#### Mullaperiyar dam shutters opened as water level rises after heavy rain

**IDUKKI:** Authorities opened 13 shutters of the Mullaperiyar Dam on Sunday, releasing water into the Periyar River as the water level neared full capacity. Each shutter was raised by 10 centimetres, and around 250 cusecs of water per second is now flowing out, according to information provided by the Tamil Nadu Water Resources Department to the Kerala authorities. The shutters were opened at 11.35 am after the water level in the 128-year-old dam crossed 136 feet. The water level rose due to the heavy rainfall in the dam's catchment areas over the past few days. The move follows days of preparation by the Idukki district administration after Tamil Nadu, which operates the dam, indicated it might open the gates once the water level reached 136 feet.

#### Two shot at during clash between two groups in Bihar

PATNA: Two persons sustained gunshot wounds during a brawl between two groups of people in Patna's Gaurichak area on Sunday, police said. Those injured were identified as Shiv Prakash and Aditya Kumar. Speaking to reporters Patna Sadar Sub-Divisional Police Officer (SDPO-2) Satyakam said, "Preliminiary investigations have revealed that two groups entered into a fight at Jujharpur village in Gaurichak police station area on Sunday morning. During the clash, some suspects fired at Shiv Prakash and Aditya Kumar and fled the spot, he added. Police reached the spot and took the injured to the nearest government hospital, the SDPO said, adding their condition is reported to be out of danger. A case has been registered and a manhunt launched to nab the accused, he added.

The police formed a five-member special investigation team (SIT), led by an assistant commissioner rank officer, to probe the case.

Opposition political parties, including the BJP and the Left, have been holding protests over the alleged gangrape, claiming lawlessness in the Trinamool Congress-ruled West Bengal and lack of safety in educational institutions.

4 IITs, 3 IIMs & AMU named in UGC's anti-ragging default list

PTI, NEW DELHI: Four Indian Institutes of Technology (IITs) and three Indian Institutes of Management (IIMs) are on the defaulter list for not complying with anti-ragging norms, according to officials at University Grants Commission (UGC).

The UGC has issued showcause notices to 89 institutions across the country for not submitting mandatory compliance undertakings of anti-ragging norms.

On the defaulter list are 17 Institutes of National Importance, including IITs, IIMs, AIIMS and NIDs.

The defaulter IITs are -IIT Bombay, IIT Kharagpur, IIT Palakkad and IIT Hyderabad. Similarly, IIM Bombay, IIM Rohtak and IIM Tiruchirpalli are also on the

list. The defaulters also include AIIMS Raebareli and National Institute of Design - Delhi, Andhra Pradesh and Haryana. "It has come to the attention of UGC that these institutions have failed to submit the mandatory Anti-Ragging undertakings by

students and compliance undertaking by the institutions, despite multiple advisories issued by the UGC, follow-up calls from the Anti-Ragging Helpline, and direct interventions by the Anti Ragging Monitoring Agency," said UGC Secretary Manish Joshi.

"Adherence to the UGC Regulation on Ragging, 2009 is mandatory for all Higher Education Institutions (HEls). Failure to

comply not only violates UGC guidelines but also compromises student safety, particularly in light of increasing concerns about ragging-related distress and campus hostility," he added. The UGC has warned the defaulter institutions of withdrawing UGC Grants and Funding, impacting financial assistance and research projects and de-recognition or withdrawal of affiliation, if the norms are

not complied within 30 days. The Anti-Ragging Regulations, 2009 mandate that every student and their parents and guardians must submit an anti-ragging undertaking at the time of admission and at the beginning of every academic year.

#### **162 STUDENTS TRAPPED IN INUNDATED RESIDENTIAL SCHOOL IN JHARKHAND**

PTI, JAMSHEDPUR (JHARKHAND): At least 162 students trapped in an inundated private residential school in Jharkhand's East Singhbhum district after heavy rain were rescued by the police on Sunday, a senior officer said. The students were trapped in the school located at Pandarsoli on the Haldipokhar-Kowali Road in Kowali police station area since Saturday night after the premises got flooded due to heavy rain. "We received information that 162 students of Lav Kush Residential School were trapped as the school premises were inundated due to heavy rain. As the school building was submerged, the teachers shifted all the students to the rooftop, where they spent the night. He said boats were used for the rescue operation while the NDRF was requisitioned. However, the police team rescued the students before the NDRF team's arrival, he added. Officer-in-charge Kowali police station, Dhananjay Paswan said the single-storey residential school building was completely submerged due to rain.

#### Jharkhand: Brown sugar worth Rs 60 lakh seized, 2 arrested

CHATRA: Two people have been arrested and 286 gm of brown sugar has been seized from their possession in Jharkhand's Chatra district, police said on Sunday. The accused, identified as Abhimanyu Kumar Sao (20) and Nitesh Kumar (19), were arrested during a drive near a football ground in Gidhaur police station area on Saturday evening, they said. Chatra Superintendent of Police (SP) Sumit Kumar Agarwal said the estimated market price of the seized brown sugar would be around Rs 60 lakh. He said an electronic weighing machine and five mobile phones were also seized from their possession.

#### Man killed in elephant attack in Chhattisgarh

DHAMTARI: A 35-year-old man was trampled to death by a wild elephant at a village in Chhattisgarh's Dhamtari district, a forest official said on Sunday. The attack occurred on Saturday evening in Lilar village under the Dhamtari forest range when the victim, Devcharan Nishad, was heading to a farm with another villager, the official said. He said the duo spotted the animal, and while the other man managed to flee, the elephant picked him Nishad and trampled him to death. After being alerted about the incident, forest personnel reached the spot and sent the body for post-mortem, the official said. He said an immediate aid of Rs 25,000 was provided to the kin of the deceased, and the remaining compensation will be disbursed once the necessary formalities are completed.

#### Teenager held for raping minor in UP

BULANDSHAHR: A 14-year-old boy was apprehended for allegedly raping a seven-year-old girl here, police said on Saturday. According to police, the incident occurred on the evening of June 17 when the girl had gone to fetch water near her house. The accused, a resident of the same village, allegedly raped her, police said. In the police complaint, the girl's father said that following the incident, he called the accused's father. However, he allegedly threatened to kill the survivor and abused him on the call, police said. Based on the complaint, a case was registered against the accused and his father.

#### Bengal: Three family members killed in Asansol house fire

KOLKATA: Three members of a family were killed when a fire broke out at their Asansol house in West Bengal's Paschim Bardhaman district early on Sunday, a senior police officer said. According to their neighbours, the fire started around 2 am on the ground floor of the standalone building. Upon seeing the flames, security guards from a nearby apartment complex, along with local residents, rushed to the scene and tried to douse the blaze. A fire tender also reached the spot soon after, the officer said.

## HPV virus major factor for rise in cancer cases among Indian youth, say doctors

PTI, NEW DELHI: A growing number of oncologists across India have expressed concern over Human Papillomavirus (HPV) becoming a major contributing factor in the rise of cancers in young Indians, particularly among those in their twenties and thirties. With increasing cases

of cervical, oral, and oroawareness." pharyngeal cancers linked to HPV infection, experts believe India is on the brink of a preventable cancer crisis if urgent measures are not implemented. Dr Ashish Gupta, Chief of

Medical Oncology at Amerix Cancer Hospital, New Delhi, said, "HPV-related cancers are striking far earlier than we used to see. Patients in their twenties are coming in with cervical, oral, and throat cancers -- many of which could have been avoided entirely with timelv vaccination and proper "What's most heart-

breaking is that HPV is preventable, yet many families and individuals are not even aware of the risk," Dr Gupta said. Unlike other cancers

that develop over decades, HPV-related cancers in young people often progress rapidly and silently. Prevention through vaccination and early screening should be treated with the same urgency as any national health emergency. "We need a focused, stigma-free, countrywide campaign that reaches schools, colleges, and parents," Gupta said.

The virus, which spreads primarily through intimate skin-to-skin contact, is known to be one of the most common sexually transmit-

ted infections globally. While the body clears most HPV infections on its own, certain high-risk strains can persist and lead to cancer.

In women, it is the leading cause of cervical cancer, while in men and women alike, it is now strongly linked to oral, anal, and throat cancers.

What troubles experts further is the lack of awareness and the social stigma that surrounds HPV discussions in India -- leading to poor vaccination rates and negligible screening coverage.

Oncologist at Dharamshila Narayana Superspeciality Hospital said, "HPV-related cancers don't give you many symptoms early on. That's why routine screening is so vital. A young woman with no symptoms may already have precancerous changes in the cervix. Similarly, oral HPV infections in men often go unnoticed until they present with full-blown tumors. Without education, vaccination, and routine checkups, we're allowing preventable cancers to spread unchecked."
