2 smugglers held with opium worth Rs 32.5 lakh in Gorakhpur

LUCKNOW: Two members of an inter-state narcotics gang have been arrested in Gorakhpur with 6.5 kg opium worth about Rs 32.5 lakh, officials said on Wednesday. A Special Task Force team of the Uttar Pradesh Police on Tuesday arrested Pawan Singh, a resident of Bareilly and Khushbu, from Bihar, an official statement said. During the interrogation, Singh revealed he was part of a gang which smuggled opium from Bihar and Jharkhand to other states. The kingpin of the gang has been identified as Netrapal.

Police inspector arrested for taking Rs 1 lakh bribe from school trustee

MUMBAI: The Anti Corruption Bureau has arrested a senior inspector of Shivaji Nagar police station here while allegedly accepting a bribe of Rs 1 lakh from a school trustee for initiating legal action in a dispute, an official said on Wednesday. Inspector Bapurao Madhukar Deshmukh allegedly demanded Rs 5 lakh from the complainant, a joint trustee of a school in Shivaji Nagar area, after a rival group in the school trust broke the lock of the school's main gate and tried to take it over illegally in August 2024, the complaint said. He requested Deshmukh to ensure the other group is stopped from entering the school until the Charity Commissioner passes an order on the dispute.

EC begins training new batch of poll officials from Bihar, Delhi, Haryana

NEW DELHI: The Election Commission on Wednesday launched a capacity-building programme for a new batch of field-level electoral officers from Bihar, Haryana and Delhi to enhance their practical experience in voter registration. As many as 371 grassroots election officials, including booth-level officers (BLOs) and electoral registration officers, will participate in the programme. In his inaugural address, Chief Election Commissioner Gyanesh Kumar said the BLOs will soon be issued standard Identity cards across India to facilitate their functioning during door-to-door verifications. The training is designed to enhance participants' practical understanding, especially in the areas of voter registration, form handling, and field-level implementation of electoral procedures, the poll authority said.

Depressed over 61 pc in 10th board, Kota student hangs himself

KOTA (RAJASTHAN): A student took his life after getting depressed over his CBSE Class 10 board exam results, the police said on Wednesday. The student, identified as Anikesh, hailing from Jehanabad, Bihar, was found hanging from a ceiling fan in his PG room here on Tuesday evening. Anikesh went into depression after the results were announced on Tuesday, in which he scored 61 per cent marks, way below his expectations. Anikesh's mother tried to console him but to no avail. When she stepped out for a while, he took the extreme step, a police officer said.

Telangana cop booked for illegal possession of bullets

HYDERABAD: A police officer arrested by the Telangana ACB in a bribery case has been booked for alleged illegal possession of bullets, officials have said. During searches by the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) at the home of the arrested officer - a deputy superintendent - 21 bullets and 69 empty cases (shells) were found, they said on Tuesday. A case has been registered following a complaint by an ACB official. The ACB on Monday said it arrested two police personnel - a deputy superintendent and an inspector - in Suryapet town for allegedly demanding a bribe from a complainant in exchange for an official favour.

3-year-old dies as fire engulfs house

THANE: A three-and-a-half-year-old boy died after a fire broke out in a house at Kasara in the district, police said. The incident took place around 8 on Tuesday morning. A fire broke out at the house of Datta Bule, located on the Vashala bypass road. Passersby, including some local boys who were on their way to play cricket, tried to douse the fire and rescue those who were inside. Krishna Bule, three-and-a-half-year old, could not escape from the house, said inspector Suresh Gavit of Kasara police station. His body was recovered later, the official said. The exact cause of the fire is yet to be ascertained.

'Gutter language': MP HC orders FIR against minister for slur on Col Qureshi

PTI, NEW DELHI/JABALPUR: The Jabalpur High Court on Wednesday ordered the registration of an FIR against Madhya Pradesh minister Vijay Shah who has attracted all-round flak for his purported controversial remarks targeting Colonel Sofiya Qureshi.

Shah hit the headlines after a video, which went viral, showed him purportedly making objectionable remarks against Col Qureshi, who was a prominent face of the armed forces along with Wing Commander Vyomika Singh during media briefings on Operation Sindoor.

After drawing severe condemnation, the MP tribal affairs minister said if anyone is hurt by his statement, he is ready to apologise ten times, adding that he respects Col Qureshi more than his sister.

Opposition parties slammed Shah for his "atrocious" and "most disgraceful" comments.

Congress general secretary in-charge communications Jairam Ramesh, in a post on X, asked, "Why has the PM not yet sacked the Madhya Pradesh minister who made the most disgraceful and totally unacceptable remarks against

J&K CM VISITS SHELLING AFFECTED AREAS, PROMISES HELP TO REBUILD HOUSES

PTI, SRINAGAR: Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah on Wednesday assured every possible help to rebuild homes of people affected by Pakistani shelling near the Line of Control, and said "the pain of my people is deeply personal". Abdullah, who visited the shelling affected areas of Uri, including Salamabad, Lagama, Bandi and Gingal in north Kashmir's Baramulla district, also said that he would take up the demand for building individual bunkers in these areas with the Centre. "It is our responsibility to provide you help from the government so that your houses are rebuilt," Abdullah, who was accompanied by his advisor Nasir Aslam Wani, MLA Uri Sajad Uri and senior officials of the district administration, said while interacting with the families whose houses were damaged by the shelling in Uri.

Col. Sofiya Qureshi? It is not enough for the National Commission on Women to deplore these remarks. "The minister's atrocious remarks reflect the

BJP's diseased mindset really," he said. The Madhya Pradesh High Court castigated Shah for passing "scurrilous" remarks and using

"language of the gutters" against Colonel Qureshi, and ordered the police to file an FIR against him on the charge of promoting enmity and hatred. It also said the armed forces were "perhaps the last institution in this country" that reflects integrity, discipline, sacrifice, selflessness, character, honour and indomitable courage.

Taking suo motu cognisance of the controversial statements, the high court's division bench of Justices Atul Shridharan and Anuradha Shukla or-

dered the police to register a first information report (FIR) against the minister. The court directed the police department to register the FIR by 6 pm on Wednesday, and also directed it to inform about it.

"The same must be done by today evening, failing which tomorrow, when the matter is listed, the court may contemplate proceeding against the Director General of Police of the State for contempt of this order," the court order said.

SC questions ban on LGBTQIA+ blood donors, seeks expert input

PTI, NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Wednesday directed the Centre to seek expert opinion for removing the bias in the medical guidelines that bar transpersons, gay men and sex workers from donating blood.

A bench of Justices Surya Kant and N Kotiswar Singh was acting on a batch of pleas against the blanket ban on blood donations by such persons from the LGBTQIA+ community. "Aren't we creating a kind of segregated group? By these methods, stigma, biases and prejudices are all enhanced," the bench told Centre's lawyer, additional solicitor general Aishwarya Bhati.

Bhati said the guidelines challenged in the petitions were issued by the Blood Transfusion Council of India which viewed these catego-

ries as "high-risk" and barred them from donating blood.

Justice Singh, however, said, "What is worrying me...are we going to brand all transgenders as risky and thus indirectly stigmatise these communities? Unless you can show with some medical evidence that there is some kind of link between transgenders and these diseases. You can't say that all transgenders are involved in these kinds of activities, even normal persons engage in such activities."

Justice Kant, on the other hand, noted the issue entailed the opinion of field experts.

"You please discuss with them so that as a community, they are not stigmatised. At the same time, all medical precautions can remain in force," the bench told Bhati. The pleas have chal-

lenged the 2017 Guidelines on Blood Donor Selection and Blood Donor Referral issued by the National Blood Transfusion Council and the National Aids Control Organisation under the aegis of the Central health ministry.

Stale food found at Railways' Kerala caterer; firm fined Rs 1 lakh

PTI, KOCHI: Stale and expired food materials were found on Wednesday at one of the caterers supplying food to the Railways, prompting it to penalise the catering firm by slapping it with a fine of Rs 1 lakh.

The Railways said the caterer was fined for lapses in cleanliness standards and the IRCTC was advised to take stringent action against it.

The action followed news reports of stale and expired food material being found at the catering unit - Brindavan Food Products - contracted by the Indian Railway Catering and Tourism Corporation (IRCTC) and Railways near Ernakulam station.

The reports also said that the caterer supplied food to the Vande Bharat trains as well.

According to a release issued by the Southern Railway, following the news reports, a high-level committee of senior officials was constituted to conduct an inquiry.

"The catering firm (M/s.

Brindavan Food Products) has been penalised Rs 1,00,000 by Railway for lapses reported in cleanliness standards, and IRCTC has been advised to take stringent action," the release said.

There was no immediate reaction from Brindavan.

The release further said that while the catering unit had an FSSAI certification licence, the Kochi Corporation authorities claimed that it was operating without a commercial licence and did not have a Sewage Treatment Plant (STP).

"Meanwhile, IRCTC has stated that arrangements have been made to ensure uninterrupted and hygienic food supply to passengers of Mail/Express trains and major corrective steps are also being taken to maintain the standards of hygiene and food quality," it said.

Earlier in the day, a state health department official said that the catering was also found to be disposing of food and other waste into a nearby canal in violation of the rules.
