

NB.1.8.1, LF.7 variants of Covid detected in India: INSACOG data

NEW DELHI: One case of the newly emerging COVID-19 variant NB.1.8.1 and four instances of the LF.7 type have been detected in India, according to INSACOG data. As of May 2025, the World Health Organization (WHO) classifies LF.7 and NB.1.8 subvariants as Variants Under Monitoring, not as Variants of Concern or Variants of Interest. But these are the variants that are reportedly driving the rise in Covid cases in China and parts of Asia. According to data from the Indian SARS-CoV-2 Genomics Consortium (INSACOG), one case of NB.1.8.1 was identified in April in Tamil Nadu and four cases of LF.7 were detected in Gujarat in May. In India, the most common variant remains JN.1, comprising 53% of samples tested, followed by BA.2 (26%) and other Omicron sublineages (20%).

Delhi Police arrests Gogi gang sharpshooter wanted for murder in Rajasthan after encounter

NEW DELHI: A sharpshooter of the Jitender Gogi gang wanted in a murder case in Rajasthan was arrested following a brief exchange of fire in Delhi's Rohini area, an official said on Saturday. Based on a tip-off, the accused, 32-year-old Vikas alias Saka was intercepted near Barwala Chowk on Friday night based. When signalled to stop, he opened fire at the police team and was shot in the leg in retaliatory fire before being arrested, he said. "Vikas was wanted in a May 2025 murder case in Khairthal Tijara area of Rajasthan, where he and his associates allegedly strangled and mutilated a man from their native village Bupania in Jhajjar, Haryana, before burning the body to destroy evidence," Deputy Commissioner of Police (Special Cell) Amit Kaushik said. They even severed the man's hand to eliminate a tattoo that could aid identification, the officer said, adding that a case is registered at Kishangarh Bans police station, Rajasthan.

Truck driver hung upside down, beaten in Rajasthan for cement theft

JAIPUR: A man was hung upside down with a rope from an earthmover in Beawar district and beaten over the suspicion of cement theft, police on Saturday said. The incident, which was captured in a video and attracted a strong condemnation from Congress, led to the arrest of a man under section 170 of BNSS (arrest to prevent commission of cognizable offences). Sub-Inspector posted at the Raipur Police Station (Beawar), said the video showed accused Tejpal Singh striking the man whose legs were tied to the bucket loader of the earthmover with a rope.

Two Maoists killed in gunfight in Jharkhand

PTI, LATEHAR: Two Maoists, including JJMP supreme Pappu Lohra were killed in a gunfight with security forces in Jharkhand's Latehar district on Saturday morning, police said. A Maoist and a police personnel were also injured in the encounter. Awadh Singh, the injured policeman, was airlifted to Ranchi for better medical care, officials added. Jharkhand Jan Mukti Parishad (JJMP) chief Lohra, who was carrying a bounty of Rs 10 lakh on his head, and Prabhat Ganju, the sub-zonal commander of the organisation who carried a reward of Rs 5 lakh, were killed during the operation, police said. The joint operation was carried out by the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) and Jharkhand Police in Icharbar forest area under Latehar police station limits, a senior officer said.

Alleged fraudster Angad Chandhok deported from US

PTI, NEW DELHI: Alleged fraudster Angad Singh Chandhok, who had an Interpol Red Notice against him, was deported from the US on Saturday in an operation "closely coordinated" by the CBI, officials said. He was brought to the Indira Gandhi International Airport where the CBI detained him and later put him under arrest, they said. He was produced before a special court which sent him to judicial custody. Chandhok, who was wanted in a case of allegedly cheating Union Bank of India in 2014, had managed to escape to the US in 2016 with his family members to escape from the legal proceedings. Pak violated spirit of goodwill and friendship: Misri

PTI, NEW DELHI: India's decision to put the Indus Waters Treaty in abeyance is only a natural outcome of Pakistan putting in abeyance the principles, including friendship and goodwill, guiding the agreement, the Ministry of External Affairs has told a parliamentary committee. The MEA has said changes in the ground situation, including engineering techniques, climate change and melting of glaciers, have made a renegotiation of the treaty's terms imperative, a line that delegations visiting world capitals will also take in defending India's decision to put the agreement in abeyance after the horrific Pahalgam terror attack, sources said. Besides, Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri has noted in his briefing that the 1960 treaty in its preamble says that it is concluded in a "spirit of goodwill, and friendship". All these principles have in effect been held in abeyance by Pakistan, he added. Misri had recently briefed a par-

liamentary committee on Indian actions, including Operation Sindoor, following the April 22 terror strike in Pahalgam, and has spoken to all seven multi-party delegations visiting 33 countries and the European Union to explain India's position following the conflict with Pakistan. The MEA said that Pakistan had been stonewalling India's requests for a government-to-government negotiation over the treaty due to changes in the ground situation since it was signed. There is a compelling case for the treaty to be renegotiated to make it fit for the 21st century, as it was based on the engineering techniques of

the 1950s and early 1960s, the MEA has said. Other fundamental changes include climate change, melting of glaciers, the variation in quantities of water available in the rivers and demographics. These, besides a quest for clean energy, mandate renegotiations for the distribution of rights and obligations under the treaty. It added, "The treaty in its preamble says that it is concluded in a spirit of goodwill, and friendship. All these principles have in effect been held in abeyance by Pakistan. The unrelenting cross-border terrorism from Pakistan interferes with our ability to exploit the treaty as per its provisions." The MEA said it is only natural and well within India's right to hold the treaty in abeyance when the fundamental ground situations have changed completely. Drawing a red line, Prime Minister Modi had recently said that blood and water can not flow together.

Rahul visits areas affected by shelling in Poonch

PTI, POONCH (J-K): Reaching out to the people affected by Pakistani shelling in the worst-hit Poonch, Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Saturday said the border district in Jammu and Kashmir embodies the "harmony, unity and patriotism of Hindustan" and those trying to divide the country will never succeed in their design. The Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha spent nearly two hours with the affected people, including the families who lost their members in the cross-border attacks between May 7 and May 10. He vis-

ited shelling-hit Gurdwara Singh Sabha, temple Geeta Bhawan and Madrassa Zia-ul-Uloom, besides interacting with the students at the Christ High School. "It is a big tragedy. Many people lost their lives. They (Pakistan army) have hit civilian targets directly. I talked to the people and tried to understand their problems," Gandhi told reporters. "I stand strongly with the victim families — I will definitely raise their demands and issues at the national level," he said. Poonch faced the brunt of the Pakistani shelling that left 28 people dead and 70 injured. "Damaged houses, scattered belongings, moist eyes and painful stories of losing loved ones — these patriotic families bear the biggest burden of war with courage and dignity every time. Salute to their courage," Gandhi said on X. The Congress leader asserted that the nation would respond resolutely to any attempts to harm its unity. "Today, I visited a temple, gurdwara and madrassa affected by Pakistani attacks in Poonch. People of every religion live together here and share each other's pain. This is Poonch - this is Hindustan, where there is harmony, unity and patriotism," Gandhi said in another Hindi post on X after the visit. "Those who try to divide and break us will never succeed - we will always remain united and respond strongly. Jai Hind," Gandhi said in his post. The Congress leader interacted with students of Christ school who lost two of their mates — 12-year-old twins Zain Ali and Urwa Fatima — to Pakistani shelling. "Don't worry, everything will come back to normal," he consoled the children while encouraging them to "study hard, play hard and make lots of friends".
