Court grants conditional bail to accused in cannabis case

MARGAO: The Judicial Magistrate First Class (JMFC), Margao, has granted conditional bail to Velroy Ricardo of Curtorim, arrested for possessing dry greenish substance with fruiting and flowering tops, suspected to be ganja, worth Rs 50,400. The court ordered his release on furnishing a bail bond of Rs 25,000 with one surety of a like amount. Additionally, he has been directed to report to the Margao Police Station for 10 days.

Banyan tree falls onto the road in Navelim

MARGAO: A huge banyan tree fell onto the road in Navelim. According to Station Fire Officer Gil Souza at the Margao Fire Station, they received a call and promptly sent fire personnel to the location. Souza stated that the operation to cut the massive tree and clear the road took approximately six hours. He explained that the firefighters completed this task in stages, and the area was eventually cleared for traffic. In a separate incident, a cashew tree in Telaulim, Navelim, was in danger of falling onto a house. Firefighters intervened by cutting down the tree, preventing damage to the property. Souza noted that the tree was leaning precariously against the house, posing a significant risk, which prompted the crew to remove its branches.

MONSOON BRINGS HOPE FOR PONDA'S TRADITIONAL VEGETABLE FARMERS

Farmers in hilly areas prepare for July-August harvest; seek government support, subsidies, compensation for crop damage and recognition

PONDA: With Goa witnessing a familiar shift towards locally-grown vegetables, reducing reliance on neighbouring States, several farmers in hilly and sloping areas are diligently preparing for the harvest, expected in July and August.

Cultivating a variety of seasonal crops, including cucumber, bitter gourd, ridge gourd, brinjal, radish, and pumpkin, the farmers in the region stressed the need for government support to enhance their production.

Beyond Curti and Farmagudi, the plateaus and hills of Bandora are flourishing with monsoon vegetable cultivation. In Ponda taluka, numerous families engaged in farming are involved in growing these most



sought-after and delicious local vegetables.

The arrival of the monsoon has brought joy, as they have already put in much effort over the past two months tilling the land and sowing seeds. Their produce is anticipated to be readily available, particularly along highways, starting in July.

The hills and plateaus in the taluka have turned green with the arrival of monsoon, farmers are optimistic that it will further aid the growth of their crops. In Curti, farmers are cultivating vegetables such as

cucumber, lady finger, Gosali, and Tambdi bhaji. These monsoon vegetables are expected to reach the market in July and August, continuing till Ganesh Chaturthi, a period when cucumbers and other vegetables provide a substantial income for them.

Sudhakar Gaude mentioned that he and his three brothers have been cultivating vegetables on the



hills for a long time, utilising traditional techniques passed down through generations. While they are not legal owners or tenants, they have been engaged in this practice for several years. Sudhakar also noted that he had filed a tenancy application around 30 years ago, but a decision is still pending. The farmers emphasised that growing vegetables on the hills reauires specific knowledge acquired from their ancestors. While the current

generation continues this tradition, they hope for government encouragement and support to ensure its continuation in the modern

era for future generations. The farmers urged the government to introduce financial schemes, emphasising the lack of subsidies or compensation for crop damage. They highlighted significant losses incurred last year due to heavy rains. They believe that providing such support would help preserve this traditional

practice, protect the hills, and support the farming community.

Prabhakar Gaude stated that cultivating monsoon vegetables is a traditional occupation inherited from their forefathers. He pointed out that when they bring their produce to sell in July and August, customers of-

ten heavily negotiate prices. He hoped consumers will consider the hard work involved.

Local farmers depend on this traditional activity for their livelihood, investing considerable effort in preparations two months in advance, including installing wooden fences, tilling the land, and protecting their crops from wild animals throughout the season. Some even hire water tankers for pre-monsoon

Chain-snatching incidents spark fear among Salcete residents

MARGAO: Residents of Salcete, especially senior citizens, are alarmed over the reoccurring chain snatching incidents across the taluka.

Two days ago in Davorlim, a woman was targeted in broad daylight; her mangalsutra was stolen by a scooter rider wearing a raincoat. Maina Curtorim police have registered a case under BNS 2023, and an investigation is underway.

According to police, the incident took place around 8.30 am near the Shripad Shri Vallabh Temple, Mugalli, Davorlim. Vaishnavi Manerikar, 40, reported that an unknown male on a two-wheeler snatched her gold mangalsutra, valued at Rs 1.39 lakh, while she was on her morning walk. Police stated the accused,

riding alone with a helmet, approached from behind, snatched the mangalsutra, and quickly fled. The area was deserted, and despite the victim's cries for help, the rider escaped. Maina Curtorim PSI Gaurav Naik and his team inspected the site. Such incidents have now

resurfaced with Suresh Naik from Davorlim stating that a chain-snatching gang operates in Salcete. He urged the police to increase patrols in isolated areas, particularly during morning walks and church services. He noted that non-functional streetlights in parts of Davorlim contribute to these incidents, which target senior citizens and women during

early hours.

Past incidents include the snatching of a gold chain worth Rs 90,000 from Inacina Francisco Fernandes in Avedem, and mangalsutras stolen from two senior citizens in Davorlim and Aquem-Margao.

In Davorlim, two individuals robbed a 63-year-old woman of her mangalsutra worth Rs 1.90 lakh. In Aquem-Margao, a motorcycle rider stole a woman's mangalsutra and other gold ornaments valued at Rs one lakh. Speaking on the condi-

tion of anonymity, a police inspector stated that they are investigating potential links between these cases due to similar methods used. Several suspects have been questioned, and the

Non-functional traffic signal at Gogol junction sparks chaos and safety concerns

MARGAO: The traffic signal at the four roads junction at Gogol in Fatorda Police Station jurisdiction, which has been out of service for the past 10 days, is causing inconvenience and safety concerns for commuters and pedestrians alike.

According to a local taxi driver, the signal has been non-functional for over a week, and there has been no police presence to manage the traffic flow in its absence. When contacted, PI Filomena Costa of Fatorda Traffic Cell acknowledged the problem and the resulting inconvenience to vehicle owners.

PI Costa stated that upon assuming charge, they had

already informed the relevant authorities about the situation and that assurances have been given to repair the signal as quickly as possible. Adding to these con-

cerns, Suresh Naik, an em-

ployee at a private bank in

the area, emphasised that

this junction is one of the



busiest in Fatorda with constant traffic. The lack of a working signal is making it extremely difficult and hazardous for both vehicles and pedestrians to navigate the intersection, especially during peak hours.

Naik pointed out that the non-functional signal inevitably leads to traffic congestion, disrupting the normal traffic flow and causing confusion. He believed that while manual traffic control by the police is a necessity in such situations, it is less efficient and can contribute

Ramesh Prabhu, resident highlighted the difficulties faced by students from nearby schools and colleges, as well as office-goers, who regularly cross this busy road during peak hours.

to further delays.

He noted the chaotic flow of vehicles from all directions, forcing pedestrians to wait for extended periods to cross safely. Prabhu stressed that a

functioning traffic signal

is the only effective way to

manage traffic at this cru-

cial junction. Furthermore, a shop owner in the vicinity reported that minor accidents have become a common occurrence since the traffic signal stopped working.

He claims to have witnessed at least seven minor accidents in the past 10 days, primarily involving riders rushing from opposing directions and escaping with minor injuries. The absence of both traffic lights and speed breakers at the junction has created a dangerous situation where vehicles from all four direc-

tions are colliding. The residents recall a time when police personnel were stationed at the junction to control traffic, and during that period, accidents were reportedly avoided.
