76 army personnel airlifted from landslide-hit Chaten in Sikkim

PTI, GANGTOK: At least 76 army personnel were on Saturday airlifted from Chaten

in north Sikkim where road connectivity has been snapped due to multiple landslides triggered by heavy rain, officials said.

This marks the "completion of coordinated evacuation efforts", which included the rescue of all stranded tourists earlier, they said.

"Altogether 76 army personnel were airlifted by three MI-17 helicopters. The air evacuation operation from Chaten has concluded today with the helicopters transporting army personnel from Chaten to Pakyong Greenfield Airport," an official said.

Heavy rain had triggered multiple landslides in north Sikkim recently, disrupting road connectivity in the region.

Helicopter carrying pilgrims crash-lands, all 6 onboard safe

PTI, RUDRAPRAYAG: Five pilgrims and a pilot onboard a helicopter had a narrow escape when the aircraft on its way to Kedarnath made an emergency landing on the highway in Rudraprayag district on Saturday after developing a technical snag during take-off, officials said.

KEDARNATH MISHAP

The pilot sustained minor injuries and was rushed to a hospital, they said.

Videos on social media showed the Kestrel Aviation helicopter standing in the middle of the highway, dangerously close to populated buildings and with a parked car damaged by its tail rotor.

The helicopter had flown from Badasu base for Kedarnath when it made the emergency landing shortly after take-off on the main road just below the highway near Sirsi following a technical snag, the officials said.

Six people onboard the helicopter including the pilot had a close call.

Kedarnath heli service nodal officer Rahul Chaubey said the incident did not affect the heli shut-

from the highway and unblocking it can take some time.

The Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) said Kestrel Aviation's AW119 (Reg. VT-RNK) helicopter, piloted by Capt R P S Sodhi, experienced a hard landing on the road adjacent to the Barasu helipad.

According to initial inputs, shortly after take-off from the helipad, the pilot reported a suspected issue with the collective control getting stuck. In response, he executed a controlled force landing on the road near the helipad.

All passengers are safe and unharmed, it said. The pilot has been taken to hospital for evaluation due to complaints of backache.

The helicopter took off at 12.52 pm from Badasu (Sersi) helipad and landed immediately on the main road just below the helipad.

A team is being sent to the spot for onsite assessment, the DGCA said.

It is for the fourth time in a month that pilgrims travelling by air on the Char Dham Yatra route had a close shave.

Five Naxalites gunned down in encounters in Chhattisgarh

PTI, BIJAPUR: Five Naxalites were killed in two encounters with security forces in an ongoing operation in the Indravati National Park area of Chhattisgarh's Bijapur district, police said on Saturday.

With the latest casualties, seven Naxalites, including top leaders Sudhakar and Bhaskar, were neutralised in the operation in the last three days, they said.

"Security forces have recovered the bodies of seven Maoists during the ongoing anti-Naxal operations in the Indravati National Park area of the district," a senior police official said.

On Saturday, two bodies were recovered following a gunfight, while three

were found after the exchange of fire on the intervening night of Friday and Saturday, he said.

The official said the operation involving personnel from the state police's Special Task Force (STF) and District Reserve Guard (DRG) as well as the CRPF's specialised unit COBRA, was launched on June 4 based on input about the presence of Maoist leader Sudhakar, Telangana State Committee member Bandi Prakash, Dandakaranya Special Zonal Committee (DKSZC) member Pappa Rao, and a few other armed cadres.

On Friday, security forces neutralised Bhaskar alias Mailarapu Adelli, a special zonal committee (SZC) member of the Telangana State Committee (TSC) of

Maoists who carried a reward of Rs 45 lakh in Chhattisgarh and Telangana, and Maoists' central committee member Narasimha Chalam alias Sudhakar, who had a bounty of Rs 40 lakh in Chhattisgarh, was killed on Thursday, he said.

The official said the identity of five more killed Naxalites, two of them women, is yet to be ascertained.

A huge cache of arms and ammunition, including two AK-47 rifles, has been seized in the operation, he said, adding that search and area domination operations were underway in the surrounding forested terrain to track remaining Maoist cadres and ensure complete sanitisation of the region.

Hoax bomb threat at Mangaluru hospital; PG student held

PTI, MANGALURU: A medical student was taken into custody on Saturday by the Ullal police on suspicion of making a hoax call, implying a bomb threat to her medical college and hospital on June 4, police said.

The arrested post graduate student allegedly placed the call to avoid attending a seminar. According to the police, the bomb scare prompted a massive security deployment at a private hospital in Deralakatte earlier this week.

On 4 June, at around 8.45 am, the hospital received five bomb threat calls from an unidentified caller claiming that ex-

plosives had been planted on the premises. The calls triggered panic among doctors, hospital staff, and patients, prompting the authorities to initiate an extensive security sweep.

Nearly 30 personnel, including teams from the Bomb Disposal Squad and the Dog Squad, were deployed.

Illegal arms smuggling racket busted in Punjab

PTI, CHANDIGARH: Punjab Police on Saturday said it has busted an illegal arms smuggling racket with the arrest of three people and recovery of six sophisticated foreign-made weapons, smuggled from across the border.

Director General of Police (DGP) Gaurav Yadav said those arrested have been identified as Rajan, Paramjit Singh and Dinesh Kumar, all residents of Amritsar. The recovered weapons

include two Glock 19X pistols, two .30 bore pistols, one .30 bore Star Mark Pistol and one Beretta .30 bore Pistol.

Preliminary investigations revealed that the accused were working under the directions of Jugraj Singh, who is currently lodged in Central Jail at Sri Goidwal Sahib, and actively running the smuggling racket through his advocate's munshi identified as Rajan.

The kingpin Jugraj Singh, who has been facing several criminal and drug-related cases, is reportedly in contact with Pakistani drug traffickers from within the jail, he said.

The DGP said these weapons were smuggled from across the border and were likely meant to be supplied to criminal elements in Punjab.

Further investigations are on to establish forward and backward linkages in this case, he added.

Three militants arrested in Manipur

PTI, IMPHAL: Security forces have arrested three militants, belonging to two proscribed outfits in Manipur, police said on Saturday.

All the arrests were made on Friday in Bishnupur, Kakching and Imphal West districts, a senior officer said.

The militant demanded money from schools, colleges, shopkeepers and elected members in Kumbi area, the officer said.

Preventive detention extraordinary power of state that must be used sparingly: SC

PTI, NEW DELHI: Preventive detention is an extraordinary power in the hands of the state that must be used sparingly, said the Supreme Court as it set aside an order of a district magistrate to detain a money lender who was allegedly indulging in illegal activities again after getting bail in four cases.

A bench of Justices Sanjay Karol and Manmohan questioned the contention of the detaining authority that the order was passed as the detainee was violating bail conditions in the cases, and

noted that they should have instead moved the competent court seeking cancellation of bail.

"Therefore, the order of detention dated June 20, 2024, and the impugned judgment dated September 4, 2024, passed by the High Court of Kerala at Ernakulam are hereby set aside. In the attending facts and circumstances of this case, the appeal is allowed," the bench said in its order passed on Friday.

Noting that the power of preventive detention finds recognition in the Constitution under Arti-

cle 22(3)(b), the bench said, "The provision for preventive detention is an extraordinary power in the hands of the state that must be used sparingly. It curtails the liberty of an individual in anticipation of the commission of further offence(s), and therefore, must not be used in the ordinary course of nature."

The bench said the contention of the detaining authority that the detainee, Rajesh, who used to run a private financing company called 'Rithika Finance', was

violating the conditions of bail imposed upon him in the cases that have been considered for passing the order of detention.

It said that pertinently, no application has been filed by the respondent in any of the four cases, alleging violation of such conditions, if any, and moreover, have not even been spelt out during the hearing of the case filed by his wife against the Kerala High Court order, which affirmed the preventive detention order of the Palakkad district magistrate.
