Tom Cruise swept into Cannes on a steamroller of hype around 'Mission: Impossible - The Final Reckoning'. Director Christopher McQuarrie revealed that Cruise, who does his own stunts, took his risk-taking a little far during a shoot in South Africa and could have died. Cruise pushed himself to the point of exhaustion after climbing out on the wing of a stunt biplane that he was piloting alone. "He was laying on the wing of the plane. His arms were hanging over the front of the wing. We could not tell if he was conscious or not," said the US filmmaker. The movie received a 7.5-minute standing ovation after it screened out of competition, with Cruise and McQuarrie expressing their gratitude to audiences after the film.

ian has officially graduated from law school, marking the end of a six-year journey. The reality TV star and entrepreneur shared glimpses of a surprise private commencement ceremony. organised by family and friends, on her Instagram. Kardashian reflected on the challenging road she undertook, noting that

all her followers had been part of her journey. Her decision to pursue law stemmed from feeling "dumbfounded" after watching a video on X, which sparked a desire to fight for justice. One of her mentors highlighted the extraordinary effort behind her achievement, explaining that Kardashian committed 18 hours a week, 48 weeks a year, over six years, amounting to 5,184 hours of legal study. This was done alongside raising four children, managing multiple businesses, filming television shows, and advocating for criminal justice reform. Her graduation marks a significant milestone in her transition from celebrity to serious legal advocate.



# **CELEBRATING DECADES OF SEA TURTLE CONSERVATION**

ver the past few decades, scientists, volunteers, government agencies, NGOs, and local communities have worked in concert to restore sea turtle populations along India's coastline. Their combined efforts are finally vielding encouraging results. Nesting beaches once believed lost to development have begun to replenish, and hatchling survival rates have improved. However, understanding

challenges such as rising sand temperatures, shifting coastlines, and evolving human pressures remains critical. Sea turtles are ecologically significant, long-lived keystone

species that perform diverse roles across marine ecosystems. Their life cycle spans both terrestrial and marine environments. contributing to nutrient transfer and ecosystem connectivity. Nesting females deposit eggs on beaches, and unhatched eggs or eggshells provide organic enrichment to otherwise nutrient-poor coastal dune ecosystems, promoting vegetation growth and stabilising shorelines

In marine habitats, different species perform distinct but complementary functions. Green turtles are primarily herbivorous and graze on seagrasses. maintaining the health and productivity of seagrass meadows. Hawksbill turtles (Eretmochelys imbricata) regulate coral reef health by selectively feeding on sponges,



which compete with corals for space. Their foraging maintains coral diversity and resilience, supporting reef biodiversity.

Loggerhead turtles consume hard-shelled benthic organisms, contributing to prey population control and sediment turnover. Leatherback turtles (Dermochelys coriacea) specialise in gelatinous zooplankton, particularly jellyfish, mitigating the risk of jellyfish blooms that could otherwise disrupt fish

> diminished coastal resilience. Thus, sea turtles serve as ecological engineers and indicators of ocean health, reinforcing the need for sustained conservation efforts across their migratory ranges

In Goa, the Olive Ridley turtle is the most frequently observed nester, arriving quietly under the cover of night each year to lay eggs along the sandy shores. These annual nesting events are part of a delicate cycle that has persisted for generations, yet

recruitment and marine that cycle is under increasing pressure. food webs. Olive Ridley Further complicating their survival turtles (Lepidochelys is the growing presence of abandoned fishing gear, commonly known as ghost nets. Though not laid with harmful intent, ghost nets are among the most dangerous forms of marine debris. Once entangled, sea turtles like the Olive Ridley can become trapped for days or even weeks. This restricts their movement, making it difficult to surface for air, feed, or migrate often leading to starvation.

Even if they survive, entangled turtles can suffer deep lacerations, infections, and flipper damage, which can alter their natural behaviors such as diving, foraging, or nesting. In

Goa, turtles are brought in by local fishermen and beachgoers that are some so tightly bound in netting that flippers swell or begin to rot, requiring weeks of treatment. Ghost nets are a shared challenge that calls for shared solutions, ranging from improved fishing gear management and reporting lost nets, to regular beach clean-ups and training rescue responders. Recognising these nets as a hazard is not a mistake that allows communities, fishers, and conservationists to work LAND S together to reduce their impact, ensuring a safer future for sea
