The recent wave of criticism about Goa's failing tourism infrastructure has grabbed national headlines, with the media highlighting the basic lapses, like costly rooms and taxis, dirty streets and beaches. Tourism stakeholders spoke about how the Sunshine State is losing its sheen

PANJIM: Are the golden shores of Goa - once the haunt of freewheeling tourists seeking peace and quiet far from the madding crowd – losing their shine?

From the latest buzz doing the rounds on social media, there is every reason to believe so. Some social media commentary recently has opened the floodgates of complaints, with visitors to Goa pouring their hearts out on they had been shortchanged or plain deceived on their Goa trip. Media reports built on the theme and went all out in highlighting how unregulated tourism had taken a toll on Goa, focusing on the factors behind the nosedive.

Stakeholders in Goa's tourism sector have spoken to O Heraldo about the negative image that the state has built up over the years. Once known for its feel-good factor, visiting Goa is like visiting any other crowded beach destination in any part of India. Dixon Vaz, Cavelossim Sarpanch and Vice President of the Small and Medium Hotel Owners Association, "To some extent, it's true that Goa has lost some of its former allure as a tourist desti-

In the past, Goa welcomed many families who came to enjoy our beaches, experience our rich Goan hospitality, and immerse themselves in our culture. Now, we see more visitors primarily interested in drugs, alcohol, and

late-night parties Cruz Cardozo, President of the Shack Owners Welfare Society of Goa, spoke about how Goa, which has historically been a magnet for global tourists, faces pressing issues that are contributing to the decline in footfall. "Aggressive touts and unregulated beach hawkers have created an unwel-

coming environment for visitors, tarnishing the experience that Goa is known for. Coupled with insufficient infrastructure, the rising cost of services, and unresolved airport connectivity issues, Goa risks losing its competitive edge in the global market," he said.

According to Cardozo, it is imperative for all stakeholders, in-

cluding shack owners, taxi operators, hoteliers, and government bodies, to unite and address these challenges head-on and law enforcement agencies have to take a more proactive role in ensuring a safe and tourist-friendly atmosphere, free from harassment and exploitation.

VASCO: The Sancoale Comunidade will move Supreme Court to reclaim land parcels allocated to Zuari Agro Chemicals, citing long-pending dues and encroachment issues.

At a press conference in Vasco, former Chicalim Sarpanch Pratap Mardolkar and Jayesh Fadte voiced their concern about illegal encroachments and stressed the need to recover rightful revenue from the land. They also revealed plans to utilise some of the reclaimed land for pay parking facilities to generate funds.

The Comunidade emphasized its commitment to preserving its heritage and ensuring the fair use of its assets. They called on authorities to support their efforts in addressing these long-standing grievances.

Mardolkar recalled that the then Chief Minister late Bhausaheb Bandodkar had leased Comunidade land measuring 50,000 lakh square metres to Zuari Agro Chemical to set up an industry and create jobs for Goan youth at Zuarinagar. The land was leased to the company at a meagre 25 paise per square metre.
