## BLACK BOX SEARCH ENDS, **HUNT FOR ANSWERS BEGINS**

PTI, AHMEDABAD: Investigators on Friday recovered one of the two Black Boxes of the London-bound Air India plane from the rooftop of a medical college hostel here a day after it crashed and rammed into the building, as they scoured through the debris for clues to the cause of the worst air tragedy in the country in three decades.

In a major breakthrough, the Aircraft Accident Investigation Bureau (AAIB), without giving details, said the Digital Flight Data Recorder (DFDR), commonly known as the Black Box, was recovered from the 'rooftop' at the crash site. The DFDR will help reconstruct the ill-fated flight's final moments and is crucial to determining how the disaster occurred.

As aviation experts discussed the possible causes of the crash, including loss of thrust in both engines of the 11-year-old aircraft, multiple bird strikes, or a potential flap issue, Aviation watchdog DGCA ordered enhanced safety inspection of Air India's Boeing 787 Dreamliner fleet powered by GEnx engines. There are 26 Boeing 787-8s and 7 Boeing 787-9s in the Air India fleet.

"The DFDR (Black box) has been recovered from the rooftop," an AAIB statement said, without giving details.

#### DGCA ORDERS INSPECTION OF A-I'S B-787 FLEET

PTI, NEW DELHI: Aviation watchdog DGCA on Friday ordered enhanced safety inspection of Air India's Boeing 787 Dreamliner fleet powered by GEnx engines, a day after 241 people onboard died in the plane crash in Ahmedabad. The enhanced DGCA inspection will include checks of various systems and a review of take-off parameters of the Boeing 787 Dreamliner aircraft of Air India, owned by Tata Group.

Air India's fleet includes 26 Boeing 787-8 aircraft and 7 Boeing 787-9 planes.

Meanwhile, US aircraft engine maker GE Aerospace, in a statement, said it continues to work closely with the appropriate regulatory and investigative agencies.

The Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) has directed Air India to carry out additional maintenance actions on its Boeing 787-8 and 787-9 planes equipped with Genx engines with immediate effect.

These actions will be carried out in coordination with the DGCA regional offices concerned.

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### **CRASH SITE HITS 1,000 °C**

#### AGENCY, AHMEDABAD:

An officer said he has dealt with crisis situations before but has never seen such a disaster, where inferno reached 1,000 degrees C. The temperature in and around the crashed Air India plane site increased to about 1,000 degree Celsius, which made the rescue operations extremely difficult, PTI reported on Thursday night, citing officials.

"As the (aircraft's fuel) tank exploded, it created an inferno where temperature rose to 1,000 degrees Celsius in no time. This left little chance for anyone to escape," a senior fire official was quoted as saying by the news agency.

An SDRF officer, who joined the force in 2017, stated that he has dealt with crisis situations before but has never encountered such a disaster.

"We came here with PPE kits. But the temperature was so high that it made operations difficult. There were debris everywhere. So we had to clear the debris that were already simmering," he said.



### Crypto income on I-T radar

PTI, NEW DELHI: The Income Tax Department has sent a communication to thousands of individuals who have undertaken cryptocurrency transactions but failed to reflect this income in their returns, offi-

cial sources said Friday. These transactions pertain to assessment years 2023-24 and 2024-25, they said.

The department and its policy-making body, the Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT), suspect tax evasion and money laundering by certain "high-risk" people who are potentially us-

ing "unaccounted" income to invest in virtual digital assets (VDAs), commonly known as cryptocurrency.

Sources told PTI that the I-T Department has sent e-mails to thousands of defaulting people.
