filed by the Girls Hostel Secretary of Goa Dental College, police have registered a case against the accused. Police stated that the

accused committed a serious breach of privacy, representing a significant violation of the law, moral standards, and the safety and dignity of the female residents.

Demolishes former sarpanch's structure in open space

PONDA: The Curti-Khandepar Panchavat continued its ongoing drive against illegal encroachments on panchavat open spaces, with a bulldozer demolishing an unauthorised structure belonging to former sarpanch Gurudas Khedekar on Monday.

The encroached structure—a shed—was located in the same panchayat open area at Zingadimaal, Curti, where the Panchayat had previously demolished various illegal constructions belonging to Damu Naik, including a chicken shop, rented rooms, and a workshop.

On discovering the structure built by the former sarpanch, the panchayat body, led by Sarpanch Nilkant Naik and panch Bhika Kerkar, immediately moved to demolish it.

Citizens demand government intervention as unsafe buildings collapse in Margao

MARGAO: After two consecutive incidents of partial building collapses in the past two days, serious concerns have been raised about public safety in Margao.

Despite warnings and directions from authorities, the civic body appears unable to act effectively, prompting residents to demand immediate government intervention.

The first collapse occurred near Gandhi Market, followed by another at the Cine Lata theatre premises. In both cases, falling debris damaged parked vehicles, highlighting the imminent threat these dilapidated structures pose to life and property.

Citizens are alarmed that, despite the urgency, the Margao Municipal Council (MMC) has failed to act

Responding to the situation, Margao MLA Digambar Kamat emphasized that these buildings are privately owned and that the responsibility for demolishing unsafe structures lies with the respective owners. Nevertheless, citizens argue that public safety cannot be left solely to private discretion and are calling

for urgent and direct government action.

Cedrick Fernandes, a concerned citizen, said, We cannot wait for someone to get injured or worse before action is taken. These buildings have been declared unsafe long ago. The authorities must take proactive steps rather than passing the buck."

Sandanand Naik, another resident and shop owner near Gandhi Market, added, "Every day we open our shops with fear. Who will be responsible if a customer or a passerby gets hurt? This is not just negligence-it's endangering lives. The government must act now and enforce the demolitions."

With the monsoon fast approaching, residents fear the risk of further collapses and demand that the government step in before tragedy strikes.
