Kerala govt open to talks over concerns on new school timings

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM: The Kerala government has said it is willing to hold discussions with any group experiencing difficulties following the announcement of revised school timings for high schools in the state. The revised timings, announced on Wednesday, extend the school day by 15 minutes in both the morning and evening sessions, except on Fridays. Under the new schedule, high school classes will run from 9.15 am to 4.15 pm. Muslim scholar and president of Samastha Kerala Jamiiyyathul Ulama, Jifri Muthukoya Thangal, has expressed concern that the revised schedule would affect madrasa education for around 12 lakh students.

Siddaramaiah urges Andhra CM to lift ban on entry of Totapuri Mangoes from K'taka

BENGALURU: Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah has urged his Andhra Pradesh counterpart Chandrababu Naidu to withdraw the ban on entry of 'Totapuri' Mangoes from Karnataka into Chittoor district. In a letter dated June 11, the CM said such unilateral actions, taken without prior consultation or coordination, run contrary to the spirit of cooperative federalism. He also expressed concerns that the move could lead to avoidable tension and retaliatory measures, and disruption of the interstate movement of commodities. Karnataka Chief Secretary Shalini Rajneesh had on June 10 written to her counterpart in Andhra Pradesh K Vijayanand requesting him to revoke the ban.

Road crash in Jhansi leaves three dead

JHANSI: Three members of a family were killed and five others injured after their car rammed into a road divider early Thursday in Jhansi district, police said. The accident occurred around 4 am in Moth area when a cross over utility vehicle travelling from Siddharthnagar to Maharashtra, lost control and hit the divider near Khilli village in Poonch area, Moth Circle Officer Devendra Nath Mishra said. The deceased were identified as Amir (45), Asma (40) and her 15-year-old daughter Parveen, all residents of Itari Bazar in Naugarh, Siddharthnagar district. According to police, the family was returning to their workplace in Maharashtra after celebrating Eid in their hometown.

Adityanath says child labour a curse, calls for collective resolve to protect children

LUCKNOW: Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Thursday called child labour a "curse" and urged citizens to unite against the practice by ensuring that every child receives education, security and dignity. Taking to social media platform X on the occasion of World Day Against Child Labour, the CM stressed that only through awareness and collective effort against child labour can a sensitive and empowered society be built for the future. "Child labour is a curse, it cannot be accepted! Let us, on this World Day Against Child Labour, pledge to connect every child with education, safety, dignity and values," he said.

Woman kills husband 15 days after marriage in Maharashtra's Sangli; arrested

SANGLI: Even as ripples caused by the murder of Indore businessman Raja Raghuvanshi are yet to subside, a case has surfaced in Maharashtra's Sangli where a 27-year-old woman allegedly hacked her husband to death just a fortnight after their wedding. The woman attacked her 53-year-old husband, Anil Lokhande, around 12.30 am on Wednesday after he insisted on consummating their 15-day-old marriage, police said, adding the accused has been arrested. The couple resided in Kupwad tehsil of Sangli district, a police official said.

Delhi-Keylong-Leh bus to resume service on Jun 13

SHIMLA: The Himachal Roads Transport Corporation (HRTC) will resume the Delhi-Keylong-Leh bus that passes through the world's highest highway, on June 13, after a gap of eight months. The bus passes through the Manali-Leh highway, the highest in the world, and covers a 1,026-km distance in 26 hours. The one-way fare has been fixed at Rs 1,830, officials said on Thursday With mercury soaring in the plains, the tourists are eagerly waiting for the bus which crosses Baralacha La at 16,020 ft, Lachung La at 16,620 ft, and Tanglung La at 17,480 ft.

Sonam, Raj accuse each other of being mastermind of honeymoon murder

PTI, SHILLONG: Sonam Raghuvanshi confessed to be part of the conspiracy to kill her husband Raja during their honeymoon in Meghalaya, and accused Raj Kushwaha of being the mastermind of the Indore-based businessman's murder, a senior police officer said on Thursday. On the other hand, Kushwaha, Sonam's suspected boyfriend, put the blame for orchestrating the murder on her, Deputy Inspector General of Police DNR Marak said on Thursday. Sonam and Kushwaha are among the five people arrested in connection with the murder of Raja Raghuvanshi, whose decomposed body was recovered from a gorge in Sohra area of East Khasi Hills district on June 2.

"Sonam confessed to be a part of the conspiracy to kill her husband but we are yet to establish who the mastermind of the plot is. Both Sonam and Raj are blaming each other," Marak told PTI. He said the investigation has started to unearth the conspiracy. "There are inconsistencies in the statements collected individually of all the accused persons. We are also investigating the amount of money Sonam promised to pay to the hitmen and how much she had already paid," Marak said. According to the senior officer, the police are verifying if any of them had made a recce of Sohra and the jungles of Nongriat before. The couple had stayed at a homestay in

**'MANGALSUTRA', RING LEFT BEHIND AT HOMESTAY HELPED POLICE CRACK CASE: DGP**  
PTI, SHILLONG: Raja Raghuvanshi and his wife Sonam had left their suitcase at a homestay in Sohra before going missing, and the 'mangalsutra' and a ring found in it helped investigators crack the honeymoon murder case, Meghalaya DGP, I Nongrang, said. Sonam (25) and Raja (29) got married in Indore on May 11 and reached Meghalaya via Guwahati in Assam on May 20 for their honeymoon. Both of them went missing on May 23 in Sohra in East Khasi Hills district, hours after checking out of a homestay at Nongriat village. "We recovered Sonam's 'mangalsutra' and a ring from the suitcase the couple abandoned at a homestay in Sohra. A married woman leaving behind the ornaments gave us a clue to pursue her as a suspect in the case," Nongrang told PTI on Wednesday evening. 'Mangalsutra' is a necklace worn by married Hindu women. Raja's body was found in a gorge near Weisawdong Falls on June 2.

The three and the couple arrived in the Meghalaya capital Shillong around the same time before they started for Sohra, about 65 km from here, last month, Marak said. Raja (29) and Sonam (24) went missing in the hills of Sohra on May 23, while his body was found in a gorge near Weisawdong Falls on June 2.

India scuppered 2 lakh cyberattacks during Operation Sindoor

PTI, SRINAGAR: India foiled around two lakh cyberattacks targeting its power infrastructure in the course of a week during Operation Sindoor, Union Power Minister Manohar Lal Khattar said here on Thursday. "Since the advancement in technology, new dangers have emerged - cyberattacks or cybercrimes. There has been an increase in these, but the government has worked on it, and our cybersecurity has almost stopped all such dangers," Khattar told reporters here. He was addressing a press conference on the completion of 11 years of the BJP-led Central government. "There have been many cyberattacks on the country. As far as the Power department is concerned,

around two lakh cyberattacks were attempted, but our cyber department foiled each one of them, and there were no losses," the minister said. Khattar said these attempts were made in "eight to ten days" around the time Operation Sindoor went underway. Asked whether the attacks were made from within the country or outside it, the minister said these attacks can take place from any corner of the world. "It is known worldwide that those against us will do things like these, but ... We have stopped such attacks. Our system is capable and in the future also, we will foil all such attacks," he said. "When someone fails for the first time, and second time, he will ultimately get discouraged and stop," he added.

Karnataka to conduct new caste survey: CM

PTI, BENGALURU: Karnataka cabinet on Thursday "unanimously" decided to conduct a new Socio-Educational survey, popularly known as caste census, in the state. "...we have taken a decision in the cabinet. It was a unanimous decision in the cabinet that a new survey is to be conducted," Chief Minister Siddaramaiah told reporters after a special cabinet meeting. He said, "The government will consult the Karnataka State Backward Classes Commission....we are going to give 90 days time to survey a fresh and to give the report." The decision comes after the Congress top brass on Tuesday directed the state government to hold caste re-enumeration in Karnataka to

address the concerns of some communities who complained of being left out of the survey conducted 10 years ago.

Inflation declines to 6-yr low of 2.82% in May: Govt data

PTI, NEW DELHI: Retail inflation dipped to an over six-year low of 2.82 per cent in May mainly due to subdued prices of food items, including vegetables, fruits, and protein-rich items, showed government data released on Thursday. The Consumer Price Index (CPI) based retail inflation was 3.16 per cent

in April and 4.8 per cent in May 2024. Food inflation was at 0.99 per cent in May, significantly down from 8.69 per cent in the year-ago month, according to data of the National Statistics Office (NSO). "The significant decline in headline inflation and food inflation during the month of May

2025 is mainly attributed to a decline in inflation of pulses & products, vegetables, fruits, cereals & products, households goods & services, sugar & confectionary and egg and the favourable base effect," NSO said in a statement. The food inflation in May 2025 is the lowest since October 2021.

Judicial activism shouldn't turn into judicial terrorism: CJI

PTI, NEW DELHI: Chief Justice of India B R Gavai has emphasised that judicial activism is bound to stay, but it should not be turned into judicial terrorism. CJI Gavai said the power of judicial review should be used sparingly and only if a statute is violative of the basic structure of the Constitution. "Judicial activism is bound to stay. At the same time, judicial activism should not be turned into judicial terrorism. So, at times, you try to exceed the limits and try to enter into an area where normally the judiciary should not enter," Gavai said. Gavai described the Constitution as a "quiet revolution etched in ink" and a transformative force that not only guarantees rights but actively uplifts the historically oppressed.

Speaking at the Oxford Union in London on the theme 'From Representation to Realisation: Embodying the Constitution's Promise' on Tuesday, the CJI, the second Dalit and the first Buddhist to hold India's highest judicial office, highlighted the positive impact of the Constitution on marginalised communities and gave his example to drive home the point. "Many decades ago, millions of citizens of India were called 'untouchables'. They were told they were impure. They were told that they did not belong. They were told that they could not speak for themselves. "But here we are today, where a person belonging to those very people is speaking openly, as the holder of the highest office in the judiciary of the country," the CJI said.

India slips to 131st position in Global Gender Gap Index 2025

PTI, NEW DELHI: India has ranked 131 out of 146 countries in the World Economic Forum's Global Gender Gap Report 2025, slipping two places from its position last year. With a parity score of just 64.1 per cent, India is among the lowest-ranked countries in South Asia, according to the report released on Thursday. India ranked 129 last year. The Global Gender Gap Index measures gender parity across four key dimensions: Economic Participation and Opportunity, Educational Attainment, Health and Survival, and Political Empowerment. The Indian economy's overall performance improved in absolute terms by +0.3 points.
