside the box. Arnold Oliveira's curling free-kick forced a save from Sanij Bugde, but the rebound fell kindly to Nestor Dias, who made no mistake from close range.

Moments later, Dempo SC doubled their lead with a slick attacking move. Arnold rolled a precise cut-back to the edge of the box, where Beckham Dias took a clean first touch before smashing his shot past the Clube de Salgaocar goalkeeper to make it 2-0.

Clube de Salgaocar pulled one back in the second half after sustained pressure. Isac Zomuanpua lofted a teasing ball into the box for Royal Oliveira,

whose clever chest control beat the advancing goalkeeper. Though, Rahul Rodrigues cleared the initial danger off the line, Akeraj Martins reacted quickest to tap in the rebound.

Dempo SC piled on the pressure in the final third in search of an early breakthrough and nearly found one through Mevan Dias.

The forward pounced on a poor backpass from Clube de Salgaocar's Reezvon Fernandes intended for goalkeeper Sanij Bugde, who was caught off his line. Mevan's interception rolled dangerously toward goal, but Bugde recovered swiftly to smother the loose ball and spare his teammate's blushes.

At the other end, Clube de Salgaocar threatened through Brian Faria, who lofted a long ball into the path of Boinao Singh near the edge of the box. Boinao brought it down smartly and fired a shot on goal, but Dempo SC left-back Stenis was alert to the danger and made a crucial block to deny the effort.

Clube de Salgaocar pushed hard for the equaliser but the Dempo SC defence held firm to seal their side a 2-1 win.

### Women's tri-series: India beat South Africa by 15 runs

**COLOMBO:** Veteran off-spinner Sneha Rana grabbed her maiden five-for as Indian women beat South Africa by 15 runs to notch up their second successive win in the ODI tri-series, here, on Tuesday. India had beaten hosts Sri Lanka by nine wickets in the opening game on Sunday. Batting first, rising star Pratika Rawal's 78 and handy contributions from skipper Harmanpreet Kaur (41) and Jemimah Rodrigues (41) took India to a healthy 276 for 6 in 50 overs. In reply, opener Taznim Brits (109) scored a fine hundred but South Africa managed only 261 in 49.2 overs with off-spinner Rana getting 5 for 43 in 10 overs. India have been fined five per cent of their match fee for maintaining a slow over-rate. ### Shadman's century gives Bangladesh narrow lead in 2nd Test against Zimbabwe

**CHATTOGRAM (Bangladesh):** Opener Shadman Islam hit a century to give Bangladesh a narrow lead in the second and final test against Zimbabwe. Shadman made a career-best 120 to guide Bangladesh to 291-7 at stumps on Day 2, leading the visitors by 64 runs. But a late flurry of wickets prevented Bangladesh from taking complete control as Zimbabwe leg-spinner Vincent Masekesa claimed 3-44 on his debut. Masekesa's three-for included the wicket of Mominul Haque (33) and captain Najmul Hossain Shanto (23), who appeared set for a big knock. Veteran Mushfiqur Rahim was run out for 40 to give Zimbabwe further hope. Brief scores: Zimbabwe: 227 all out (Sean Williams 67, Nick Welch 54; Taijul Islam 6-60, Nayeem Hasan 2-42). Bangladesh: 291-7 (Shadman Islam 120, Mushfiqur Rahim 40; Vincent Masekesa 3-44).

### Nat Sciver-Brunt appointed captain of England women's cricket team

**LONDON:** Nat Sciver-Brunt has been appointed captain of the England women's cricket team. The England and Wales Cricket Board said Tuesday that Sciver-Brunt will replace Heather Knight, who stepped down after nine years in March as part of an overhaul following poor results. England was eliminated in the group stage of last year's T20 World Cup and lost the multi-format Ashes series to Australia 16-0 this year. The appointment of the all-rounder came after former England captain Charlotte Edwards succeeded Jon Lewis as head coach earlier this month. Sciver-Brunt, who has served as vice-captain the last three years, will captain the team in all three formats.

### Swiatek scrapes into adrid Open last eight

**MADRID:** Defending champion Iga Swiatek reached her fifth WTA 1000 quarter-final of the season with a 6-0, 6-7 (3/7), 6-4 victory over 13th-seeded Diana Shnaider at the Madrid Open on Tuesday. After a nationwide blackout cancelled the majority of play at the Caja Magica on Monday, power was restored at the venue on Tuesday morning, with matches commencing at 12pm. On the men's side, sixth-seeded Alex de Minaur defeated Canadian Denis Shapovalov 6-3, 7-6 (7/3) and awaits Stefanos Tsitsipas or Lorenzo Musetti in the round of 16. American 11th seed Tommy Paul overcame Russian 24th seed Karen Khachanov 6-3, 3-6, 6-2. Frances Tiafoe, the 16th seed, beat Alexandre Muller 6-3, 6-3 to book a fourth-round meeting with Novak Djokovic's conqueror, Matteo Arnaldi.

### Sudirman Cup: India bow out

**XIAMEN (China):** Struggling singles stars PV Sindhu and HS Prannoy disappointed yet again as India crashed out of the BWF Sudirman Cup Finals after losing 1-4 to formidable Indonesia in a group D match, here, Tuesday. Having lost to Denmark 1-4 in their opening match on Sunday, India needed to win Tuesday's contest to stay alive in the race for the knockout stage. With only two teams progressing from the group to the knock-out round, it was a must-win match for India but they were outclassed by their more fancied opponents. The poor form of their star singles players -- Prannoy and Sindhu -- did not help the team's cause.
