Barrage of Russian drones kills 3 in Ukraine despite ceasefire calls

AP, KYIV: Russian forces have pummelled Ukraine with drones and other weapons, killing three people and injuring scores of others despite international pressure to accept a ceasefire, officials said Thursday.

According Ukrainian air force, Russia launched a barrage of 63 drones and decoys at Ukraine overnight. It said that air defences destroyed 28 drones while another 21 were jammed.

Ukraine's police said two people were killed and six were injured over the past 24 hours in the eastern Donetsk region, the focus of the Russian offensive. One person was killed and 14 others were also injured in the southern Kherson region, which is partly occupied by Russian forces, police said.

The head of the Kharkiv region, Oleh Syniehubov, said that 15 people, including four children, were injured by Russian drone attacks overnight.

Kharkiv city mayor Ihor Terekhov said Russian

drones targeted residential districts, educational facilities, kindergartens and other civilian infrastructure.

"Kharkiv is holding on. People are alive. And that is the most important thing," Terekhov said.

The Russian military has launched waves of drones and missiles in recent days, with a record bombardment of almost 500 drones on Monday and a wave of 315 drones and seven missiles overnight on Tuesday. The recent escalation

in aerial attacks has come alongside a renewed Russian battlefield push along eastern and northeastern parts of the more than 1.000-kilometre front line.

While Russian missile

and drone barrage have struck regions all across Ukraine, regions along the front line have faced daily Russian attacks with shortrange exploding drones and glide bombs. Ukraine hit back with

drone raids. Russia's Defence Ministry said that air defences downed 52 Ukrainian drones early Thursday, including 41 over the Belgorod region that borders Ukraine. Regional Gov. Vyacheslav Gladkov said three people were in-


"Real peace comes with a USD 30 cap -- that's the level that will truly change thinking in Moscow," Zelenskyy said.

German Defence Minister Boris Pistorius arrived in Kyiv Thursday on an unannounced visit, noting that the stepped-up Russian attacks on Ukraine send a message from Moscow that it has "no interest in a peaceful solution at present," according to German news agency dpa.

Pistorius said his visit underlines that the new German government continues to stand by Ukraine.

Blame game erupts as Chinese fighter jets fly close to Japanese planes

China blamed each other aircraft carrier on Saturday on Thursday after Tokyo raised concern that a Chinese fighter jet came dangerously close to Japanese reconnaissance planes.

The Chinese fighter jets took off from one of two Chinese aircraft carriers that were operating together for the first time in the Pacific, Japan's Defence Ministry said.

Chief Cabinet Secretary Yoshimasa Hayashi told reporters that Japan conveved its "serious concern" to China that such close encounters could cause accidental collisions.

According to Japan, a Chinese J-15 fighter jet

AP, TOKYO: Japan and took off from the Shandong and chased a Japanese P-3C aircraft on reconnaissance duty, coming within an "abnormally close distance" of 45 metres (50 yards) for about 40 minutes.

A Chinese jet also crossed 900 metres (980 yards) in front of a Japanese P-3C for about 80 minutes on Sunday, the ministry said.

The incidents occurred in the Pacific, where Japan's Self-Defence Force spotted the two carriers, the Shandong and the Liaoning, almost simultaneously operating near southern Japanese islands for the first time.

Israel to deport 6 more activists detained on Gaza aid boat

AP, JERUSALEM: Israel is deporting six more activists who were detained when it seized an aid boat bound for the war-ravaged Gaza Strip, according to the rights group representing them.

The six include Rima Hassan, a French member of the European parliament who Israel had previously barred from entering Israel and the Palestinian territories. citing her support for boycotts of the country.

They were among 12 passengers, including climate campaigner Greta Thunberg, aboard the Madleen, a boat that sought to break Israel's blockade of Gaza and deliver a symbolic amount of aid. Israel seized the vessel early Monday and deported Thunberg and three others the following day.

The last two activists are expected to be deported on Friday, according to Adalah, a local human rights group representing them.

It said the activists were subjected to "mistreatment, punitive measures, and aggressive treatment, and two volunteers were held for some period of time in solitary confinement."

Israeli authorities declined to comment on treatment. Israel

says it treats detainees in a lawful manner and investigates any allegations of abuse.

It says the blockade. which it has imposed in various forms along with Egypt since Hamas seized power in 2007, is needed to prevent the militant group from importing arms. Critics view it as collective punishment of Gaza's roughly 2 million

Palestinians. The Israeli Foreign Ministry said those activists who signed deportation documents would be deported immediately while those who refused would be brought before a judicial authority to authorize their deportation in keeping with Israeli law. The activists have protested that they had no intention of entering Israel and were brought there against

their will. The Freedom Flotilla Coalition, which organized the journey, said it was aimed at protesting Israel's blockade of Gaza and ongoing military campaign there, which experts say has pushed the territory to the brink of famine more than 20 months into the Israel-Hamas war.





China hints at lifting export curbs on rare earth metals to India

PTI . BEIIING: China on Thursday hinted at holding talks with India over its restrictions on export of rare earth materials, saying it is willing to enhance dialogue and cooperation with relevant countries to keep industrial supply chains stable.

China's recent restrictions on the exports of key metals caused widespread disruption in the manufacturing of automobiles and semiconductor chips in a host of countries, including India

"We are willing to enhance dialogue and cooperation with relevant countries and regions to jointly keep the stability of global industrial and supply chains," Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson Lin Jian said.

Lin was responding to a question from PTI whether China is willing to lift restrictions on ex-

ports of rare earth metals to India as it began clearing export licences to the US and the EU.

Lin, however, reiterated that for specifics, the relevant authorities should be approached.

On June 16, Indian Ambassador Pradeep Kumar Rawat met Chinese Vice Minister Sun Weidong and held talks on bilateral issues. They discussed "common concerns" among others, a foreign ministry statement here said.

Reports from India spoke of growing concerns about shortages of the rare metals in automobiles and other industries.

After several months of a squeeze on rare earth metals over which China holds a monopoly, Beijing began clearing selective export licenses reportedly for the US as both countries held talks in London over the issues.
