Manchester City secure crucial win in Champions League chase

De Bruyne bids farewell as Marmoush, Silva and Gonzalez push City to third

AFP. MANCHESTER: Manchester City gave Kevin De Bruyne a fond farewell in a vital 3-1 win over Bournemouth on Tuesday to boost their chances of Champions League football next sea-

Goals from Omar Marmoush, Bernardo Silva and Nico Gonzalez lifted City up into third in the Premier League heading into Sunday's final round of matches.

Mateo Kovacic's red card 20 minutes from time could have given Bournemouth hope, but Lewis Cook was also sent off just minutes later for a lunge on Gonzalez.

There was further cause for celebration for City late on when Ballon d'Or winner Rodri made his first appearance since September as a substitute after suffering a serious knee injury.

City's victory means a point when they travel to Fulham on the final day will be enough to secure a top-five finish thanks to their much superior goal difference to that of sixthplaced Aston Villa.

Just three days on from the disappointment of losing the FA Cup final to Crystal Palace, City had to raise themselves on an emotional night at the Etihad in De Bruyne's final home match.

Earlier in the day City had unveiled a mosaic and named a road at the club's training


ground after the Belgian. De Bruyne, who won six over the 10 years."

Marmoush saw a penalty saved in City's defeat at Wembley on Saturday which ensured they will end the season without a major trophy for the first time since Pep Guardiola's debut season in 2016/17.

Missing out on the Champions League would arguably be an even bigger blow for a club who have not failed to qualify for Europe's elite competition

Marmoush made amends for his Wembley woe in stunning fashion when he crashed home a long-range effort off the inside of the post on 14 minutes.

The moment an expectant crowd had been waiting for looked set to appear moments later when Marmoush squared to give his captain an open goal.

Yet, De Bruyne could only

spoon the ball onto the crossbar from point-blank range much to his own disgust.

Guardiola's men did double their advantage before the break.

Ilkay Gundogan's clever reverse pass found Silva, who slammed home at the near post to spark jubilant celebrations from an animated Guar-

when a slack pass from Josko Gvardiol played in Evanilson and he was brought down by Kovacic, denying a clear goalscoring opportunity.

The red card hastened De Bruyne's goodbye as he was replaced by Gonzalez to a standing ovation.

The numbers were evened up just six minutes later as Cook caught Gonzalez on the shin with his studs.

The cheer for Rodri's return came close to matching De Bruyne's departure.

The loss of the Spanish midfielder has played a huge part in City's decline this season.

Gonzalez was bought in January to mitigate Rodri's absence but has struggled to hold down a place in Guardi-

Guardiola warns he'll quit if Man City squad too large

AFP. MANCHESTER: Pep Guardiola has said he could quit his position as Manchester City manager if he is given too large a squad next season as he can no longer bear to leave out large numbers of fit players from his team.

This season has seen City's unprecedented run of four successive top-flight English titles come to an end, while their defeat by Crystal Palace in last weekend's FA Cup final meant they will finish without a major trophy for the first time in eight years. Injuries have hit City hard this season but Guardiola, always in favour of a smaller group of players, insisted: "I said to the club I don't want that (a bigger squad).

"I don't want to leave five or six players in the freezer. I don't want that. I will quit. Make a shorter squad, I will stay.

"It's impossible for my soul to (tell) my players in the tribune that they cannot play."

The Spaniard added: "Now it happened to add players immediately. Maybe for three or four months we couldn't select 11 players. we didn't have defenders, it was so difficult. After, people come back but next season it cannot be like that.

"As a manager I cannot train 24 players and every time I select I have to have four, five, six, stay in Manchester at home because they cannot play. This is not going to happen. I said to the club I don't want that.'

Despite the injury problems suffered this season -- notably the lengthy absence of Rodri, who made his first appearance since September as a second-half substitute on Tuesday -- Guardiola said he would rather bolster his squad with academy players.


