Israel opposition chief calls for end to Gaza war

opposition leader Yair Lapid on Monday urged an end to more than 20 months of war in Gaza, as Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu faces mounting calls to halt the fighting.

Following the swift conclusion of Israel's war against Iran with a ceasefire last week, foreign leaders such as US President Donald Trump as well as Israeli ex-prime minister Naftali Bennett have pressed Netanyahu to find a similar off-ramp in the fight with

"There is no longer any benefit for the State of Israel from continuing the war in Gaza. Only damage on the security, political and economic level," Lapid told a meeting of lawmakers from his parliamentary

ISRAEL EYES PEACE ACCORDS WITH SYRIA, LEBANON AFP. JERUSALEM: Israel said Monday it is "interested" in

striking peace agreements with neighbouring Lebanon and Syria, a potentially historic shift in the region after decades of war and animosity. With Syria under new leadership after the fall of longtime ruler Bashar al-Assad and Lebanon's Iran-backed Hezbollah movement weakened, Israeli Foreign Minister Gideon Saar told journalists his government wanted more normalisation agreements with Arab countries. "Israel is interested in expanding the Abraham Accords circle of peace and normalisation," Saar said of the US-brokered deals that Israel signed with the United Arab Emirates, Bahrain and Morocco in 2020, during US President Donald Trump's first term. "We have an interest in adding countries such as Syria and Lebanon, our neighbours - to the circle of peace and normalisation while safeguarding Israel's essential and security interests," Saar told a news conference in Jerusalem alongside his Austrian counterpart Beate Meinl-Reisinger.

AP, BEIJING: China has still must be pumped in reopened its market to seafood from Japan after a nearly two-year ban over the discharge of slightly radioactive wastewater from tsunami-destroyed Fukushima nuclear power

A notice from the customs agency said the ban had been lifted Sunday and that imports from most of Japan would be resumed.

The ban, imposed in August 2023, was a major blow to Japan's fisheries industry. China was the biggest overseas market for Japanese seafood, accounting for more than one-fifth of its exports.

The nuclear plant at Fukushima was heavily damaged by a deadly tsunami that followed a huge offshore earthquake in 2011. Water



Fires break out as southern Europe heatwave intensifies

AFP, ROME: Firefighters mobilised in several countries to tackle blazes as southern Europeans sought shelter from punishing temperatures of a heatwave that is set to in-

tensify in the coming days. Fires broke out in France and Turkey Sunday, with other countries already on alert. Authorities from Spain to Portugal, Italy and France urged people to seek shelter and protect the most vulnerable from the sum-

mer's first major heatwave. Ambulances stood on standby near tourist hotspots as experts warned that such heatwaves, intensified by climate change, would become more frequent.




