

# Bikram Majithia sent to 7-day remand in money laundering case

**PTI, CHANDIGARH:** A court in Punjab's Mohali on Thursday sent Shiromani Akali Dal leader Bikram Singh Majithia, who was arrested by the Vigilance Bureau on Wednesday for allegedly laundering more than Rs 540 crore of "drug money", to a seven-day vigilance remand.

Before producing Majithia before the court amid tight security arrangements, police detained several Akali supporters who were protesting against the arrest of the former minister near the court complex.

Ferry Sofat, the counsel representing the Bureau, told reporters the court has sent Majithia to seven-day vigilance remand, and he will now be produced before the court on July 2.

The Bureau had demanded a 12-day remand of the accused.

Sofat said it was

brought to the notice of the court that Majithia allegedly "threatened" the vigilance team when it raided his residence.

The Vigilance Bureau on Wednesday arrested Majithia, alleging that the former minister facilitated laundering over Rs 540 crore of drug money.

Majithia's arrest came after a vigilance team raided his residence in Amritsar on Wednesday.

The bureau claimed preliminary investigations

revealed that more than Rs 540 crore of drug money was laundered through several channels allegedly facilitated by Majithia.

Majithia has been booked in a disproportionate assets case.

Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) spokesperson Arshdeep Singh Kler on Thursday termed the FIR against Majithia "bogus", and said the former minister was being targeted for raising people's issues and being vocal against the AAP gov-

ernment.

Majithia, the brother-in-law of SAD chief Sukhbir Singh Badal, is already facing a probe in a 2021 drugs case.

## WON'T SPARE ANYONE, NO MATTER HOW POLITICALLY-INFLUENTIAL: PUNJAB CM AFTER MAJITHIA'S ARREST

**PTI, CHANDIGARH:** Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Thursday said his government will not spare anyone involved in the drug trade, no matter how politically strong or influential a person may be. Mann's statement came a day after the Punjab Vigilance Bureau arrested senior Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) leader Bikram Singh Majithia in a disproportionate assets case. The bureau alleged that the former minister was involved in laundering more than Rs 540 crore of "drug money". Without naming Majithia, Mann said he will not show any mercy in the matter of drugs and asserted that his government's drive against this menace will continue. The chief minister also took on opposition parties for condemning the vigilance action against Majithia.

The fresh FIR of disproportionate assets stems from the ongoing investigation by a Special Investigation Team (SIT) into the 2021 drug case.

Majithia, the brother-in-law of SAD chief Sukhbir Singh Badal, is already facing a probe in a 2021 drugs case.

## Anti corruption branch registers case against ex ministers Satyendar Jain, Saurabh Bharadwaj

**PTI, NEW DELHI:** The Anti-Corruption Branch (ACB) of Delhi Government has registered a case against former AAP ministers Saurabh Bharadwaj and Satyendar Jain in connection with alleged corruption in health infrastructure projects of the previous government, officials said on Thursday.

The case was registered days after the Union home ministry granted approval for conducting an investigation by the ACB under the Prevention of Corruption Act against former Delhi health ministers Bharadwaj and Jain.

The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) questioned why the FIR against Bharadwaj and Jain is being kept under wraps, while selective press notes are being leaked to the media.

"Is the FIR so baseless that the BJP fears it will become a national joke if released publicly?" it asked.

The FIR has been registered under section Section 13(1) of the Prevention of Corruption Act, along with Sections 409 (Criminal breach of trust by pub-

lic servant or by banker, merchant or agent), 420 (Cheating and dishonestly inducing delivery of property), and 120-B (Punishment of criminal conspiracy) of the IPC against Bharadwaj, Jain, unknown government officials, and private contractors, said Madhur Verma, joint commissioner of police, ACB.

A comprehensive investigation has been launched to uncover the full extent of the alleged conspiracy and determine the roles and accountability of the former ministers, officials, and private entities involved, he added.

According to Verma, 24 hospital projects - 11 greenfield and 13 brown-field - were sanctioned at a cost of Rs 5,590 crore in 2018-19.

These projects are mired in inexplicable delays and astronomical cost overruns, they said.

On August 22 last year, a detailed complaint was received from Gupta, then Leader of Opposition, Delhi, highlighting "grave irregularities and suspected corruption in various health infrastructure projects under the Delhi government", said Verma.

## Himachal flash flood kills 4, 7 missing

**PTI, SHIMLA/DHARAMSHALA:** With the recovery of two more bodies from a hydro project site in Himachal Pradesh's Kangra district that was hit by flash floods on Wednesday, the death toll has risen to four, officials said on Thursday.

Two bodies were recovered on Wednesday, while two more bodies were traced on Thursday, Additional Deputy Magistrate Kangra Shilpa Bekta said.

The deceased have been identified as Chain Singh, a resident of Jammu and Kashmir, Aditya Thakur from Chamba, and Pardeep Verma and Chandan from Uttar Pradesh, Kangra SP Shalini Agnihotri said on Thursday.

Search operations have

been intensified to find the seven persons still missing since flash floods triggered by cloudbursts hit Kangra and Kullu districts on Wednesday.

Lovely from Chamba district, whom the search teams rescued from a forest

near the project site, said there were 13 people in the camp, of which five ran towards the hills while the remaining were swept by the gushing waters.

"We saw the floods coming and screamed to alert the people below before

running to safety," Daya Kishan, a labourer, said.

National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) Commandant Baljinder Singh said they are trying to trace the people who are feared to have been swept away from the project site during the floods.

Three more people are yet to be traced at Rehla Bihal in Kullu district.

Two persons were confirmed dead, while about 15-20 workers were feared swept away at the makeshift labour colony near the Indira Priyadarshini Hydroelectric project site following a surge in the water level at Manuni Khad in Khaniyara village on Wednesday evening.

## 3 drown, 4 rescued as flash floods hit Jammu

**PTI, JAMMU:** Three persons, including two children, died while four others were rescued as flash floods triggered by cloudbursts and heavy rains were reported from different areas of Rajouri, Poonch, Doda and Kathua districts in Jammu and Kashmir on Thursday, officials said.

Shaqafat Ali (14) and his cousin, Safaena Kousar (11), drowned due to flash floods in a riverlet at their Salsui Mou village in Kalakote sub-division of Rajouri, they said.

Saima (10), who was also trapped in the flash floods, was rescued by local volunteers and shifted to a hospital, the officials added.

## Three killed, nine missing after bus falls into Uttarakhand river

**PTI, RUDRAPRAYAG:** At least three people were killed, eight injured and nine others reported missing on Thursday when a 31-seater bus carrying pilgrims from Rajasthan, Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh and Maharashtra to Badrinath fell into the Alaknanda river here, police said.

The vehicle met with the accident near the Gholtrivillage on the Badrinath National Highway between Rudraprayag and Gauchar, they said.

Relief and rescue efforts, hampered by the strong currents of the river, are underway on the spot with the help of local villagers.

Three bodies have been recovered so far, Rudraprayag District Disaster Management Officer Nandan Singh Rajwar said. The third body has been identified as that of Gauri Soni (41) from Rajgarh in Madhya Pradesh, he said.

Two bodies were re-

covered earlier, one near the accident site and the other from the river near Rudraprayag. Satyendra Singh Bhandari, a member of the Red Cross Society rescue team told PTI. They were identified as Vishal Soni (42) from Rajgarh, Madhya Pradesh and Drimmy (17), a resident of Surat in Gujarat.

The accident occurred at around 7.30 am as the bus fell into the river several hundred feet down the road with a loud bang, Bhandari, who lives close to the accident site, said.

Whoever heard the sound rushed towards the scene of the accident, he further said.

The injured driver of the vehicle, who hails from Kankhal in Haridwar, claimed the bus fell into the river after being hit by a truck coming from the opposite direction.

"I was driving at a speed of hardly around 10-20 kmph. We were going comfortably listening to bhajans when a truck hit the bus hard and it plunged into the gorge," the driver named Sumit said.

## Two women Naxalites killed in encounter with cops in Chhattisgarh

**PTI, NARAYANPUR:** Two women Naxalites have been killed in an encounter with security personnel in Chhattisgarh's Narayanpur district, police said on Thursday.

The gunfight broke out late Wednesday evening at a forest under Kohkameta police station limits in Abhujmaad area when a joint team of the District Reserve Guard (DRG) and Special Task Force (STF) was out on an anti-Naxal operation,

a police official said.

The DRG personnel, belonging to Narayanpur and Kondagaon districts, were involved in the operation launched based on inputs about the presence of senior cadres of Maad division of Maoists, he said.

"So far, bodies of two women Naxalites along with an Insas rifle and a .315 bore rifle have been recovered from the spot," the official said.

The operation was still underway, he added.

## Delhi HC seeks NTA's response on plea alleging defective biometric system

**PTI, NEW DELHI:** The Delhi High Court has asked the National Testing Agency to respond to a NEET-UG 2025 candidate's plea seeking compensatory marks on the ground of being mentally disturbed due to the defective biometric verification system at the exam centre.

### NEET UG

Justice Prathiba M Singh on June 20 issued notice to the National Testing Agency (NTA) on the candidate's plea.

The petitioner alleged that during the authenti-

cation process, prior to the exam, the biometric verification did not work at the test centre and he was made to file an application requesting permission to enter the examination hall.

The court directed the preservation of the CCTV recordings, log book entries and any other registers at the test centre, subject to its further orders.

The candidate appeared for the National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET) (UG) 2025 exam on May 4 at Trishla Devi Kanohar Lal Baiika Inter College in Meerut, Uttar Pradesh.

The petitioner sought certain reliefs including compen-

satory marks in the medical entrance exam and preservation of CCTV footage from the test centre concerned.

The petitioner claimed being permitted to exam enter only five minutes before the commencement of the test.

While the examination was underway, he was asked to step out for the biometric verification and made to submit an application in both English and Hindi to the centre superintendent which led to considerable mental disturbance to him while giving the exam, his plea said.

The candidate was stated to have scored 98.86 per centile in the exam.
