Two-time Olympic medallist hockey forward Lalit calls time on international career

NEW DELHI: Veteran Indian hockey forward Lalit Upadhyay has called time on his illustrious international career, drawing curtains on over a decade-long journey that saw him be a part of the teams that won bronze medals in Tokyo and Paris Olympic Games. From making his debut at the 2014 World Cup to standing tall on the Olympic podium twice, Lalit's career is a time-line of some of Indian hockey's biggest milestones in the modern era. He was a crucial part of the squad that scripted history at the Tokyo 2020 Olympics, helping India clinch a long-awaited bronze medal, and repeated the feat at the Paris Games in 2024, reinforcing his reputation as a big-match player. "This journey began in a small village, with limited resources but limitless dreams," Lalit announced his decision through a heartfelt social media post shortly after India's final match of the European leg of the FIH Pro League 2024-25 season against Belgium on Sunday.

Chopra aims win at Golden Spike Ostrava

to join coach Zelezny among title winners OSTRAVA (Czech Republic): Forced to skip the last two editions due to fitness issues, Indian javelin throw superstar Neeraj Chopra will look to claim the title when he makes his debut at the Golden Spike Athletics meet on Tuesday, an event that his coach Jan Zelezny won nine times in a storied career. The 27-year-old Chopra has had an impressive season so far, having won his first Diamond League title in two years in Paris after also breaching the elusive 90m mark during his second place finish in Doha DL in May. He was to take part at Golden Spike -- a World Athletics Continental Tour Category A event -- in 2023 and 2024 but had to skip the meet on both occasions. In 2024, he was present as a guest after opting out of competition due to an adductor muscle niggle. The double Olympic-medallist will be all the more eager to win the title as the Golden Spike was world record holder Zelezny's happy hunting ground during his playing days.

Former India spinner Dilip Doshi dies aged 77

NEW DELHI: Former India left-arm spinner Dilip Doshi, who carved out a niche for himself despite being in the shadows of Bishan Singh Bedi, died due to cardiac arrest in London on Monday, the Saurashtra Cricket Association said. He was 77 and is survived by his wife Kalindi, son Nayan, who has also played first-class cricket, and daughter Vishakha. Doshi made his Test debut in 1979 after Bedi's retirement and played his last of his 33 games in 1983. In those matches, he took 114 wickets with six five-wicket hauls and was exceptional at home during the first three seasons, completing 100 scalps in just 28 Tests. "Dilip bhai suffered a heart attack in London. He is no more," Saurashtra CA president Jaydev Shah told PTI.

New IOC President Kirsty takes office today to start 8-year leadership

LAUSANNE (Switzerland): The first female and first African president of the IOC, Kirsty Coventry was inaugurated in the role on Monday on the organisation's 131st birthday with praise that the Olympic movement was "in the best of hands". Coventry, a two-time Olympic gold medallist in swimming for Zimbabwe, finally and formally takes office on Tuesday aged just 41 after decisively winning a sevencandidate election in March to succeed Thomas Bach. Coventry said Olympic leaders were "guardians of a platform ... to inspire, to change lives, to bring hope."

India top medal tally at Seychelles Boxing Tournament MAHE (Seychelles): Indian boxers signed off on a high,

bagging a total of seven medals, including three gold, to finish atop the standings at the Seychelles National Day Boxing Tournament held here. In addition to the gold medals, India clinched three silver and one bronze, finishing one medal ahead of Mauritius in the overall tally at the Paradise Arena. Among the highlights, Himanshu Sharma (50kg) secured gold via walkover, while Ashish Mudshaniya (55kg) registered a commanding 4-1 split decision win in his final. In the 90+kg summit clash, Gaurav Chauhan held his nerve in a tense bout to eke out a narrow 3-2 victory and claim the third gold for the country. The silver medals came through hard-fought efforts from Anmol (60kg), Aditya Yadav (65kg), and Neeraj (75kg), all of whom lost their finals by identical 2-3 split decisions despite spirited performances. Adding to India's tally was Kartik Dalal, who secured a bronze in the 70kg category.

Club World Cup: Man City hit six to reach last 16, Real win with 10 men

PHILADELPHIA (United States): Manchester City hit Al Ain for six on Sunday to secure a place in the last 16 of the Club World Cup after Real Madrid shrugged off an early red card to beat Mexican side Pachuca 3-1. Juventus proved too strong for Wydad Casablanca while Red Bull Salzburg and Al Hilal drew 0-0 as the second round of group games at the tournament came to a conclusion. In Charlotte, Real Madrid overcame the early sending-off of Raul Asencio to beat Pachuca 3-1 and get their first win under new coach Xabi Alonso.
