

827 Indian nationals brought back from Iran so far, says MEA

PTI, NEW DELHI: More than 800 Indian nationals have so far returned home from Iran under Operation Sindhu, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said on Saturday.

The MEA shared the update on the status of the evacuation operation in a series of posts on X.

OPERATION SINDHU

More Indian nationals, including students, arrived in Delhi late on Friday evening and in the early hours of Saturday after being evacuated from Iran as its military confrontation with Israel intensified.

India announced the launch of Operation Sindhu on Wednesday to evacuate its nationals from Iran.

"#OperationSindhu flight brings citizens home. India evacuated 290 Indian na-

nationals from Iran, including students and religious pilgrims by a charter flight. The flight arrived in New Delhi at 2330 hrs on 20 June and was received by Secretary (CPV&OIA) Arun Chatterjee," MEA Spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said on X.

"Government of India is grateful to the Government of Iran for the facilitation of

the evacuation process," he added.

In another post, Jaiswal shared the details of an evacuation flight that arrived from Turkmenistan.

"#OperationSindhu continues. A special evacuation flight from Ashgabat, Turkmenistan landed in New Delhi at 0300 hrs on 21st June, bringing Indians from Iran home. With this, so far

517 Indian nationals from Iran have returned home under Operation Sindhu," he said.

The first batch of 110 Indian nationals evacuated from Iran arrived in India on Thursday, with many evacuees sharing first-hand accounts of the frightening situation they witnessed before being moved to safer locations.

Minister of State for External Affairs Kirti Vardhan Singh welcomed them on their arrival at the Delhi airport after their arduous journey.

In another post in the evening, Jaiswal informed about the arrival of a separate evacuation flight.

"#OperationSindhu Another evacuation flight from Mashhad landed in New Delhi at 1630 hrs on 21 June with 310 Indian nationals from Iran. With this, a total of 827 Indians have been evacuated," he said.

50k people affected due to flooding in Odisha

PTI, BALASORE (ODISHA): With the flash flood in river Subarnarekha affecting over 50,000 people in Odisha's Balasore district, the state government on Saturday launched rescue and relief operations in the inundated areas.

The flash flood in three blocks and one urban pocket of Balasore district was due to sudden release of water from Chandil Dam in Jharkhand, alleged Balasore MP and former Union minister Pratap Sarangi. As many as 61 villages under 21 gram panchayats of four blocks - Baliajal, Basta, Bhograi and Jaleswar - experienced flood as the water level in the Subarnarekha river crossed the danger mark of 10.36 metre, an official said.

Keeping in view the flood situation, people are also being supplied with dry rations in Balaipal block, an official said.

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Flood-like situation in Bihar

PTI, PATNA: Several areas in Bihar's Nalanda district experienced a flood-like situation as portions of some small dams were damaged due to a sudden

rise in water level in Falgu River following heavy rainfall in neighbouring Jharkhand over the past few days, officials said on Saturday.

The authorities concerned are providing relief materials, including

food packets and drinking water, to the affected people. Temporary tents have been set up for the victims, it said.

Two teams of NDRF have been deployed in the area for relief and rescue operations.

DGCA orders AI to remove 3 officials for lapses in crew scheduling and rostering

Issues show-cause over duty time violations

PTI, MUMBAI: Aviation safety watchdog DGCA has ordered Tata Group-owned Air India to remove three senior officials for lapses in crew scheduling and rostering and issued a show-cause notice to the airline for violating FDTL norms, sources said on Saturday.

The Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) has also sought Air India inspection and audit details since 2024, they said.

The directives come after an Air India flight from Ahmedabad to London Gatwick carrying 242 passengers and crew members

crashed shortly after take-off on June 12, killing over 270 people onboard and on the ground.

In its order of June 20, the DGCA noted that the three officials, including a divisional vice-president, were involved in "serious and repeated lapses, including unauthorised and non-compliant crew pairings, violation of mandatory licensing and recency norms and systemic failures in scheduling protocol and oversight".

The DGCA directed the airline to initiate proceedings against these three officials without delay.

247 victims identified through DNA tests; 232 bodies given to kin

PTI, AHMEDABAD: A total of 247 victims of the horrific June 12 Ahmedabad plane crash have been identified through DNA tests so far and 232 bodies have been handed over to their families, officials said on Saturday.

The authorities have asked the families of eight victims to submit the DNA samples of another relative as the previous ones failed to match, they said.

Police said the matching of DNA samples confirmed that Ahmedabad-based filmmaker Mahesh Jirawala, who was reported missing following the crash, died in the catastrophe. His mortal remains were handed over to his family.

In Maharashtra, relatives and friends gave an emotional farewell to Deepak Pathak and Irfan Shaikh - two crew members of the ill-fated flight - at Badlapur in Thane district and in Pimpri-Chinchwad near Pune city respectively.

The London-bound aircraft crashed into a hostel complex in Meghanagar moments after taking off from Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel International Airport at 1.39 pm that day, killing 270 persons, including 241 on board. One passenger survived.

Authorities are carrying out DNA tests to establish the identity of the victims as many bodies were

charred beyond recognition as the aircraft burst into flames or damaged on impact.

"Till Saturday evening, 247 DNA samples have matched. Relatives of these deceased were contacted. So far, mortal remains of 232 victims have been handed over to families. The process is continuing," Ahmedabad Civil Hospital Medical Superintendent Dr Rakesh Joshi said.

The 247 victims who have been identified comprise 187 Indians, 52 Britons, seven Portuguese nationals and a Canadian, he said.

Of the 187 Indians, a total of 175 were on board the ill-fated aircraft, he

said, adding they belong to areas in Gujarat, Rajasthan, Maharashtra, Diu and Nagaland.

The state government had earlier stated that samples of 250 victims, including persons on board the ill-fated flight as well as those killed on the ground, were collected for identification.

The families of eight victims have been asked to give a sample of another relative for DNA tests after the first one did not match, Joshi said.

"We generally prefer a sample of father or son/daughter. If not, then we take a sample of another available member," Joshi added.

Bharat Mata row sparks street protests, war of words in Kerala

PTI, THIRUVANANTHAPURAM: The Bharat Mata portrait row involving Kerala Governor Rajendra Vishwanath Arlekar triggered a series of street protests and a war of words on Saturday with the ruling CPI (M)'s official mouthpiece publishing a hard-hitting editorial against the Raj Bhavan.

The southern state has been witnessing a tussle between Arlekar and the Marxist party-led LDF government over the display of 'Bharat Mata portrait' during official events at the Raj Bhavan here. In a strongly worded editorial, Deshabhimani, the official organ of the Marxist party in the state, asserted that Raj Bhavan is not a "shakha" (unit) of the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS).

As per the latest photos released by Raj Bhavan, the Governor paid floral tributes to the portrait during the Yoga Day celebrations held there on Saturday.

The Left party's trade union outfit, CITU, took out a protest march to the Raj Bhavan accusing the Gover-

The area saw tense moments as the SFI workers, the BJP and the Morcha activists engaged in scuffle on the street. Though a Morcha activist was taken into custody by the police soon, SFI activists, who rushed to the area, pushed and hit him at Thali in the northern district
