

Will Gaude's googly speed up cabinet reshuffle?

Minister's corruption charge seen as a desperate bid to avoid political exit

PANJIM: Just as Goa was cooling off under surprise pre-monsoon showers, Art and Culture Minister Govind Gaude brought the political heat right back with an unexpected googly aimed at the Department of Tribal Welfare — currently under none other than Chief Minister Pramod Sawant. The charge? Corruption. The reaction? Predictably electric.

Even as the Chief Minister's team scrambled into damage control mode, the opposition parties smelt blood and went straight for the jugular. It wasn't the first time Gaude had tossed a grenade into the government's garden par-

ty, but this time, political observers believe it's not just about righteous rage — it may be the prelude to a much-anticipated cabinet reshuffle.

For over two years now, the buzz of a reshuffle has lingered, and Gaude's name has been a constant in the list of likely casualties. But the CM has played his cards close to the chest and with a

poker face to match. The reshuffle, he says, will happen 'at the right time'.

Ironically, Gaude himself has weathered a few storms in recent memory. Last year, he faced the heat when Speaker Ramesh Tawadkar accused the Directorate of Art and Culture of pocketing Rs 26 lakh for cultural events that allegedly never saw the light of day.

Gaude, for his part, passed the buck — insisting the funds went to NGOs and Self-Help Groups.

Fast forward to March this year, and Gaude was again in the spotlight, ruffling feathers when he casually dismissed the role of the BJP's alliance partner. His off-script remark came right after the CM confidently declared that the

BJP would contest from Priol in 2027. The party brass — especially BJP State President Damodar Naik — wasn't amused and promptly reminded Gaude about discipline.

Now, Gaude's latest allegation has opened a new can of worms. AICC Goa in-charge Manikrao Thakare called it a 'clear sign' of BJP's internal power struggle and said the root of it all is money. "This government thrives on corruption. Accidents are up, tourism is down, and law and order is in a nosedive. Ministers are more focused on personal fortunes than public welfare," Thakare fired.

PTI, IMPHAL: Two central offices were locked in Imphal as the students' wing of the COCOMI, an umbrella body of Meitei groups, protested the concealing of the State's name from a government bus in Gwal-

tabi last week. Protestors seeking an apology from Manipur Governor Ajay Kumar Bhalla made him travel about 7 km in a chopper to reach the Raj Bhavan from Imphal's Tulihal Airport on Monday.

Hundreds of protestors had formed a human chain from the airport's departure gate to the Keishampat Junction near the Raj Bhavan.

NEW DELHI: India has recorded a notable increase in Covid infections, with 753 new cases reported in the past week. The total number of active cases has now reached 1010, as per data released by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare on May 27. Among the affected states, Kerala, Maharashtra and Delhi lead with the highest number of active cases.

Kerala continues to report the highest number of active cases, with 335 new infections recorded over the past week.

Above-normal rainfall likely in June: IMD

PTI, NEW DELHI: India is likely to receive above-normal rainfall in June, which is expected to keep maximum temperatures in check in most parts of the country, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) said on Tuesday.

M Ravichandran, Secretary in the Ministry of Earth Sciences, said rainfall across the country during June is likely to be more than 108 per cent of the long-period average of 166.9 mm.

"During June, most of the country is expected to receive normal to above-normal rainfall. However, some southern parts of peninsular India and parts of northwest and northeast India may receive below-normal rain," he said.

IMD Director General Mrutyunjay Mohapatra said that due to this expected good rainfall, most parts of the country may experience normal to below-normal maximum temperatures, except for many areas in Northwest and Northeast India.

Above-normal minimum temperatures are likely over most parts of the country, he said.

Treacherous Pilgao roads swing focus back on mining operations

Villagers halt ore trucks after road turns into muddy carriageway, spelling danger for motorists

PILGAO: The contentious route used by mining trucks in Pilgao was in the news for weeks as villagers stood firm in opposition before a compromise could be thrashed out.

Now, a few months since the last agitation, the same route is in the news again in the monsoon, as the mining trucks working for Sesa Vedanta have turned the road into a treacherous carriageway of mud and slush where two-wheelers are in real danger of accidents because of skidding.

This threat to local riders led to chaos at the main junction in Pilgao on Monday, as a tense standoff between the Pilgao village panchayat and the mining giant resulted in a temporary halt to transport operations.

Around 2 pm, the five-member Pilgao Panchayat led by Swapnil Phadte raised an alarm over deteriorating road conditions and forced the mining trucks to stop operating. The protesters

alleged that they were forced to take the step after repeated warnings to the company had been ignored.

“For several days, on the demand of the people, we have been informing the mining company that the main road is getting muddy and slippery and there may be accidents, but they are ignoring this. A major accident could have happened on Monday when a car skidded, after which we decided to stop ore transport on the main road
