VASCO: Panic gripped students and teachers at Mount Litera Zee School, Zuarinagar, Sancoale, after the institution received a bomb threat on Wednesday evening.

The school administration received the message around 9.15 am, and Principal Sandhya Venkatesh immediately informed the Mormugao Police. Upon receiving the information, Mormugao DySP Gurudas Kadam and his police team quickly responded, alerting the Bomb Detection and Disposal Squad and other emergency services, who promptly arrived at the school campus.

The Bomb Detection and Disposal Squad thoroughly searched the entire school

campus and confirmed that it was a bomb hoax. DySP Kadam stated that despite indications of a hoax, the police took no chances and treated the threat with utmost seriousness.

3 arrested for peddling drugs into Colvale Jail Minor produced before Juvenile Board

PANJIM: In an attempt to smuggle narcotic substances into Central Jail at Colvale, drug peddlers resorted the aerial route.

In the early hours of June 14, seven packets of ganja valued at Rs 1.40 lakh were thrown into the jail premises, allegedly intended for delivery to an inmate.

However, a vigilant sentry stationed at Watch Tower No. 3 noticed the suspicious packages lying

in the passage between the inner and outer cordon walls, specifically between Watch Towers No. 3 and 4. The matter was immediately reported to senior prison authorities.

Following a detailed technical analysis and investigation, the police successfully dismantled the smuggling network involved in the operation. Three individuals were arrested in this connection, and a minor, whose identity has been withheld, was produced before the Juvenile Justice Board. The trio arrested has been identified as Gautam Talwar (24), resident of Ansabhat, Mapusa, Samuel Pujari (24), resident of Ansabhat, Mapusa and Jaffer Mulla (24), resident of Khorlim, Mapusa.

The investigation is underway, and the authorities are exploring whether the gang has links to previous smuggling attempts, police said.


