

Salgaocar Institute students embark on culinary and cultural exchange programme in Portugal

Twelve students and a faculty Chef Syam Raj from VM Salgaocar Institute of International Hospitality Education (VMSIHE), Goa, recently returned from a comprehensive four-week Portuguese Exchange Programme that offered them immersive exposure in Portuguese culinary arts, hospitality operations, and cultural experiences. The programme was organised by Turismo de Portugal. The initiative aimed to broaden students' global perspectives and enhance their professional skills by collaborating with prestigious hospitality institutions across Portugal.

A journey through Portugal's culinary and hospitality landscape over four immersive weeks in Portugal, students undertook specialised training at hospitality and tourism schools across the country. In Lisbon, at the Escola de Hotelaria e Turismo de Lisboa, they participated in culinary workshops highlighting Portuguese staples such as Bacalhau and octopus, explored bustling local markets, toured the iconic Ritz Hotel, and showcased Indian cuisine in a cross-cultural culinary event. In Coimbra, they continued their learning at the local hospitality school, attending cookery sessions with Chef Emanuel Faria, a wine workshop, and a masterclass on Bairrada sparkling wine. They

The final week in Porto offered further hands-on experience at Escola de Hotelaria e Turismo do Porto, including baking and cookery sessions on regional favourites like Pastel de Nata and Bacalhau. They also explored Gaia's historic Port wine cellars, attended a Barista workshop, and enjoyed a guided

NEW MUSIC ACADEMIC YEAR INAUGURATED AT GUIRIM


