Odisha CM directs officials to maintain protocol in diarrhoea-prone areas till Dusshera
BHUBANESWAR: Odisha Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi directed health department officials to maintain the ongoing protocol in waterborne disease-prone areas till Dusshera even as the number of diarrhoea cases is on the decline in six districts of the state. At least 13 people have so far died of waterborne diseases. A total of 3,892 people were affected by diarrhoea and cholera in Jajpur, Bhadrak, Cuttack, Kendrapara, Dhenkanal and Keonjhar districts. The CM issued the directive while reviewing the diarrhoea situation in the six districts on Saturday. So far, 3,543 patients have recovered from the disease while 254 others are under treatment, an official statement said.

UP exam paper leak case: Absconding accused arrested

MUZAFFARNAGAR: A man, who was absconding since 2024 in connection with UP Police Recruitment exam paper leak case, has been arrested, police said. Superintendent of Police (Rural) Aditya Bansal said Ajay, a resident of Shamli district, was arrested from Muzaffarnagar on Saturday. The STF had lodged a case against Ajay under sections 418 (cheating with knowledge that wrongful loss may ensue to person whose interest offender is bound to protect), 467 (forgery of valuable security, will, etc), 468 (forgery for purpose of cheating), 471 (using as genuine a forged document or electronic record) and 120B (punishment of criminal conspiracy) of the IPC on February 29, 2024. The accused carried a reward of Rs 10,000 on his head.

Ambulance driver molests, thrashes nurse at private hospital in UP

BHADOHI: A 22-year-old nurse was molested, beaten up and dragged by hair by an ambulance driver at a private hospital here, police said. A case has been registered against the driver, Rohit alias Mohit, who is absconding, police said on Saturday. On June 5, the nurse was on a call when Rohit came to her and started molesting her. When she protested, he grabbed her by the hair, started beating her and threw her on the ground, Kotwali SHO Sachidanand Pandey said. The accused also put his hand inside her clothes and performed obscene acts, he said. Alerted by the nurse's screams, doctors and other people present in the hospital rescued her.

Nilambur by-poll verdict on Monday; Tense wait for parties

MALAPPURAM: With result of the assembly bypoll to Nilambur constituency just hours away, the ruling LDF, opposition UDF and the NDA in Kerala are keeping a close watch as the outcome is seen as a key indicator of the political mood ahead of the 2026 state assembly election. The counting of votes of the by-election in the forest-fringe constituency, which witnessed a fierce four-cornered fight, would begin on Monday. Congress-UDF fielded Aryadan Shoukath, former chairman of the Nilambur Municipality, while the CPI(M)-led LDF backed senior leader and state secretariat member M Swaraj. The BJP-led NDA put up lawyer-politician Mohan George.

Woman, 2 minor daughters abducted at gunpoint in MP's Chhatrapur; 5 held

CHHATRAPUR: A group of more than a dozen armed men allegedly abducted a woman and her two minor daughters after opening fire and injuring her husband in Madhya Pradesh's Chhatrapur district, police said on Sunday. The incident took place at around 12.30 pm on Saturday in Sumedi village under Lavkushnagar police station limits, where the accused arrived on motorcycles and four-wheelers. Sub-Divisional Police Officer Naveen Dubey said. Efforts were on to trace the woman and the two children, according to police. Five of the accused have been taken into custody and a case has been registered against them under various Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita sections, including attempt to murder, the official said.

Noida: Six police post in-charge suspended

NOIDA: Six police posts in-charge were suspended by the Gautam Buddha Nagar Police Commissioner for 'poor functioning'. Gautam Buddha Nagar Police Commissioner Laxmi Singh on Saturday also issued show cause notices to in-charge of four police stations. The action came after a review meeting held to discuss the law and order situation. "It was found that almost zero preventive action in two months... (It) is indicative of their poor functioning as well as violation of clear instructions of higher officials and departmental rules," Singh said.

Air India plane crash: Wreckage being shifted to airport premises

PTI, AHMEDABAD: The Gujarat police on Sunday started shifting the wreckage of the ill-fated Air India plane, that crashed on June 12 on a medical college hostel in Ahmedabad, to the airport premises here, officials said.

The London-bound aircraft had crashed into the hostel complex in Meghaninagar moments after taking off from Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel International Airport, killing 270 persons, including 241 on board. One passenger survived.

The wreckage was being moved from the crash site to GUJSAIL (Gujarat State Aviation Infrastructure Company Limited) building, which is in the airport premises, and will be in custody of the Aircraft Accident Investigation Bureau

(AAIB), an official said.

"We have started moving the wreckage of the Air India plane, that crashed

here, from today to the GUJSAIL building," Joint Commissioner of Police, Sector 2, Jaipalsinh Rathore told

PTI. "It will take 48 to 72 hours to shift the entire wreckage," he said.

"The wreckage will be under the custody of the AAIB, which is investigating the plane crash," the official said.

Apart from AAIB, the US National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB) is leading a parallel international investigation into the plane crash.

At least 247 persons killed in the crash have so far been identified through DNA matching and 232 bodies handed over to their families, as per officials.

Ahmedabad crash victim's mortal remains reach Manipur

PTI, IMPHAL: Thousands of people lined up on both sides of the roads to pay tributes to Ahmedabad crash victim Kongbrailatpam Nganthoi Sharma, whose mortal remains were brought to Manipur on Sunday.

Sharma was an air crew member of the London-bound Air India flight AI 171 which crashed into a hostel complex in Ahmedabad's Meghaninagar moments after take-off from Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel International Airport at 1.39 pm on June 12, killing 270 people, including 241 on board. One passenger survived.

A cousin of Nganthoi Sharma said that airport officials, family members and others paid floral tributes to her mortal remains after it was brought to Imphal airport aboard an IndiGo flight.

Iran-Israel War: India ramps up oil imports from Russia, US in June

PTI, NEW DELHI: India has ramped up purchases of Russian oil in June, importing more than the combined volumes from Middle Eastern suppliers such as Saudi Arabia and Iraq, amid market volatility triggered by Israel's dramatic attack on Iran.

The US military struck three sites in Iran early Sunday, directly joining Israel which first struck Iranian nuclear sites on June 13.

Indian refiners are likely to import 2-2.2 million barrels per day of Russian crude oil in June - the highest in the last two years and more than the total volumes bought from Iraq, Saudi Arabia, the UAE and

Kuwait, preliminary data by global trade analytics firm Kpler showed.

India's oil imports from Russia were 1.96 million barrels per day (bpd) in May.

Imports from the United States also rose to 439,000 bpd in June, a big jump from 280,000 bpd purchased in the previous month.

Full-month projections for imports from the Middle East stand at around 2 million bpd, lower than the previous month's buying, according to Kpler.

India, the world's third-largest oil-importing and consuming nation, bought from abroad around 5.1 million barrels of crude oil, which is converted into

fuels like petrol and diesel in refineries.

India, which has traditionally sourced its oil from the Middle East, began importing a large volume of oil from Russia soon after the invasion of Ukraine in February 2022. This was primarily because Russian oil was available at a significant discount to other international benchmarks due to Western sanctions and some European countries shunning purchases.

This led to India's imports of Russian oil seeing a dramatic rise, growing from less than 1 per cent of its total crude oil imports to a staggering 40-44 per cent in a short period.

Stealth frigate INS Tamal to be commissioned into Indian Navy on July 1

PTI, NEW DELHI: Indian Navy's Russian-manufactured guided missile frigate INS Tamal that carries an array of missiles and surveillance systems will be commissioned into the force at Russia's coastal city of Kaliningrad on July 1.

The ship has 26 per cent indigenous components, including the BrahMos long-range cruise missile for targeting both at sea and land, officials said.

The 125m long, 3900-tonne warship, packs a lethal punch as it features an impressive blend of Indian and Russian cutting-edge technologies and best practices in warship construction, according to

the Indian Navy. Upon commissioning, Tamal will join the 'Sword Arm' of the Indian Navy, the Western Fleet.

It will not only be a symbol of Indian Navy's growing capabilities, but also exemplifying collaborative strength of the India-Russia partnership, Indian Navy spokesperson Commander Vivek Madhwal said.

Two villagers murdered by Naxalites in Chhattisgarh

PTI, BIJAPUR: Naxalites have killed two villagers in Chhattisgarh's Bijapur district, police said on Sunday.

The police in a statement said they have received information that two innocent villagers were brutally murdered by Naxalites in Sendor and Aempur villages under Pamed police station area.

The police were verifying the information, the release said without specifying any reason behind the killings and when the crime took place.

Army personnel, his associate held in Punjab on espionage charge

PTI, CHANDIGARH: An army personnel posted in Jammu and his aide have been arrested for their alleged involvement in espionage activities linked to Pakistan's spy agency Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI), a top Punjab Police officer on Sunday.

Director General of Police (DGP) Gaurav Yadav said one of the accused has been identified as Gurpreet Singh, a resident of Dhariwal in Amritsar serving in the Indian Army in Jammu. His associate has been identified as Sahil Masih who also belongs to Dhariwal, the police chief said.

Preliminary investigation revealed that Singh was in direct contact with oper-

atives of the ISI and is suspected of sharing sensitive and confidential information via pen drives, he said.

In an intelligence-led operation, police arrested Gurpreet and Masih, while they were attempting another handover of sensitive data, the DGP said, adding that the key ISI handler involved in the case has been identified as Rana Javed.

The DGP said two mobile phones containing virtual numbers, used to communicate with ISI operatives, have been recovered from both the accused. Further investigations are underway to dismantle the broader espionage-terror network and identify all collaborators in this case, Yadav added.

Sharing more details, Senior Superintendent of Police (Amritsar Rural) Maninder Singh claimed that Gurpreet, who was recruited by the Army in 2016, systematically exploited his official position to collect, store and transmit classified military information via pen drives and discs.

The espionage network was facilitated by an acquaintance identified as Arjan, a Dubai-based drug trafficker from Dhariwal, who introduced Gurpreet to ISI operatives five months ago, he alleged.

A case under the Official Secrets Act and the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita has been registered at the Lopoke police station in Amritsar.
