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Goa's rock fans all set for Rockfest Mayhem

A rock music festival, titled Rockfest Mayhem, is bringing back the vibe of classic 1980s and 1990s era music to the Sunshine State. This was the era of denim-clad youth grooving to beat shows, dances, and rock concerts. Against the backdrop of Goa's cashew and mango fuelled summer landscape, Goa's live live bands were legendary. Home to some of India's finest bands, the state overflowed with raw talent, supported by devoted fans and numerous platforms that celebrated musical expression.

Among the many rock bands that emerged during this time, several carved out unique identities. Coastal Goa, bustling with tourists bands was a melting pot of live open-air shows where international and national artists performed alongside local talent. The affluence of Goa's youth – music, performance and showmanship was king-size and on open display.

It was in this golden era that '13AD', a band formed by college friends from Cochin, debuted in Goa. They made an unforgettable impression at a college festival in Farmagudi and at Goa's famed big fat Carnival. 13AD greatly redefined the rock and pop scene, displaying never seen before vocal camaraderie, high tech gadgets and faultless

sound synchronization, fans mobbed them refusing to leave dance floors - the love story of 13AD with Goa had begun.

By the mid-1990s, 13AD had risen to become one of India's most celebrated rock bands, performing across the country and abroad. They signed a record deal with Magnasound Records and released two acclaimed albums, 'Ground Zero' and 'Tough on the Streets'. Several years later, in 2008, the band reunited—refined, evolved, and ready to thrill once again in Goa. Featuring Eloy Isaacs on lead guitar and vocals, Paul KJ on bass and vocals, Jackson Aruja on keyboards, Anand Sreeraj on lead vocals, and Floyd Libera on drums, they are now set to perform at Rockfest Mayhem, an end-of-summer rock celebration in Goa.

Back in those days, noise curfews were unheard of and concerts often lasted beyond sunrise. Goa's own hard rock talents flourished alongside bands like 13AD. One such standout was Bad Blood, a band composed of local musicians who quickly gained fame with their pop-rock anthems. Always ahead of their time, they were crowd favorites wherever they performed. The band featured Nixon

on lead guitar, Anthony on bass, Frazer on keyboards, and Aurville on drums. Today, their legacy continues with Gautam's dynamic vocals and Prathamesh's rhythmic brilliance on the tabla. Former members Blasio Pinto and Andrew Ferrao are set to make a special cameo appearance, performing songs from an upcoming album that pays tribute to the heyday of Goan live rock.

Adding a new chapter to this legacy is the newest band on the scene—Kodop, which means "rock" in Konkani. Known for their intense fusion-metal sound, Kodop's performances electrify audiences. With Sunit on vocals, Samuel, Daniel M, and Daniel C on guitars, Ancil on bass, and Parth on drums, the band promises high-energy sets that will send mosh pits into a frenzy.

Organiser Armando from El Camino Events shares that Rockfest Mayhem is more than just a concert—it's a heartfelt musical tribute to the Indian Army. "The concert is dedicated to the brave, disciplined, resilient, and inspiring spirit of our patriotic Indian Army," he says.

Rockfest Mayhem will be held today, May 18, at 6 pm at Quinta de Valadares, Verna.

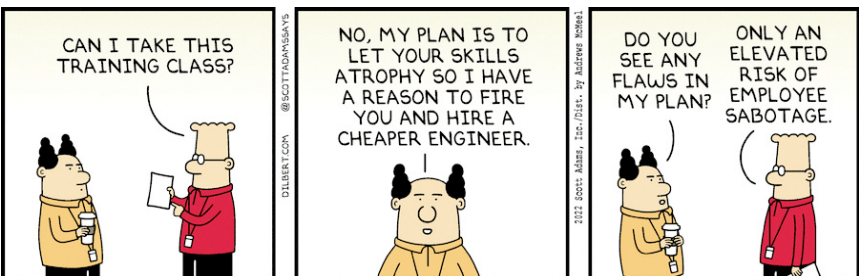
Mrinalini Harchandrai will be discussing his book, 'Rescuing a River Breeze'. This work of fiction follows

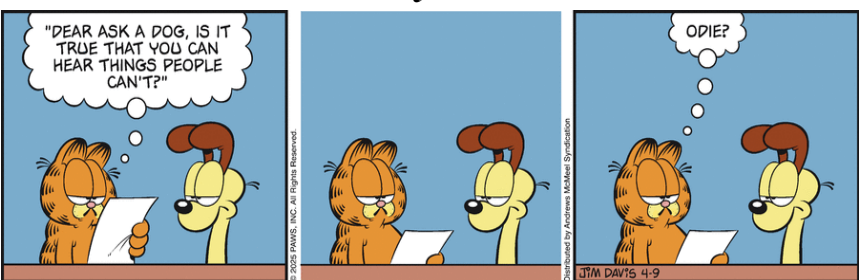

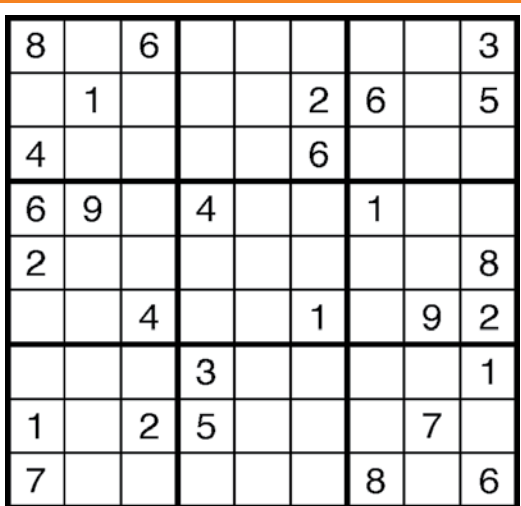
