CONSUL GENERAL OF RUSSIA IN MUMBAI VISITS **BITS PILANI GOA CAMPUS**



BITS Pilani, K K Birla Goa Campus had the privilege of hosting HE Ivan Fetisov, Consul General of Russia in Mumbai, along with Matvei Fetisov, Vice Consul, and accompanying officials.

During their visit, the delegation was welcomed by and engaged in discussions with the Goa campus Director Prof Suman Kundu, Prof Srikanth Mutnuri, (University-Wide) Dean, International Programmes and Collaboration Division (IPCD), Prof Rajesh Mehrotra, Current Associate Dean, IPCD, Prof Rudra Prasad Pradhan (incoming Associate Dean, IPCD) at Goa Campus. The delegation also interacted with heads

of departments, associate deans of various divisions, and senior faculty members of the institute. The discussions focused around exploring paths for academic and research collaborations and student/ faculty exchange programs between BITS Pilani and leading Russian universities.

The delegates also explored the campus, visiting several state-of-the-art laboratories and research facilities and expressed their appreciation for the Institute's strong focus on innovation, interdisciplinary research, and international partnerships.

State-level Summer School for school teachers at MES Vasant Joshi College

ES Vasant Joshi College of Arts & Commerce, Zuarinagar, Goa, in collaboration with its Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and Institution's Innovation Council (IIC), successfully organised a State-Level Summer School on Research Methodology in Social Sciences. Funded by the Government of Goa through the Goa State Research Foundation (GSRF), the academic event was designed for high school and higher secondary school teachers across the state

A total of 29 teachers from various parts of Goa participated in this intensive five-day training programme. The Summer School featured 17 resource persons from MES Vasant Joshi College, who led sessions covering a broad range of topics. The event commenced with foundational sessions on research basics. Dr Ashish M Joshi provided an introduction to research, followed by Dr Sonal Thakker, who discussed the relevance of research in shaping social policy. Dr Savia Mendes guided participants on selecting effective and meaningful research topics, while Dr Freda Cota e Pereira offered valuable strategies for conducting literature reviews. Dr Rajesh Shetgaokar concluded the day with insights into identifying research gaps and choosing appropriate methodologies.

Day 2 focused on data. Dr Deepak Gosavi introduced various types and sources of data, while Dr Brian Pacheco addressed key ethical considerations in conducting research. Suraj Tuvekar delivered two sessions on processing primary data and locating freely available secondary data, also highlighting tools such as Excel and SPSS to address issues like missing data and formatting inconsistencies.

Day 3 continued with data analysis, featuring a session on inferential statistics, hypothesis testing, and interpretation by assistant professor



Vasant Pednekar. Day 4 further delved into data analysis, with Dr Yasser Hussain conducting two sessions on regression analysis, providing hands-on experience with statistical software and practical guidance on interpreting outputs for research applications. Later, assistant professor Narendra Gaonkar conducted two sessions on the preparation of field survey questionnaires and reference management.

On Day 5, the focus shifted to research writing. Dr Kirti Tyagi conducted a session on writing PhD proposals, while Prof Cosma Fernandes explored research methodologies in language studies. Dr Savio Fernandes shared insights into research in sports. The final sessions on manuscript preparation were led by Dr Sancheliana Faria and Dr Rohita Kamat.A Dr Yasser Hussain served as the compere for the valedictory function. Dr Sancheliana Faria, head of the Department of Commerce and Coordinator of the Summer School, introduced the chief guest, Prof Dr Manoj S Kamat, principal of DCT's Srinivasa Sinai Dempo College of Commerce and Economics, Goa. Assistant professor Nishita Salgaonkar presented a detailed report summarising the week-long academic engagement. The event concluded with a vote of thanks by assistant professor Narendra Gaonkar, Co-coordinator of the Summer School.


