"We do hereby take into cognisance the charges," the three-judge ICT-BD bench led by Justice Golam Mortuza Majumdar said after a prosecution team formally accused them of attempting to tame the protests using brutal force.

The tribunal, after hearing a 145-page excerpt during the indictment proceedings, simultaneously issued a fresh arrest warrant against Hasina and then home minister Asaduzzaman Khan Kamal.

## Coinbase suffers massive data breach affecting over 69,000 customers

Security failure could cost company \$400 mn; hackers bribed call centre agents in India to leak sensitive user data

AGENCIES, NEW DELHI: Cryptocurrency exchange Coinbase recently announced that it had suffered a massive data breach in January this year, affecting over 69.000 customers—the crypto giant's biggest security failure till date.

The data breach, which could cost the company a whopping \$400 million, reportedly took place after hackers bribed call . centre agents in India to leak sensitive data about users.

According to a report by Fortune, Coinbase's customer care was handled by a business process outsourcing (BPO) firm named TaskUs, which offered the

MARGAO: Terming the Centre-backed Rs 310 crore river dredging plan as environmental and social disaster in the making, Goa Forward Party (GFP) president Vijai Sardesai criticised the recently approved Detailed Project Report (DPR) for capital dredging of the Mandovi, Zuari, and Cumbarjua riv-

ers and vowed not to allow Goa to be transformed into a logistics corridor for outsiders.

Speaking after the GFP's State Executive Committee meeting, he pledged to stand with the people to safeguard Goa's rivers.

Sardesai said the Inland Waterways Authoritv of India (IWAI)'s plan involves removing 6.5

million cubic metres of riverbed, posing a direct threat to traditional fishing communities and Goa's riverine ecology. He warned that the move is part of a larger agenda to turn the State into a "coal corridor" under the guise of promoting inland waterways for passenger transport.
