India women's hockey team loses 1-2 to Australia in Pro League

LONDON: The Indian women's hockey team fought on equal terms against Australia but conceded a last-minute goal to lose 1-2 in its FIH Pro League match here on Sunday. This was India's second consecutive defeat to the same opponents as they had lost 2-3 on Friday. India took the lead in the third minute through a field goal from Vaishnavi Phalke and they were 1-0 up at half time. But Australia restored parity in the 37th minute through Amy Lawton. The match was heading towards a draw but Lexie Pickering scored the winner from a penalty-corner variation in the 60th minute to break Indian hearts. India next face Argentina, here, on Tuesday.

MGD1 advance to knockout round of World Blitz Team chess

LONDON: A day after becoming the first Indian side to clinch the FIDE World Rapid Team Championship title, Team MGD1 gave another commanding performance to secure a spot in the knockout round of the 'Blitz' tournament, keeping it in contention for a golden double here. With 16 teams moving into the knockouts from four Pools, Team MGD1 in Pool D, played out just one draw -- against Team Hungary -and won all their other matches to end the day on 23 match points. A total of 53 teams competed in the round-robin pool stage, with the top-four from each group making it to the knockout. The Indian team, comprising Grandmaster Arjun Erigaisi, P Harikrishna, V Pranav, Leon Luke Mendonca, Stavroula Tsolakidou and Atharvaa Tayade, scored five match victories in which they won all six games -- the most of all top-placed teams in the Blitz, across all groups. BCCI trims daily allowances for staff,

streamlines travel policy

NEW DELHI: The daily allowances of the BCCI staff across departments, which have not been paid since January, will finally be released following the streamlining of the domestic 'tournament allowance policy' by the Board's top brass. As per the existing BCCI travel policy, the employees are paid per diem of Rs 15,000 for short-term travel (up to four days) and Rs 10,000 for long travel usually relating to the Indian Premier League (IPL), Women's Premier League (WPL) and ICC events hosted by India. A one time incidental allowance during the travel is Rs 7500. According to the revised policy, the incidental allowance component has been removed and employees will now be paid a flat Rs 10,000 per day for their time on the road.

India to compete in Para Powerlifting World Cup in Beijing

NEW DELHI: A 16-member team will represent India at the 2025 Para Powerlifting World Cup, to be held in Beijing from June 17 to 25. The team includes the likes of Zainab Khatun, Seema Rani, Jhandu Kumar, Joby Mathew, Manish Kumar and Kasthuri who impressed at the recently concluded national championships. Out of the 16 players, seven are women. A grand send-off ceremony for the athletes was organized on Sunday. Former president of Paralympic Committee of India Deepa Malik, current PCI Secretary General Jayawant Hamnnavar and India Para Powerlifting Chairman JP Singh were among those present on the occasion. "With every tournament, India is establishing itself as a force to reckon with in the global para powerlifting fraternity. Our players are in great shape, and we can expect commendable results in China," Singh said. "It is especially heartening to note that 7 out of the 16-member contingent are women a very promising sign for the future of the sport in the country."

MUNICH: Tottenham have signed French youngster Mathys ermanent deal from Bayern Munich after his loar spell at the Europa League winners, the two clubs said on Sunday. The 20-year-old scored three goals in 20 appearances in all competitions for Spurs last season after joining on loan in February. Tel has signed a six-year deal with Tottenham for a transfer fee of around 35 million euros (\$40.4 million), according to German media reports. Tel scored 16 goals for Bayern after signing as a teenager from Rennes. Tottenham hired former Brentford boss Thomas Frank as their new manager earlier this week to replace the sacked Ange Postecoglou.
