

Goan band Uzo ignites the music scene with 'Kallzant Pettla Uzo'

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Goa's vibrant live band, Uzo, is celebrating a significant milestone with the release of their debut original track, 'Kallzant Pettla Uzo', a Konkani love song that's as passionate as the band's name itself, which means 'fire' in Konkani. This six-member group comprises Axel D'Souza (male lead vocalist), Lumira Miranda (female lead vocalist), Rohit Nazir (lead guitarist), Joshua Fernandes (keyboardist), Reuben Rebelo (bassist), and Elton Fernandes (drummer). The track was recorded, mixed, and mastered at ReubenAudio in St Cruz.

'Kallzant Pettla Uzo' tells a tender love story that was performed live and had its video release over the weekend at Down the Road, Panjim. "It's about someone who falls in love, confesses it, and they come together," says Axel D'Souza, a founding member. "It's a song about passion and fire in the heart, perfect for a first or final dance at a wedding."

The music video is available on YouTube and across Uzo's social media platforms, ensuring fans worldwide can tune in. "We wanted our first original to honour our roots, which is why it had to be a Konkani track. We're Goans, and we're proud of our language. This song is emotional. It's fiery. It's Uzo," Axel adds.

Reuben recalls listening to the demo, "The first time Axel played the demo, I had goosebumps. I knew straight away it was a perfect wedding song. In Goa, so many love stories begin on a bus ride, and the video captures that feeling. The song expresses a shared spark, unspoken, yet deeply felt."

For Rohit, who unexpectedly played



setting up instruments, and doing multiple takes was tough, but our incredible team pulled it off. A friend lent us their home to freshen up, a kind neighbour lent us a bus, and we approached the shoot like a picnic."

Lumira says, "The response has been phenomenal. To see people truly enjoying the song, is simply beautiful. We've heard how it gave them goosebumps and reminded them of falling in love for the first time. One comment even read,

the lead in the video, the experience was unforgettable. "I've done a few shoots before, but this one was special, our first original release. There were challenges, but we pushed through as a team. It was tiring, but also so much fun. I was nervous, but proud."

Time constraints were the biggest challenge during filming. "With a limited budget, we had to shoot everything in one day using only natural light," says Elton. "Changing outfits,

'feels like Konkani is safe in your voices.' Since the release, we've been flooded with love, messages, and story shares from around the world. We're incredibly moved and so grateful."

Will the song feature in future performances? "Absolutely," says Joshua. "Kallzant Pettla Uzo" is a beautiful ballad that fits perfectly into our wedding sets. I hope other Goan bands around the world perform it too, it will be interesting to witness different renditions, voices, arrangements of the song. Seeing the crowd's reaction live has been incredibly rewarding." The song will be available on all platforms including Spotify, Apple Music and Tidal.

The Society of Pilar celebrates its Re-organisation Day

July 2 is a red-letter day for the Society of the Missionaries of St Francis Xavier popularly known as Society of Pilar. In 1939 on the feast of the Visitation of Our Lady, the Society of Pilar was re-organised into a new missionary society by six priests and two lay brothers: Fr Conceicao Rodrigues from Betalbatim, Fr Francisco Sequeira from Saligao, Fr Remedios do Rosario Gomes from Chandor, Fr Manuel Jose Barreto from Cansaulim, Fr Joseph Albuquerque



from Bastora, Fr Teodolindo Cabral from Verna, Br Peter Mascarenhas from Siolim and Br Paixao Lacerda from Chinchinim. The eight Re-organisers were called the Second Founders of the Society of Pilar. The Re-organised Society of Pilar of 1939 is canonically, the continuation of the same Society founded in 1887.

Fr Bento Martins from Orlim, was a priest of the Archdiocese of Goa and Daman and the founder of Pilar Society. Moved by the plight of the abandoned Christians in the New Conquests, who had no priests to minister to them, Fr Bento expressed his desire to the Archbishop to start a new missionary Society.

By 1835, the Portuguese government had suppressed all the Religious Orders in Goa. In this difficult circumstances, Fr Bento established a new indigenous missionary society. On September 26, 1887, at a time the last Carmelite died in Pilar, a new Society was born in Agonda in Canacona Taluka.

In 1890, the Patriarch gifted the abandoned monastery at Pilar which eventually became the mother house of the Society of Pilar and a home to the sacred relics of Venerable Fr Agnelo de Souza and a pilgrim centre. The monastery had



as its patroness Our Lady of Pilar, a devotion prevailing in Saragosa, Spain that was brought to Goa by the Franciscan friars. After shifting the headquarters of the Society from Agonda to Pilar, the Society adopted Our Lady of Pilar as its patroness.

Hence, it is called the Society of Pilar and the confreres of the Society as Pilar Fathers. After administering the Society of Pilar for 9 years, Fr Bento left the world on August 16, 1896 at Pilar. By 1938, the Society came to the verge of extinction with the lone surviving member of the Society, Fr Remedios do Rosario Gomes.

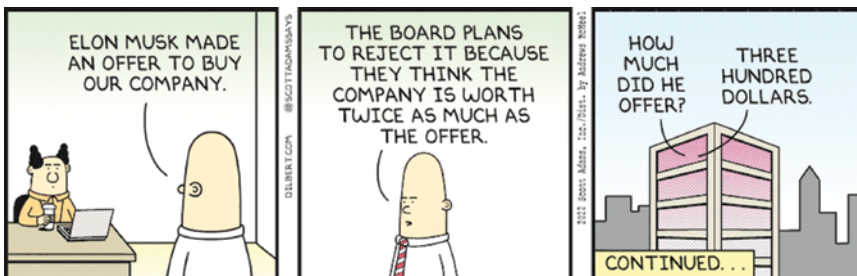
Fr Agnelo de Souza, the saintly member of the Society, a year before he died, had predicted, "The Society

will not die, the finger of God is here." Fr Remedios joined the re-organising team. Incidentally in the same year, the mortal remains of Ven Fr Agnelo were transferred to Pilar monastery from Rachol cemetery on January 10, 1939.

The Society of Pilar was raised to the status of Pontifical Right in 2010. With 387 priests and 7 lay brothers, it serves in 32 dioceses of India and in 12 dioceses of nine countries. The Holy See appointed three members of the Society of Pilar as bishops in three dioceses in India, Rt Alex Dias, Bishop Emeritus of Port Blair, Rt Theodore Mascarenhas, Bishop of Daltonganj and Rt Sebastiao Mascarenhas, Bishop of Baroda.

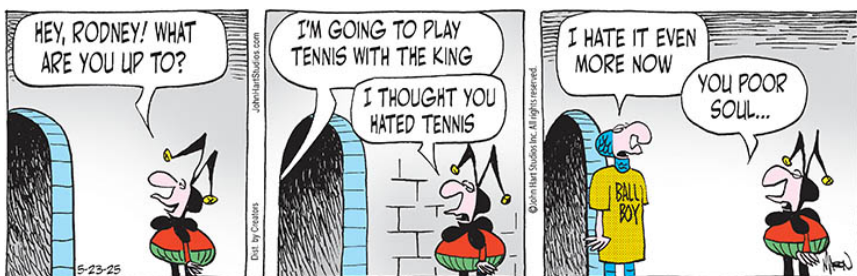
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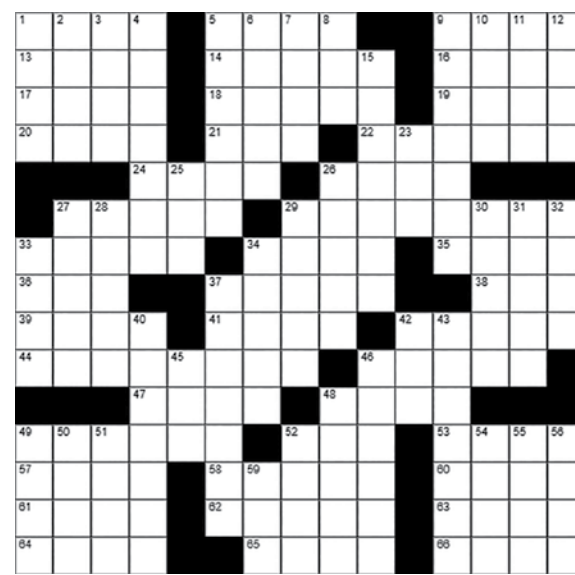

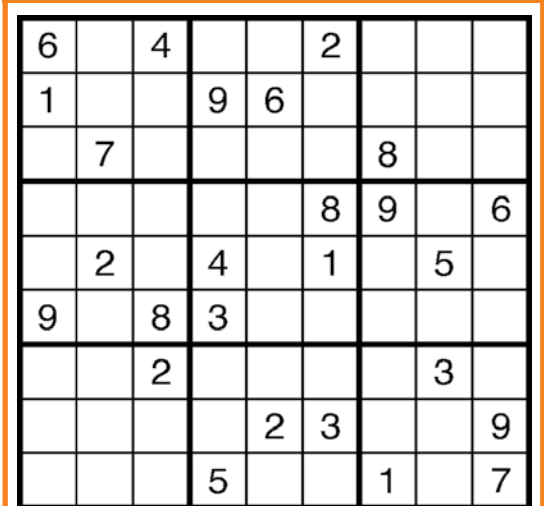
