Rossmann Cruz SC alleges bias by GFA, AIFF

Goa Football Association president denies claims

PANJIM: The president of Rossmann Cruz Nagoa Sports Club, Alexio Da Costa, has alleged that the Goa Football Association (GFA) and the All India Football Federation (AIFF) are deliberately attempting to dismantle and suppress grassroots football clubs like his own.

Da Costa revealed that his club was fined Rs 50,000 – a sum which was duly paid under strong protest on October 17, last year. However, more than six months later, the suspension imposed on the club has yet to be lifted, effectively barring the team from participating in any official football tournaments.

"This is an act of injustice and systematic harassment," he stated.

Da Costa further alleged that the GFA arbitrarily downgraded his club's status from permanent membership to associate membership and denied him the right to participate in the annual general body meeting (AGM). "Only after filing a petition in the High Court was I granted permission to attend the AGM," he said.

When contacted, GFA president Caitano Fernandes responded: "His (Da Costa's) allegations are baseless and factually distorted. The 2018 GFA constitution he questions was upheld by the High Court in 2022, in a case filed by Salcete FC which led to stepping down of the then president. Rossmann Cruz SC hasn't fielded a team in any GFA competition and the fine imposed is in line with our rules. The Inspector General of Societies has upheld the 2018 constitution and has not set aside the order. They have merely requested the GFA to relocate at the fine, which we have put before the executive committee again and the committee unanimously resolved not to reduce the fine."

However, Rossmann Cruz Nagoa Sports Club president countered that the amendments carried out in 2018 were not in accordance with the procedure prescribed under the Societies Registration Act, 1860. He added that the Inspector General of Societies has also stated that the GFA constitution currently in force is that of 1977.
