### Good day for Indian GMs at **Delhi International Open**

NEW DELHI: India's top seed GM Narayanan S L led the charge with a solid win over Vietnam's GM Nguyen Duc Hoa, while Diptayan Ghosh and two other home GMs also registered clinical victories in round four of the Delhi International Open, here Monday. Adding to India's strong showing at the top, IM Dinesh Sharma and IM Harsh Suresh notched up important wins to stay in the lead group, while GM Aditya S Samant continued his consistent run with another solid victory, keeping himself in contention. Among international players, GM Manuel Petrosyan, GM Mihail Nikitenko, GM Mamikon Gharibyan, GM Boris Saychenko, and GM Luka Paichadze also continued their winning runs with confident performances. The day also saw key draws in closely-contested games, including GM Aleksej Aleksandrov vs GM Karthik Venkataraman, and IM Aronyak Ghosh vs GM Mikulas Manik, as top boards fought to hold ground in an increasingly tight field.

### Nagal loses in first round of ATP Challenger again

LYON (France): There was no end to struggle of India's singles player Sumit Nagal, who yet again suffered a first round exit from the ATP Challenger circuit here on Monday. Sixth seed Nagal lost 4-6, 6-7 (4) to French unseeded player Geoffrey Blancaneaux in opening round of the Euro 145,250 clay court event. Nagal was down by a set and a break when he broke back in the eighth game of the second set to draw parity, raising hopes to stretch the contest to a decider. Blancaneaux and Nagal struggled to hold their serves and the second set had to be decided via tie-breaker, in which the local favourite prevailed. It was Nagal's sixth first-round defeat on the Challenger circuit in the 2025 season.

#### South Africa boosted by Broad chat ahead of WTC final against Australia

LONDON: South Africa coach Shukri Conrad said his side had enjoyed an "enlightening" evening with England fast-bowling great Stuart Broad ahead of their World Test Championship final against Australia at Lord's. Broad bowed out of international action two years ago, having taken 604 wickets in 167 Tests, with many of his best performances reserved for arch-rivals Australia.

#### **Cristian Chivu leaves Parma** ahead of Inter Milan move

MILAN: Cristian Chivu said goodbye to Parma on Monday ahead of his move to his former club Inter Milan to replace Simone Inzaghi as coach. Former Romania defender Chivu will take charge of Inter, where he won three Serie A titles and the 2010 Champions League as a player, after guiding Parma to Serie A safety in his first senior coaching job.

Alcaraz at top of ATP rankings


PARIS: Italy's Jannik Sinner extended his lead at the top of the ATP world rankings on Monday despite his defeat to second-ranked Carlos Alcaraz in the French Open final. Sinner, who lost to Alcaraz in the semi-finals last year, gained 500 points for reaching this year's final. Spaniard Alcaraz lifted the title for the second straight year, gained no points and remained second. Germany's Alexander Zverev remained third despite his quarter-final elimination to Novak Djokovic. At 38, Serb Djokovic, who was unable to take a set from Sinner in the semi-finals despite a strong fight, climbed one place to fifth, still behind Jack Draper.

Dhoni, who led India to the T20 World Cup win in 2007, ODI World Cup victory in 2011 and the Champions Trophy in 2013, said in a statement shared by the governing body that, "It is an honour to be named in the ICC Hall of Fame, which recognises the contributions of cricketers across generations and from all over the world.'







# Ashwin storms off after TNPL drama

Tiruppur Tamizhians. Ashwin, leading the Dragons, was adjudged leg-before off left-arm spinner R Sai Kishore in the fifth over after coming out to open the innings.

He looked in ominous touch as he raced to 18 with a couple of boundaries and a six off the first 10 deliveries.

However the 11th delivery that he faced, which was the fifth ball of the fifth over. Ashwin tried to play the paddle sweep but the delivery struck him on the pads.

Umpire Venkatesan Krithika raised his finger to an appeal from the bowler as Ashwin was scampering home for a quick single.

From the replays, it was clear that the ball pitched outside the leg-stump. Ashwin couldn't appeal for DRS as he and his opening partner Shivam Singh (30 off 27 balls) had exhausted their quota of referrals in the first over itself on leg-side wide deliveries (new rule introduced in TNPL).

Hence with no referrals left, Ashwin had no option but to head back to the dugout.

India's second highest wicket-taker was so stunned was infuriated and was seen animatedly asking Krithika about the decision. Umpire Krithika initially looked through him as they crossed paths but later turned to justify her decision.

Ashwin was visibly annoyed and while leaving the ground made sure that everyone around knew how he felt.

While returning, he first smashed his bat onto his leg guards to let some steam out and then as he reached near the boundary ropes, he opened his gloves and flung them in disgust.

Worse, Ashwin's team lost the match by a comprehensive nine-wicket margin.

While Ashwin's anger stemmed from a poor onfield call but behaviour was unbecoming of one of the greatest off-spinners of all time.
