#### Senthilkumar enters semi-finals, confirms medal

KUCHING (Malaysia): Velavan Senthilkumar, the lone Indian left in the fray, entered the men's singles semi-finals at the Asian Squash Championships 2025 with a straightgame win, here, on Thursday. Senthilkumar, ranked 45th in the men's singles chart, beat Malaysia's Joachim Chuah, the current world No. 196, 3-0 (11-7 11-6 11-6) in the quarterfinals. Senthilkumar will next play second-seeded Lau Tsz Kwan of Hong Kong in the semifinals.

### Chopra seeks first major title of season,

up against Weber in Paris Diamond League PARIS: Having breached the 90m mark, two-time Olympic medallist Neeraj Chopra would now be eyeing a top finish when he goes up against familiar rivals in the prestigious Paris Diamond League on Friday in a star-studded field here. Chopra, German ace Julian Weber and two-time world champion Anderson Peters of Grenada will be among eight competitors vying for top honours in the second DL meeting of the season featuring men's javelin throw on the roster. Five of the listed throwers have hit the 90m mark. In Paris, Chopra would look to upstage Weber after finishing second in back-to-back competitions as he returns to the French capital after eight years for a Diamond League competition.

#### Indian junior archers enter five finals at Asia Cup Stage 2

SINGAPORE: Indian junior archers continued their dominating run by storming into five team finals at the Asia Cup Stage 2 here on Thursday. The Indian men's recurve team, seeded second, defeated Bangladesh 5-1 in a one-sided semi-final to set up a summit clash with third seeds Japan. The trio of Vishnu Choudhary, Paras Hooda and Juyel Sarkar dominated from the outset, taking the opening set 55-48. Although the second set was tied at 55-55, the Indians bounced back strongly against their fifth-seeded opponents, dropping just one point in the third set to win it 59-56 and seal the issue. In the recurve mixed team event. Vaishnavi Pawar and Vishnu Choudhary defeated Singapore's Tabitha Ern Lin Yeo and Yue Long Li 5-3 to enter the final.

#### Two-time Wimbledon champion Kvitova announces she will retire in September

LONDON: Two-time Wimbledon champion Petra Kvitova plans to retire in a few months, the Czech player said Thursday. The announcement on social media came a day after Kvitova was granted a wild card for Wimbledon. "I am excited and very much looking forward to soak in the beauty of playing The Championships, Wimbledon one more time, a place that holds the most cherished memories in my career," Kvitova said. "And while I am not entirely sure yet what my hardcourt swing in the US will look like, I am intending to finish my active playing career at the US Open in New York later this summer.'

#### Shubman should focus on his decisions, not how outside world perceives him: Tendulkar

**NEW DELHI:** Shubman Gill should be given adequate "time and support" to succeed as he leads India through a tough transition phase, feels the legendary Sachin Tendulkar, whose advice to the new skipper is to focus on his own planning without thinking about opinions outside the dressing room. "I think he (Gill) has to be given time. He has to be supported," Tendulkar told PTI. Being Indian skipper is a high-pressure job and Tendulkar knows that varied opinions will fly thick and fast. But he expects Gill to have a tunnel vision. "I feel there are going to be a lot of opinions that 'he should do this and he should do that' And all those kind of things will come into play. But what he should be focused on is, what is the team's plan. What was the discussion in the dressing room. And is it going according to that?

# ISL organisers tell clubs 2025-26 edition will not start without clarity on MRA status

# AIFF says FSDL silent about the fate of Indian Super League

PTI, NEW DELHI: Indian Super League (ISL) organisers have told the clubs that the 2025-26 edition will not kick off until there is clarity over the status of the Master Rights Agreement (MRA) signed with the All India Football Federation (AIFF), putting the country's top-tier competition in a limbo.

The Football Sports Development Limited (FSDL), which runs the ISL, is the commercial partner of the AIFF, with whom the national federation signed a 15-year MRA in 2010.

Under the MRA, the FSDL pays the AIFF Rs 50 crore annually. The FSDL, in turn, gets the rights to broadcast. manage and commercialise Indian football, including the national team.

"The FSDL has told the ISL club owners verbally that the next edition will not start until there is clarity on the MRA," a source

privy to the development for other properties like bearers and that will take told PTI on conditions of anonymity. "The MRA ends in December and there is no clarity whether it will be renewed or a new agreement will be signed."

The AIFF, however, said that the FSDL has not told anything about the fate of the ISL to the national federation.

"We have not got any communication from the FSDL regarding ISL," AIFF Deputy Secretary General M Satyanarayan said when asked if the league will start In the last two seasons,

the ISL began in September. According to another source, the FSDL is learnt to favour creating a new holding company that operates the ISL, with participating clubs (60%), FSDL (26%) and AIFF (14%) as shareholders.

"May be, there might be other arrangements I-League, national teams etc. But it is very sketchy as of now regarding what the FSDL and AIFF want." the source said.

The matter has also become complex after the Supreme Court directive to the AIFF not to take any major decision until the final decision on a pending case on the constitution of the national federation is given. On April 30, the SC had reserves its verdict.

In April, the AIFF had formed an eight-member task force to look into MRA negotiations with the FSDL. Former India captain Bhaichung Bhutia, who is also AIFF executive committee member, had then told the brass to wait till the Supreme Court verdict which is likely to come in July.

"If the SC directs new election of the AIFF, then the MRA will have to be ne-

time," a former official said.

"Still, there may be enough time for the 2025-26 to happen, may be by squeezing the schedule or stretching the end date. That is the best case scenario."

The AIFF last month issued the competition calendar for 2025-26 season and there was no mention of the ISL in it. But, a source said the calendar was for events which come directly under the AIFF and ISL schedule is put up only after consulting

"There was nothing to be interpreted from the calendar. Firstly, it was issued last month and secondly, it was meant for events which are conducted directly by the AIFF," the source said.

"ISL is not directly conducted by the AIFF and so the ISL dates were not there in the calendar. Moreover, gotiated by the new office the AIFF always consults
