# India seek third successive win over Thailand in friendly clash

PTI, PATHUM THANI (Thailand): India will look to draw confidence from their recent victories and the form of veteran striker Sunil Chhetri as they face Thailand in an international friendly at Thammasat Stadium on Wednesday, at 6 pm.

Thailand are one of India's most frequent continental opponents outside South Asia, with a rivalry stretching across major tournaments including the Asian Games, Asian Cup, King's Cup, and Nehru Cup.

Since their first meeting at the 1962 Asian Games in Jakarta won 4-1 by India—the sides have clashed 26 times. Thailand have won 12, India seven, and seven matches have ended in draws.

India, however, claimed the spoils in their last two encounters in 2019: a stunning 4-1 triumph in the AFC Asian Cup in Abu Dhabi and a 1-0 win in the King's Cup on Thai soil.

Chhetri, who netted twice in the Asian Cup fixture, recalled the significance of that result.

"That was a long time ago, but I remember how outstanding the team was that day," he said via an AIFF press release. "It showed what we can achieve when we work hard. Thailand were probably better than us on paper, but we dominated."

The 40-year-old striker is

among seven players from India's 2019 Asian Cup squad in the current line-up, alongside Amrinder Singh, Vishal Kaith, Sandesh Jhingan, Subhasish Bose, Ashique Kuruniyan and Udanta Singh. Thailand, by contrast, retain only two players from that match—captain Chanathip Songkrasin and forward Supachai Chaided.

A win would be a significant morale boost for India ahead of their crucial AFC Asian Cup qualifying match against Hong Kong on 10 June in Kowloon. Thailand are also preparing for their final-round

"It's a good game for both teams

as we're in a similar position," said India head coach Manolo Marquez at the pre-match press conference. "But the context is very different from 2019. Both sides have changed significantly since then."

Marquez added, "We're here to win. If we can repeat that scoreline, it would be great."

India are currently ranked 127th in the FIFA standings, while Thailand sit at 99th, having risen 14 spots since Japanese coach Masatada Ishii took charge in December 2023. Under Ishii, they reached the round of 16 at the Asian Cup, won the King's Cup,

and finished runners-up in the ASEAN Championship.

"We lost the last two games against India, but that was a different team with a different coach," said Ishii. "Now, we're focused on winning and using this game as preparation for Turkmenistan."

Thailand boast several overseas-based players including midfielders Jaroensak Wonggorn (Cerezo Osaka) and Ekanit Panya (Ehime FC), and defender Elias Dolah (Bali United). Other notable names include experienced playmaker Chanathip Songkrasin (70 caps), forward Supachai Chaided, midfielder Ben Davis, and towering defender Marco Ballini.


